State to release Sh48.8b capitation funds to schools this week

National Treasury Cabinet Secretary John Mbadi

has assured school heads that the government will disburse Sh48.8 billion in capitation funds to schools next week.

Mr. Mbadi explained

that this amount represents half of the total capitation allocated for schools for the current academic year, with the remainder to be released

as the year progresses.

He attributed the delay in disbursements to insufficient funds caused by the debt challenges the country is currently fac-

ing.

“Therefore, schools, please don’t worry. I am giving you my word that Sh48.8 billion for capitation will be in your school

accounts because we are releasing it next week,” Mr. Mbadi told journalists in Garsen Constituency.

The Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) is implementing strategic measures to ensure sustainable revenue collection by modernizing its operations, a move aimed at meeting revenue targets.

KRA Commissioner General Humphrey Wattanga stated that the organization has established a strong foundation for sustainable revenue collection, as evidenced by its consistent growth trajectory.

“Our revenue collection has

demonstrated remarkable resilience, increasing from Sh1.58 trillion in the Financial Year (FY) 2018/2019 to Sh2.407 trillion in FY 2023/2024, marking a significant growth rate of 11.1%,” said Wattanga.

He highlighted that KRA has implemented several strategic initiatives to sustain this momentum in revenue collection, including leveraging disruptive technologies to deliver tools that enable market-customized solutions.

School administrators have expressed concern over the delayed disbursement of capitation funds, with some resorting to sending students home to collect fees in order to finance operations. On Thursday, the Kenya Union of Post Primary Education gave the government a seven-day ultimatum to release the funds to prevent disruptions in schools.

The CS also announced that the government had fulfilled its Sh70 billion loan obligation this week and that his next priority is releasing capitation funds to schools, which he committed to settling next week. Additionally, Mr. Mbadi revealed that the National Treasury will disburse Sh30 billion owed to counties for the month of December.

ber before the end of January, in addition to paying Sh75 billion in salaries to civil servants. County governments have raised concerns over delayed disbursements of funds meant for devolved units, with some turning to commercial bank loans to meet basic expenses, including paying county workers.

Mr Mbadi, who commissioned a Sh11 billion water project that will serve 300

households and 1,800 livestock, candidly addressed the challenges facing the country and emphasised the government's commitment to transparency and accountability in managing the country's finances.

"There is nothing to hide about the finances of Kenya. I am speaking to Kenyans openly because it is important that there is transparency and accountability," he said.

According to Wattanga, these innovations have greatly simplified tax processes, facilitated trade, and enhanced voluntary compliance.

"KRA has developed and launched 'GAVA Connect,' an innovative Application Programming Interface (API) platform designed to empower IT developers and young Kenyan tech enthusiasts to create home-grown solutions that address local needs," he said.

The Commissioner General noted that these solutions will enable businesses and taxpayers to seamlessly and securely integrate with KRA's key processes, fostering tax simplification and driving voluntary compliance.

He also revealed that KRA is implementing a 'tax-at-source' technology, which integrates with other systems to facilitate near real-time collection of information and revenue directly at the source.

Wattanga said that some of the initiatives under this programme that KRA has implemented include, Electronic Tax Invoice Man-

agement System (eTMS) which has minimised Value Added Tax (VAT) fraud and increased tax revenue.

The programme has also enabled KRA to integrate Betting and Gaming Companies into the KRA tax system giving KRA real-time access to companies in the gaming and betting sector.

This saw the sector register a revenue growth rate of 26.2% after KRA collected Sh24.269 billion in the FY 2023/24 compared to Sh19.224 billion in the previous year from Excise on betting services, Withholding Tax (WHT) on winnings from betting and gaming and betting tax.

"We also have programmes that are aimed at streamlining trade facilitation processes and enhancing customer support programmes. The adoption of Pre-Ar-

rival Cargo Processing, integration with Kenya Trade Network Agency (KenTrade's) Trade Facilitation Platform, enhanced customs systems and exchange of information have also improved trade facilitation," he said.

Wattanga said that the efficiency enhancing measures effected by KRA resulted in a 4.9% increase in customs revenue to Sh791.368 billion during FY 2023/2024 compared to the same period in FY 2022/2023.

On the Tax Base Expansion (TBE) which aims to on-board taxpayers previously not paying taxes, Wattanga said that some of the initiatives include recruitment of landlords under the Monthly Rental Income (MRI) programme through a taxpayer mapping process (Block Management System - BMS).

"One of the initiatives under KRA's tax base expansion programme is netting the informal sector, the majority of whom are the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). KRA is determined to grow the taxpayer base," he said

ICT CS pledges to drive Kenya's digital transformation agenda

The newly appointed Cabinet Secretary for Information, Communications, and the Digital Economy William Kabogo, has pledged to spearhead Kenya's digital transformation agenda to ensure that public services are quickly accessible and delivered efficiently and effectively.

He underscored the urgent need to fully digitise government services, stating that his Ministry will be digitised 100 per cent in due course and then target digitisation of the entire Government so that Kenyans would be served timely.

While taking over the mantle from Prime Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Secretary for Foreign and Diaspora Affairs Musalia Mudavadi during a brief handover ceremony at the Ministry's Headquarters at Telposta Towers, Nairobi, Mr Kabogo expressed optimism in working with all officers in the Ministry so as to achieve the Mandate of the Digital Superhighway and the Digital

Economy.

Mr Kabogo also pledged to establish a framework to streamline the use of social media and encouraged responsible use of the same while upholding constitutional freedoms.

He emphasised the importance of leveraging on social media to share impactful messages that improve the lives of Kenyans.

The CS underscored the need to strengthen the Office of the Data Protection Commissioner (ODPC) to empower Kenyans with a clear understanding of

their rights, the obligations surrounding data protection, and the limits of its use.

He called for collective responsibility to ensure data is used positively and ethically, underpinning trust and accountability in the digital space.

On his part, Prime Cabinet Secretary Mr Mudavadi underscored the importance of communicating effectively the Government's policies, programmes and projects that have been rolled out or are underway and future plans of action to ensure the citizenry is well versed in the Agenda of the State.

Mr Mudavadi further called for total transparency and accountability across all sectors of government to ensure effective service delivery to all Kenyans countrywide.

TVET sector now ready to absorb 700,000 KCSE graduates, says PS

The Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) sector is adequately prepared to absorb the over 700,000 KCSE graduates who failed to meet the university entry grade. TVET Principal Secretary Dr. Esther Muoria has stated that the government is prioritizing trainer capacity building, facility upgrades, and enhanced course competencies for technical and vocational learners across the country.

Dr. Muoria emphasized that these efforts aim to ensure high-quality skills development and industry readiness for learners, providing them with the opportunity to acquire market-driven skills for employability.

Speaking during an induction forum for TVET principals and county directors from across the country at Thika Technical Training Institute, the PS reaffirmed the government's commitment to revolutionizing technical and vocational education to meet modern industry demands.

She highlighted that the government is focusing on training trainers and equipping technical and vocational centers to produce highly skilled craftsmen in specialized areas.

This shift aligns with the Competency-Based Curriculum (CBC), where

students will be trained in specific skills rather than broad subjects.

"We are aligning our courses with market demands and introducing new techniques that emphasize precision and finesse," she said.

The PS cited specialized courses such as masonry, where she said training will be on specific skill sets like tiling, plastering, design, and flooring, noting that mastery in these areas would make graduates internationally competitive.

"We want train our students to the finest of details such that they exemplify finesse. Globally, we are seeing exceptional structures built with quality and finesse. If you have done tiling, you must be the best in that skill set.

This is the standard we aim to achieve through our TVET institutions," Muoria said.

The PS also assured that TVET institutions have enough highly qualified trainers to maintain the recommended student-to-trainer ratio, ensuring effective learning.

"Last year, the government employed 3,000 Tvet trainers and we hope the number will be increased in the coming years for efficiency. We also have state of the art

equipment to ensure the students get the adequate hands on training to prepare them for the job market," the PS said.

To be able to attract more students, the PS said they will work closely with the National government administrators to conduct a mop up exercise to ensure all former leavers not in college or university are enrolled in Tvet.

"We have discussed with the Commission for University Education to place those who scored less than C+ to Tvet. The students will be placed in Tvet that are closer to their homes for convenience. The vulnerable ones will also receive funding to enable them complete their education," she said.

Turkana unveils Sh 39.5m agricultural projects to support local farmers

The Department of Agriculture and Land Reclamation in Turkana County, in collaboration with USAID's Strengthening Agricultural Water Innovations (STAWI) program, has officially handed over agricultural projects worth Sh 39.5 million to farmers in Loima and Turkana South Sub-Counties.

SolarGen has been contracted to oversee the implementation of these projects. The initiatives include two canal linings, measuring 1,068 meters and 793 meters in Kangalita and Lojokobwo (Loima Sub-County), as well as the construction of a water conveyor and storage system in Lokwaliwa and Akigeno (Turkana South Sub-County).

To ensure timely and efficient project delivery, a six-member contract management committee has been established to work closely with the contractor.

County officials present during the handover included Jackson Ewat (Acting Assistant Director, Irrigation), Samuel Eru mu (Sub-County Agricultural Officer, Turkana South), among others.

"The lining of the canals will minimize water loss through seepage, allowing for the efficient delivery of water for crop production," Nanok said.

Job Kitetu, USAID STAWI Team Lead, reiterated the importance of quality work and noted that the canal lining is expected to be completed within 56 days.

To ensure timely and efficient project delivery, a six-member contract management committee has been established to work closely with the contractor.

State to address funding gaps for regional development authorities, says CS Mbadi

National Treasury and Economic Planning Cabinet Secretary, John Mbadi, has defended regional authorities against criticism for failing to discharge their mandate, attributing their challenges to inadequate government funding.

Speaking at the Konkona area of Garsen Constituency in Tana River County, Mbadi emphasized the important role played by regional authorities and pledged to do everything possible to ensure their success in promoting equitable development across Kenya.

"The challenges that regional development authorities have been facing

are not of their own making. We (the government) have not been adequately financing them, yet it is our duty to secure funding

for them. I am not promising miracles, but we will do everything humanly possible to ensure they are up and running," Mbadi

stated.

He made these remarks after commissioning an Sh11 million water project financed by the national government through the Tana and Athi Rivers Development Authority (TARDA), one of Kenya's six regional development authorities.

Mbadi said he loathed marginalization, a malady the regional authorities were created to cure, adding that the country should make deliberate efforts to ensure there is equity in development.

"I know what marginalization means, and as a country, we must be deliberate in ensuring that there is equity. We cannot have one country where we have two classes of

people – some driving on tarmac roads to their homes while others having not seen a single murram road in their areas," Mbadi said.

The project that Mr. Mbadi commissioned includes a solar-powered borehole with a capacity to produce 15,000 litres per hour, an elevated steel storage tank with a capacity of 24,000 litres, three water kiosks and a power house. It will benefit 300 households and 1,800 livestock.

Accompanied by Tana River Senator, Danson Buya Mungatana and Garsen Member of Parliament, Ali Wario Guyo, alias Ali Hashaka, Mbadi also reiterated the government's commitment

to addressing the effects of climate change.

He announced that the National Treasury, through the Financing Locally-Led Climate Action (FLLoCA) Programme, will disburse Sh122 million, with an additional Sh66 million from the Tana River County, for water projects and tree planting in the Constituency.

Additionally, Mbadi launched the construction of two bridges across River Tana, each costing Sh100 million, to improve transportation in the area.

He also pledged to fund the excavation of two water pans at a cost of Sh160 million, following a request by MP Hashaka.

Senator Mungatana echoed these sentiments, urging the Treasury Cabinet Secretary to ensure that marginalized areas receive adequate financial allocations in future budgets.

Kenya Railways, World Bank partner to tackle Nairobi traffic congestion

The Kenya Railways Corporation (KRC) has partnered with the World Bank on a project to decongest Nairobi's transport system, aiming to facilitate a smooth, sustainable, and efficient flow of traffic.

The Kenya Urban Mobility Improvement Pro-

ject (KUMIP) aims to eliminate the frustration caused by traffic jams and reclaim precious hours lost on congested roads.

Speaking during a stakeholders' meeting at the Kenya Railways Headquarters in Nairobi, Eng. George Maina, the KUMIP project team leader, stated that the transformative initiative aims to enhance

the Nairobi Commuter Rail Network, which spans 165 kilometers and connects Nairobi to key counties such as Kiambu, Machakos, Kajiado, and Murang'a.

The plan focuses on modernizing the Nairobi-Thika and Nairobi-Embakasi lines, which are projected to accommodate 1.4 million passengers

daily by 2030.

"The primary focus for now is the Commuter Rail from Nairobi Central Station to Thika," said Maina.

He explained that these enhancements will feature new battery-electric trains, upgraded stations and better access through non-motorized transport options like walkways and integrated bus services.

Kenya courts Japanese investors to boost industrialization, development

The Kenya-Japan Business Forum 2025 has launched a campaign to attract Japanese investors to Kenya, aiming to boost industrialization, expand investment opportunities, and drive economic growth.

The forum underscored the collaborative potential between the two nations, highlighting Kenya's diverse investment opportunities and Japan's advanced expertise across various industries. It emphasized the exchange of knowledge, insights, and innovative ideas as key to attracting investors.

This year's forum brings together over 100 Kenyan and 30 Japanese private sector companies from diverse sectors, including ICT, health, manufacturing, shipping and logistics, financial services, energy, construction, insurance, and agriculture, among others.

Speaking during the forum's inauguration in Nairobi, Acting Cabinet Secretary (CS) for Investment, Trade, and Industry Salim Mvurya acknowledged the long-standing

cordial relations between Kenya and Japan, noting that Japan has been Kenya's leading partner in development cooperation. He noted that Kenya remains a key exporter of agricultural products to Japan, providing products such as cut flowers and titanium ores, which amounted to \$62.9 million in the latest trade figures.

Meanwhile, Kenya

imports vehicles and ICT-related equipment from Japan, valued

As a government, we believe the future of both countries rests on pening new markets-CS

at over \$263 million. The forum aimed to deepen this exchange, encouraging business delegations to forge partnerships and explore untapped potential in both countries.

Additionally, he noted that some of the companies from Japan including Mitsubishi Heavy Industries France S.A.S. that focuses on energy, aerospace and plant systems,

Kawasaki Heavy Industries Ltd., that engages in shipbuilding, aerospace and energy systems, Toyota Tsusho Corporation, which engages in trading and construction projects, Mitsui & Co., Ltd., which engages in trading and project development; Zensho Holdings Co., Ltd., which operates foodservice chains, Hagi-hara Industries Inc., that produces polyethylene products among others.

Mvurya said that Kenya's government has prioritized expanding trade opportunities through initiatives like the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) and the Tripartite Free Trade Agreement, opening access to a combined market across Africa.

“As a government, we firmly believe that the future of both countries rests on our resolution to open new markets for trade, developing much better inflows of investments, and making new opportunities available for our people.

The Kenya government has been striving to open access to markets in Africa through the AfCFTA),

which provides a new market for investments and Kenyan products across Africa,” he said.

The government has also emphasized climate-conscious investments through the African Green Initiative, offering tax rebates and incentives for companies embracing sustainable practices and urged the delegates to take advantage of all the incentives in the green investment and ensure that they promote foreign investments and increase Kenyan investment.

“We have the African Green Initiative, chaired by the President and companies that invest are also profiled as green investments. They get tax rebates and other incentives to ensure that they become even more sustainable,” said CS, adding: “Kenya has decided to ensure that we deal with matters of climate change and therefore all our investments are also being looked at in terms of how they are going to facilitate a green environment within the Ministry of Trade and the highest level in Kenya.”

He underscored the Japan's commitment to Kenya's development by ongoing infrastructure projects, including the Dongo Kundu Special Economic Zone.

Kenya-EU trade relations set to strengthen as exports rise

The Government and private sector players are working to diversify export products in an effort to maximize the Kenya-European Union (EU) Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) and grow the economy by increasing foreign exchange earnings.

The Principal Secretary (PS) of the State Department for Trade, Alfred K'Ombudo, stated that Kenya and the European Union (EU) share strong trade ties, with the EU being one of Kenya's largest trading partners.

The PS explained that the EU is a USD 16 trillion market, absorbing, on average, 21.1 percent of Kenya's total exports annually.

K'Ombudo also noted that in 2023, Kenya exported goods to the EU valued at USD 1.07 billion, while imports totaled USD 1.6 billion, indicating that the country is nearly closing the gap in the balance of trade. K'Ombudo was speaking during a sensitization workshop on the Kenya - EU Economic

Partnership Agreement (EPA), said that Kenya's exports to the EU consist largely of agricultural commodities such as cut flowers, coffee, tea and spices, edible fruits and nuts among others.

He explained that Kenya and the EU signed the Kenya - EU Economic Partnership Agreement on 18th December 2023 and

Kenya's productive sectors. These include machinery and mechanical appliances, pharmaceutical products, electrical machinery, motor vehicles, paperboards, paper pulp among others," said K'Ombudo.

He explained that Kenya and the EU signed the Kenya - EU Economic Partnership Agreement on 18th December 2023 and

Kenya ratified the EPA on 24th April 2024, with the agreement entering into force on 1st July 2024.

The Agreement provides Kenyan products with duty-free and quota-free access to the EU market in alignment with the market requirements.

In an effort to promote export product diversification and assist Kenyans access the EU market, K'Ombudo said that the State Department for Trade has partnered with the EU, Danish Industry (DI), Kenya Association of Manufacturers (KAM) and other BMOs, to undertake sensitization campaigns on the Kenya-EU EPA across selected regions and counties.

"The aim of these sensitization workshops is to increase awareness and understanding of the benefits and opportunities presented by the Kenya-EU Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA). So far, we have successfully completed seven sensitization workshops across selected regions and counties including Nakuru, Kirinyaga, Eldoret,

Machakos, Isiolo, Mombasa and Kisumu," said K'Ombudo.

He added that they are currently in the process of developing a National Kenya - EU EPA implementation strategy. This strategy is imperative towards realizing the full benefits from the trade opportunities offered by the Kenya-EU EPA.

"The Strategy is expected to identify market access priorities, specific interventions, required financial and non-financial support by the EU, implementation responsibilities and timelines," he said.

K'Ombudo said that the EU-27 countries offer a huge potential market for exports, particularly of agricultural commodities, manufactured products, fisheries and livestock and animal products and Counties are expected to take advantage of this opportunity by initiating programs that expose County trade sectors to the EU market.

EU Ambassador to Kenya, Henriette Geiger, said that Kenya has

the aspiration to become an upper middle-income country and only exporting raw products, will not help in achieving this goal.

"Kenya needs to add value to its agricultural products as well as focusing on other high value sectors such as the creative industry, which is one of the fastest growing sectors in Kenya together with the digital sector, which is capitalizing on the young and thriving population," said Geiger.

She highlighted Kenya's median age of 19 years adding they are digitally savvy and there is need to help them access digital jobs.

Geiger said that in the future they are looking at having a services agreement between EU and Kenya, which is of key interest for Kenya to grow its economy seeing that one million youths are joining the job market annually, which is a key issue that the EU wants to help in addressing by providing job opportunities.

"We also have a sustainable trade chapter and it is very important for the EU to have climate friendly production and transportation and we are working on that in efforts to have decent jobs and promote women," said Geiger.

KEMFSED project awards Sh983.7m in grants to Kilifi self-help groups

The Kenya Marine and Fisheries Socio-Economic Development (KEMFSED) Project has awarded Sh983.7 million in grants to 287 self-help groups in Kilifi County since its inception.

"Under phases one and two of the project, 135 sub-projects are already in progress. With the commencement of phase three, the total number of sub-projects will rise to an impressive 287. These initiatives are set to benefit 15,030 members of the groups Kilifi County," he said.

Makueni allocates Sh2.6m to combat rising malnutrition

TVETs to expand intake in response to growing demand for technical skills

Plans are underway to increase the number of intakes in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) institutions to allow more students to acquire technical skills.

Each year, TVETs hold their intakes in January, April, and September. However, Charles Nyota, the Mount Kenya West Regional Director for TVETs, says there are plans to review the schedule to accommodate more students, as the demand for technical skills continues to rise.

In an interview with KNA, Nyota stated that the primary goal is to increase the number of trainees from the current 500,000 to one million by the end of the year. He added that the increased enrollment would primarily target the 2024 Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) graduates who may not qualify to join university.

"Our yearly intake is currently around 500,000 trainees. This year, we aim to double the intake to 1 million. By doing this, we will provide many students with the opportunity to enroll in TVETs. This will help optimize the use of the resources and equipment provided by the government. It will also help reduce idleness, as students from rural areas can acquire a skill and secure a job," Nyota said.

The minimum entry

grade for a TVET Diploma is C-, while the minimum entry grade for a Craft Certificate is D plain. A candidate who scored Grade E in the just released 2024 KCSE results can apply for an Artisan Certificate course.

This year, the total number of KCSE graduates who qualify to join TVETs increased to 605, 774 from 526,222 last year.

The Regional Director also confirmed that despite the suspension of the new University Funding Model by the court in December last year, the Ministry of Education will continue to disburse capitation for TVET students.

He said the Ministry had resolved to revert to the old system as they wait for direction from the government. Additionally, he urged students pursuing technical courses in TVETs to utilize

the student loan facility from the Higher Education Loans Board which he said will be disbursed by June this year.

"School fees for TVETs is set at Sh56,240. The government has reverted to the old model and that means that TVET students will still receive a capitation of Sh30,000 while the parents will be expected to foot the remaining balance. If the parent is unable to pay the prescribed amount, the student can apply for a HELB," said Nyota.

Nyota also said that the implementation of the dual training model which combines classroom learning with practical work experience is still on course. He said that the State Department is partnering with the private sector to facilitate trainees to access practical knowledge from the industries

as part of their course work and also secure industrial attachment.

He noted the department is also collaborating with the Labour Ministry to help TVET graduates secure job opportunities upon completion of their courses.

"As a department, we are trying our best to make sure all our trainees get industrial attachments through collaboration with various industries. We have also revolutionized TVETs such that beyond training students, we assist our graduates to secure jobs.

Since late last year, we have been working with the Ministry of Labour for linkage to overseas jobs and when such opportunities come up we reach out to our graduates and encourage them to turn up for the recruitment," stated Nyota.

Turkana and WFP partner to build climate-resilient food systems

The Turkana County Department of Agriculture, in collaboration with the World Food Programme (WFP), is leading efforts to improve food security by investing in selected climate-resilient food system hubs.

These hubs aim to establish sustainable food production systems across the county. Among the prioritized hubs are the Turkana West Refugee/Host Hub, the Lake Turkana Fishing Hub, and the Katilu-Turkwel Agro-Pastoral Hub. These three hubs are part of seven potential sites identified to scale up food production and build an extensive, resilient food system.

During a strategic meeting between county officials and WFP representatives, key discussions centered on strategic outcomes and transformative actions to enhance food system resilience. The agenda included identifying gaps, improving documentation, and fostering stakeholder collaboration to monitor and advance progress.

Speaking during the meeting, James Wangiros, County Executive Member for Agriculture, Livestock Development, and Fisheries,

emphasized the need for collaborative efforts among stakeholders to strengthen food systems across Turkana County.

"There is a critical need for effective Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) of agricultural projects within the hubs. Establishing a robust management information system will help assess the effectiveness of ongoing projects, optimize resource allocation, and ensure intended outcomes are achieved," noted CEC Wangiros.

He further underscored the importance of sensitizing local communities and stakeholders to embrace mindset and attitude changes toward agriculture and self-reliance.

WFP's Head of Lodwar Office, Sarah Ayodi, highlighted the significance of enhancing resilience in existing food production zones, advocating for the upgrading of current systems rather than creating entirely new ones.

County Food Security Advisor Chris Erukudi added that achieving resilient food systems requires investing in preservation, processing, and improving the efficiency of supply chains, including the regular maintenance of farming equipment.

Governor launches Machakos Youth Service to empower 1,000 young people

Governor Ndeti added that after the 21-day training at MYS—during which participants will be provided with uniforms, food, accommodation, and other basic needs—they will proceed to modern Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) centres.

"Youth empowerment is not mobilizing the youth to cause chaos, youth empowerment is equipping

CS urges contractor to fast-track completion of the Siyo-Muruny' Dam project

The Cabinet Secretary for Water, Eng. Eric Mugaa, has urged the contractor building the Siyo-Muyuny' Dam in West Pokot County to expedite all pending work on the project so that it is completed by mid-year.

Eng. Mugaa noted that the completion of the dam is long overdue and that no further delays will be tolerated.

Speaking during an inspection tour of the project, Eng. Mugaa further noted that the water supply component of the project is 97 percent complete, while the dam itself is 78 percent complete. He attributed the delays in completion to inconsistent funding, a challenge he said the government is addressing. He emphasized that the government has prioritized the completion of the project to pave the way for the commencement of other projects and to ensure value for money.

"We have engaged with the contractor to ensure significant progress and have the dam completed by mid-year. The Ministry of Water, Irrigation, and Sanitation is seeking funds through the supplementary budget for the completion of this project," said the Cabinet Secretary.

"We have experienced funding challenges since the start of this project in 2015. However, we are committed to ensure this project is complete as we only require Sh1.5 billion. With an allocation of Sh900 million this Financial Year, we are on the right track to sustain all on-going activities for the completion works," said the CS.

Once operational, the Siyo-Muruny' Dam will have a storage capacity of 8.9 billion litres, supplying over 38.8 million liters of clean water daily to more than 350,000 residents of Kapenguria, Makutano, Chepkono, Chepareria among other areas within West Pokot county.

He further said the project aims to address long-standing water shortages, particularly in Makutano and neighboring areas, while also enhancing agricultural productivity and social-economic activities.

West Pokot County Governor Simon Kachapin who accompanied the CS said the county will ensure the water from the dam reaches the people through the last mile connectivity program so that residents can reap maximum benefits from the project.

Excitement as construction resumes on key road linking Murang'a, Nyandarua counties

The construction of the stalled 27-kilometer road stretch from Gatakaini in Gatauga, Murang'a County, to Njabiini in Nyandarua County has resumed, sparking excitement and hope among the residents and road users.

Upon completion, the road—a game changer that cuts through the Aberdare Forest—is expected to connect Murang'a and Nyandarua counties.

Construction of the road, which passes through the forest offering a scenic view of the majestic peaks, torrential waterfalls, and steep forested ravines, began in 2020 but stalled for months.

Residents and road users whom KNA spoke to observed that once completed, the road will significantly reduce the distance and long hours spent traveling to Nyandarua County, a rich agricultural hub and the country's food basket.

The road will also contribute to economic growth between the two

neighboring counties.

"Murang'a and Nyandarua counties are known for their rich production of agricultural products, which is why we have been yearning for the completion of this project.

resources on fuel and vehicle maintenance owing to the long hours spent on the road because we have to use the fly over-Engineer route which is a long route," he adds.

He said that upon completion, they will be able to reap more as the distance covered will be shorter, translating into more returns on investment. The road construction has also provided employment to hundreds of young people.

On his part, Felix Karani notes that he has been working since the construction works began even though there have been challenges, es-

pecially high rainfall experienced in the area. He however said the project has transformed lives.

"Before coming here, I was unable to provide for my family but since I started working I have been able to provide and

my family has been cushioned from the high cost of living and I have also purchased a daily cow to further supplement my income," he says.

He applauded the company in charge of the construction for considering

the youth and offering them a chance to earn daily bread.

"Most of those working here are youthful and energetic and have been kept engaged while also getting their daily livelihood and this translates into a clean society because if they were idle and jobless their time would be spent engaging in anti-social behaviors like crime and substance abuse," he adds.

The project's foreman Leonard Kipkoech observes that the project has transformed lives and will ease the transportation of food from Nyandarua and also traffic from Naivasha to Thika as motorists will no longer be required to use the long Nairobi route.

"I have been working with this company since 2020 and our family and friends depend on this road for survival and as you can see we are currently doing tarmac work as we just completed the earth works so we expect that within a few months the construction will be complete," he said.

Government to establish land registries in Taveta and Voi Sub-Counties

The Government will gazette two new land registries in Taveta and Voi sub-counties to bring services closer to the people.

Deputy President (DP) Prof. Kithure Kindiki announced the plan during a ceremony in Taveta, Taita Taveta County, where over 3,500 title deeds were issued to residents of Njukini, Eldoro, and the surrounding areas.

Land ownership has been a contentious issue in the region, often causing disputes and stalling development projects.

The planned gazette-

ment aims to address the community's long-standing challenges, particularly delays in accessing land records, title deeds, and other critical land services. Once operational, the registries are expected to accelerate the resolution of land disputes, enhance land ownership documentation, and boost economic activities dependent on land.

During the event, the Deputy President presided over the issuance of 1,301 title deeds to residents of Njukini and 2,200 titles to those in Mata, Darajani, and Eldoro B in Taveta sub-county.

Prof. Kindiki assured

those who could not attend the event and whose titles were out that their documents would be delivered directly to their doorsteps.

To make work easier in all the remaining areas, all deserving residents must get a title deed. Taita Taveta is a bit big, and currently, all the residents of this county go to Wundanyi for land-related issues. Travelling from Taveta or Voi to Wundanyi for land services is challenging due to the distance. Therefore, the government has directed that we start a new registry office in Taveta and another one in Voi to make it

easier for the residents to process their land documents, hence saving time and resources," he said.

Government to purchase rice from 30,000 Ahero farmers in Kisumu

The Government has announced plans to purchase paddy from over 30,000 rice farmers in the Ahero Irrigation Scheme, Kisumu County, to ensure ready and stable markets for their crops.

National Treasury and Economic Planning Cabinet Secretary John Mbadi stated that the government has allocated Sh150 million in the supplementary

budget for the 2024/2025 financial year to facilitate the purchase.

"When President William Ruto visited the Nyanza region last year, he promised rice growers in Kadrem and Ahero that his government would provide funds to purchase rice directly from farmers," Mbadi said.

He added that while there had been delays in disbursing the funds for

the programme, the Treasury is set to release the finances by February.

Mbadi made the remarks at Chiga area in Kisumu County during his visit to different Financing Locally Led Climate Action (FL-LoCA) projects.

The initiative, which will be undertaken in collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture, will be implemented by the Lake Basin Development Authority

(LBDA).

This move is aimed at developing a national food reserve to cater for emergency response to humanitarian crises during floods and droughts in various parts of the nation.

"In this mini-budget, I will allocate the funds to LBDA to buy rice from farmers so that the government can supply it to Kenyans in need of food aid. There are so many Kenyans

going hungry and need food assistance. We do not want relief food distributed in the country to be imported from other countries," the CS observed.

The strategy, he noted, is in line with the government's Bottom Up Economic Transformation Agenda, which seeks to improve farmers' profit margins from farming activities and achieve economic sustainability in the

Abasuba language revival efforts gain momentum with ministry support

There has been growing concern among the Abasuba community about the possibility of losing their language due to cultural assimilation by the Luo community. It is said that many Abasuba people have limited knowledge of their culture. Ironically, they speak Luo fluently but struggle with their native tongue.

The fear of losing their culture and traditions has prompted the Abasuba to take proactive measures to ensure that the current generation preserves and upholds its heritage for future generations. Efforts include organizing annual cultural festivals, spearheaded by the Rusinga Cultural Festival organizing committee.

Narkiso Okello, Chairman of the Annual Rusinga Cultural Festival organizing committee, said they hold these cultural festivals each year to help the current generation reconnect with their cultural roots and language. He reiterated that modernity and cultural assimilation are major threats contributing to the loss of their cultural identity.

Okello explained that the cultural festivals provide an opportunity to learn about and appreciate their language and heritage. "These festivals aim to reconnect the younger generation with their roots, teaching them the Abasuba language and traditions through activities such as learning about household

items, numbers, the alphabet, and tools," he said.

During the festival, which attracted hundreds, including foreign tourists, the youth are taught the Abasuba language by the elders. The community has also taken steps to integrate the Abasuba language into early education with support from the Ministry of Education, and has translated parts of the Old Testament into their native tongue.

"We have also translated portions of the Old Testament into Abasuba," he said.

Other cultural activities showcased at the festivals include music, dance, boat racing, wrestling, and fashion. The Kenya Tourism Board (KTB) supports these festivals and recognizes their role in nurturing talent, preserving cultural heritage, and promoting moral values.

KTB official Erick Omenda underscored the importance of cultural festivals for tourism, foreign exchange, and promoting investment opportunities. "Such festivals showcase a community's uniqueness through the various activities performed and displayed," he added.

Rusinga Member of County Assembly (MCA) Samuel Okomo emphasized the festivals' role in engaging youth in meaningful activities, helping to address social challenges like teen pregnancies, and promoting positive integration among people.

Government committed to ensuring CBC is fully equipped, says Interior PS

government to ensure that the 2024 Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) students who missed out on university entry are admitted to various Technical institutions to get the necessary skills needed to drive the economy.

On health matters, Omollo urged Migori residents to register for the Taifa Care Programme under the Kenya Universal Health Coverage (UHC) initiative to ensure they benefit from the medical scheme tailored to offer better health care for all Kenyans.

The Taifa Care Programme has made significant progress, with 17 million Kenyans now registered under the Social Health Authority (SHA).

"Nobody should be left behind in terms of benefiting from the new Social Health Insurance scheme (SHIF) just because they have failed to register," noted Omollo.

National Biosafety Authority to crack down on illegal GMO research in Kenya

The National Biosafety Authority (NBA) has announced that it will take action against institutions involved in research on Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs) and their derived products that have not registered with the Authority, following the expiration of a three-month notice period. In October of last year, the Authority issued a notice to institutions engaged in GMO research, instructing them to regularize their approval with the Authority, with no penalties applying during the grace period. In a press statement, Josephat Muchiri,

Acting Director of Biosafety Research and Compliance at the Authority, cautioned that after the deadline, anyone found dealing with GMOs without a permit from the NBA would face legal action under the Biosafety Act. "We will be sending our officers later this year to visit institutions for physical verification," Muchiri added. Section 18(1) of the Biosafety Act 2009 prohibits any person from conducting activities involving GMOs without the written approval of the Authority. These activities include research, placing GMOs on the market, import, transit, or export of GMOs.

The Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS), through government ministries, agencies, and policymakers, aims to strengthen Kenya's commitment to Codex Alimentarius standards for food safety and trade.

The high-level engagement of policy and decision-makers in Nairobi was intended to disseminate East African Community (EAC) Codex policy briefs on specific food safety concerns and to call for action in bolstering Codex activities. The goal was to enhance awareness of the importance of standards in ensuring food safety, supporting trade, and fostering sustainable development.

With over 50 key stakeholders from various sectors in attendance, the event also provided a platform to discuss Kenya's position in Codex, review the implementation of past resolutions, and

strategize on strengthening Codex activities both nationally and regionally.

This comes at a time when there is increased awareness on the importance of food safety in developing countries against a backdrop of dietary changes occasioned by climate change while market transformation is seen altering and possibly increasing food safety risks.

The Codex Alimentarius is a collection of internationally adopted food standards and guidelines aimed at protecting consumers' health and ensuring fair practices in the food trade.

Kenya took the reins of Codex leadership recently following the unanimous election of Director of Veterinary Services (DVS) Dr. Allan Azengele as the Chairman, underscoring the country's strategic involvement and contribution to the development of food standards at the global arena.

Speaking at the forum, Dr. Azegele underscored the critical role of Codex standards in promoting international trade, asserting that adherence to food safety standards enhances the quality of food products, facilitating market access and strengthening Kenya's position as a competitive player in global trade.

"Food safety is a collective responsibility and Kenya's leadership in Codex Alimentarius is vital to our national agenda. By aligning with international food safety standards, we stand to unlock new market opportunities, build consumer trust, and ensure the health and wellbeing of our citizens. This meeting sets the stage for a renewed commitment to global best practices," Dr. Azegele stated.

KEBS Managing Director (MD) Ms. Esther Ngari reiterated the Standards Body's commitment to advancing food safety through robust regulatory frameworks and active participation in Codex.

"KEBS is committed to advancing food safety through robust regulatory frameworks and active participation in Codex. Today's engagement reinforces the importance of coordinated efforts across government and private sectors to safeguard public health and boost trade," Ms. Ngari stated.

Stakeholders pledged their commitment to continue support for Codex initiatives and strengthen collaboration with national and regional

stakeholders through capacity-building programs, technical support, and policy guidance to enhance the implementation of Codex standards across the globe, including here in Kenya.

"Food safety is not just a matter of health; it is a cornerstone of sustainable food security, trade and economic development. By upholding the principles of Codex, we not only protect public health but also open new opportunities for farmers and producers to access international markets," Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) Representative Hamisi Williams said.

While assuring consumers that Kenyan manufacturers commitment to adherence to globally recognized food safety standards for safeguarding public health and promoting trust in locally made products, Kenya Association of Manufacturers (KAM) CEO Tobias Alando called for the reduction of non-tariff barriers within the East African Community (EAC) and the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), saying they hinder market access and limit the potential of Kenyan manufacturers to compete on a regional and global scale.

"Kenya has a unique opportunity to champion our commitment to ensuring foods produced in Kenya meet the highest standards of safety

"As the Kenya Association of Manufacturers (KAM), we are proud to reaffirm our commitment to ensuring that the foods produced and marketed in Kenya meet the highest standards of safety and quality. These food safety standards are considered to be the 'international standard' used as guidelines for national food safety regulation and as a reference to litigate World Trade Organization (WTO) trade disputes in the food sector.

Machakos installs cool rooms for perishable produce at Marikiti market

Machakos County, in partnership with the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs through the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN), has constructed cool rooms in Marikiti Market for perishable products.

During the commissioning of the facility, Machakos Governor Wavinya Ndeti stated that the purpose of the facility is to preserve vegetables and provide storage for perishable products, thus reducing losses due to waste and increasing profits.

Governor Wavinya also acknowledged that the County's strong working relationship with various development partners has fostered the development and economic empowerment of Machakos residents.

The Governor added that, with support from the national government, 16 modern markets would be constructed in Machakos to create more jobs. Ruth

Olowa, GAIN Country Director, said that their aim for supporting cool rooms was because they believe everyone deserved nutritious and safe food while ensuring fresh food markets in Kenya remain operational.

Olowa said the cool rooms played a significant role in ensuring that fresh produce in Kenya did not go to waste before reaching the consumer.

She said the decision to install the cool rooms project in Machakos was informed by one of the vendor's concerns as well as findings from consumer market survey at the Marikiti Market.

The survey found out that 57% of vendors were concerned about food safety and business skills while 44% reported to be throwing food waste away.

The cool rooms are expected to reduce financial losses by minimizing wastes while improving hygienic standards in the market.

MOH reassures Kenyans on Marburg virus safety

Following the recent outbreak of the Marburg virus in neighboring Tanzania, the Ministry of Health, through the Principal Secretary for Public Health and Professional Standards, Ms. Mary Muthoni, has assured Kenyans that the virus has not crossed into Kenya. Speaking at Cottolengo Home for the Aged in Murang'a, the PS stated that the government has implemented the necessary surveillance measures to prevent the spread of the Marburg virus into the country. The PS emphasized that although no cases have been reported in Kenya, it is important for Kenyans to follow health guidelines provided by the Ministry of Health (MOH) to reduce the risk of transmission. She noted that the government is prepared, with enhanced surveillance and screening at the ports of entry.

"We have intensified our surveillance now that the Marburg virus has been mentioned, which is a serious disease," she said. "We have been managing the M-Pox disease since last year, conducting screenings at the ports of entry, where every traveler coming into the country is checked," Muthoni added. She urged the public to remain calm and reassured Kenyans that no data suggests the presence of Marburg in the country so far. "MOH is prepared and is developing messages to inform the public about the necessary precautions," she stated. The PS encouraged Kenyans to maintain high levels of hygiene, wash their hands with soap and water, and avoid sharing personal items like clothing. "I urge Kenyans to practice good hygiene wherever you are," she said.

Kenya poised to re-enter global Fluorspar market with major new discoveries

Kenya is poised for a historic re-entry into the lucrative international fluorspar market by June this year, following confirmatory findings of millions of tons of high-grade, commercially viable fluorspar deposits in the Kimware area of Elgeyo Marakwet County.

Geological data from exploratory work by Sofax Fluorspar, the investor, indicates the potential for hundreds of millions of tons of fluorspar, with the confirmed commercially viable resource estimated at 18 million tons.

Elijah Mwangi, the Principal Secretary (PS) for the State Department of Mining, stated that Kenya is determined to reclaim its position as a leading fluorspar producer in Africa, joining the ranks of the continent's top exporters, including South Africa and Morocco.

Speaking during an inspection tour of the Fluorspar Processing Plant to assess the progress of the facility's revival, the PS noted that repair works to revamp and rehabilitate the plant were being accelerated to fast-track Kenya's entry into the export market. This will allow the country to benefit from the surging global demand for the mineral.

"We want to expedite the revival of this facility and allow Kenya to reclaim its place as a leading exporter of fluorspar in the international mineral market. This is a goal we aim to achieve as soon as possible," he said.

The revival of the Fluor-

spar Processing Plant, at a cost of Sh 4.8 billion, is one of the landmark projects in the mining sector. Production is expected to start in June, marking Kenya's triumphant return to the fluorspar export business after an eight-year hiatus. This follows the country's exit from the global fluorspar market in 2017 due to a severe downturn in international fluorspar prices.

The anticipated reopening of the processing plant has generated excitement within the sector, with mining experts predicting substantial gains for Kenya due to the high demand for fluorspar from developed nations.

Mr. Enoch Kipseba, the Director of Geological Services, stated that the global shift toward green energy, which

is driving growth in technology and innovation, has led to a sharp increase in demand for high-grade fluorspar, particularly for use in the manufacturing of modern batteries for electric vehicles.

"The global transition to clean energy is a welcome boost for the fluorspar market, and Kenya is set to reclaim its market share in the export trade," he explained.

Although South Africa and Morocco are currently the dominant players in

fluorspar mining in Africa, Kenya's entry is expected to generate significant excitement, particularly due to the high quality of its fluorspar, which contains fewer impurities.

Sofax Fluorspar, the investor, stated that production will begin in June after the repair and test-running of the mining and processing equipment. The firm projects a daily processing capacity of 500 tons, with an estimated annual fluorspar output of 120,000 tons. While expressing confidence with the market trends, Mr. John Masanda, Sofax Regional Director,

Sofax Regional Director, said the fluorspar demand across the world was likely to keep rising in the near future to meet the huge consumption appetite for the mineral.

According to Sofax, comprehensive geological works done in the 9,000-acre under the project has identified 12 major sites with potential for yielding high-grade fluorspar. The investor says they have deployed digitized systems for monitoring price trends in the international market which will determine production output.

"Our production will be

determined by the market prices. We are confident with the current and future outlook that promises to give us a favorable climate in the global fluorspar market," he said.

The resumption of fluorspar mining in Kenya marks a monumental turning point for the government towards addressing critical economic issues in the country including job creation, promotion of exports to enhance the balance of trade and improvement of social-economic welfare of the communities within the region.

The PS says the revival of the fluorspar processing plant will create over 300 direct employment opportunities and 2,500 indirectly. He also noted that through the Community Development Agreement (CDA), the local community would receive one-percent of the company's gross sales for priority projects.

"This revival of this facility is not only about the investor but more about the community's welfare. We expect the local residents to enjoy enhanced benefits of their mineral resource," he said.

Unaccredited rehabilitation centers operating to face legal action

The National Authority for the Campaign Against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) has raised concern over the increasing number of rehabilitation centres operating without adherence to the requisite legal frameworks and data protection guidelines.

According to the authority's Chief Executive Officer Dr. Anthony Omerikwa, the disregard not only jeopardizes the quality of care provided to individuals seeking help but also exposes clients to potential vi-

olations of their rights and privacy.

"NACADA is closely monitoring activities within the rehabilitation sector and will take firm legal action against unaccredited or non-compliant facilities. Such facilities risk facing the full extent of the law, including closure and prosecution," the CEO emphasized.

As mandated under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (Control) Act, 1994, and in line with Kenya's Data Protection Act, 2019, all rehabilitation facilities must meet stringent legal and operational

standards. These include accreditation by NACADA, compliance with client confidentiality provisions, and ensuring the highest standards of treatment protocols.

Currently, NACADA has accredited 78 rehabilitation facilities out of the 150 that were inspected in this financial year. Accreditation is granted based on strict adherence to the law and best practices in addiction treatment.

Facilities that do not meet these standards are given feedback and guidance on how to align their operations. However, the

Authority reiterates that it will not hesitate to revoke accreditation for facilities found to violate these requirements.

The authority has assured its commitment on ensuring availability of safe, ethical, and effective rehabilitation services for those battling alcohol and substance abuse.

Unaccredited or non-compliant facilities are advised to reach out to the authority by visiting their head office or through their website www.nacada.go.ke for guidance on obtaining compliance.

Farmers in Nakuru harness modern techniques to combat climate challenges

A wave of innovation is sweeping across Nakuru County as farmers embrace modern agricultural techniques to increase productivity and combat the challenges of climate change. From precision farming to sustainable practices, the region is witnessing a transformation in its agricultural landscape.

One such success story is John Njoroge, a small-scale farmer in Bahati Sub-County. However, Mwenje regrets the continued subdivision of land into unsustainable pieces for agriculture, and the current trend of farmers along the highway selling their land to real estate managers and petrol companies to construct fueling stations at the expense of agriculture.

From the enchanting Thomson Falls to the majestic Tugen Hills, the mesmerising waters of Lake Bogoria, the heart-stopping dives at Cheploch Gorge and the rich history of Tambach Town, the trail brought to life Kenya's diverse landscapes and unparalleled cultural heritage.

The Thomson Falls

Located in Nyahururu, the scenic waterfall drops about 74 metres, making it one of the highest falls in Kenya. The fall, which is about 220 kilometres north of Nairobi, is formed where the Ewaso Nyiro River plunges into a gorge. The river originates from the Aberdare Ranges and flows through the highlands before falling at this point. There are several viewpoints, a museum and walking trails around the falls. Visitors further enjoy activities like picnicking and fishing.

Lake Bogoria

Located in Baringo County, the lake is one of the most captivating tourist destinations. The lake is famous for its hot springs and geysers, and is a flamingo haven. The birds flock to the lake in huge numbers, creating a pink spectacle against the backdrop of the lake.

"This is the only lake in the country currently hosting flamingos, the birds having flown from Lake Nakuru. We are proud of this as Baringo County and we are marketing this to bring in more tourists," Mr Benjamin Cheboi, Baringo Governor said.

Cheploch Gorge

Sitting on the border of Baringo and Elgeyo-Marakwet counties, the gorge is a must-go for thrill-seekers. Young, fearless divers leap from heights of about 70 metres into the waters of Kerio River, providing a spectacle that is both thrilling and nerve-wracking.

Tambach Heritage Town

Tambach, one of Kenya's oldest towns, provides a deep historical dimension to the "Magical Kenya Trail" narrative.

Established in the 1920s by British colonial administrators, the heritage site is nestled on the Elgeyo Escarpment with spectacular views of the Kerio Valley. The town's museum and historical buildings offer insights into Kenya's colonial history.

The *Yearbook 2024* highlights the developments in the tourism sector in the past year, breaking down the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife interventions to diversify tourism offerings. The Government has focused on niche tourism markets, including sports, adventure and culture tourism, showcasing Kenya as a desirable travel destination, through the "Magical Kenya" brand.

Kenya's tourism sector registered an improved performance in 2023 and 2024. Tourist arrivals in the first half of 2024 stood at 1.02 million, an increase of 21.3 per cent as compared to a similar period in 2023, earning the country Sh142.5 billion.

The Government during the period also unveiled new tourist circuits that map all the 47 counties across the country. ■

Mr Mudavadi called for effective communication of Government's policies,



77,000 soil samples to be collected in national soil fertility initiative

The Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organization (KALRO), in collaboration with county governments, is working to develop digital soil fertility maps under a project funded by the World Bank.

As part of the project, more than 77,000 soil samples will be collected from 45 counties, excluding Nairobi and Mombasa, with the aim of testing soil quality to guide interventions aimed at increasing food production.

Deputy Director of KALRO Horticulture Research Institute (HRI), Dr. Daniel Gikaara, said the project, dubbed the National Agricultural Value Chain Development Project (NAVCDP), commenced in 2024 and will run until 2027.

According to Dr. Gikaara, the project will create digital soil nutrient maps based on various soil attributes, such as pH, to support policy decisions and provide tailored recommendations to farmers across different agricultural value chains nationwide.

Speaking during a training session for agripreneurs recruited to champion the project in Murang'a County at Murang'a University, Gikaara emphasized the

importance of soil testing. He noted that overuse of fertilizers and other farm chemicals has depleted soil nutrients.

“Farmers often use fertilizers without understanding the specific types needed for their farms, which should be determined by soil sampling results,” Gikaara said.

He explained that, with the support of county governments, agripreneurs have been recruited in every ward to collect soil samples and send them for testing at KALRO laboratories.

“These agripreneurs will also advise farmers on the types of crops to plant and the appropriate inputs to use based on analyzed soil

samples and the resulting soil maps,” he added.

The agripreneurs will use mobile phone applications to facilitate soil sample collection and mapping.

“They will be trained to use two applications, Maps. Me and Kobo Collect, which will help them navigate specific soil sampling points and input data from those sites,” Gikaara explained.

He noted that the project plans to procure 12 Mid-Infrared (MIR) machines, which will be strategically distributed across the country at KALRO centers.

“These machines will significantly reduce the challenges of sample analysis and shorten the waiting

time for results,” he said.

The machines will analyze various soil attributes, provide predictions, and recommend suitable crops for specific soil types. Gikaara highlighted that the new technology would also reduce the cost of soil analysis nationwide.

Previously, soil mapping relied on near-infrared technology, which yielded inconsistent results due to a limited soil database.

“Approximately 77,969 soil samples will be collected and analyzed to create a national soil spectral library. This will standardize lab results across the country and ensure uniformity,” Gikaara remarked.

Government to construct more dykes in Trans Nzoia to mitigate effects of floods

The Government, through the Ministry of Water, Sanitation, and Irrigation, has implemented flood control measures in Trans Nzoia County. These measures include, among other activities, the construction of additional dykes along River Sabwani.

The implementation of these measures, undertaken in collaboration with the National Water Harvesting and Storage Authority (NWHSA), is expected to significantly mitigate the effects of flooding in the region.

Speaking during an in-

spection tour of the flood control works along River Sabwani, Cabinet Secretary for the Ministry of Water,

Sanitation, and Irrigation, Eric Mugaa, noted that since the launch of flood mitigation measures in

2017, NWHSA has enabled families living along the river to reclaim more land for agricultural activities.

He added that the reclamation efforts, which have so far cost the government nearly Sh40 million, have resulted in increased food production. This success has motivated the government to intensify its efforts in the region.

The CS also urged the youth to take advantage of the reclaimed land by engaging in agribusiness, which he emphasized would help address food insecurity and tackle the challenge of unemployment.
