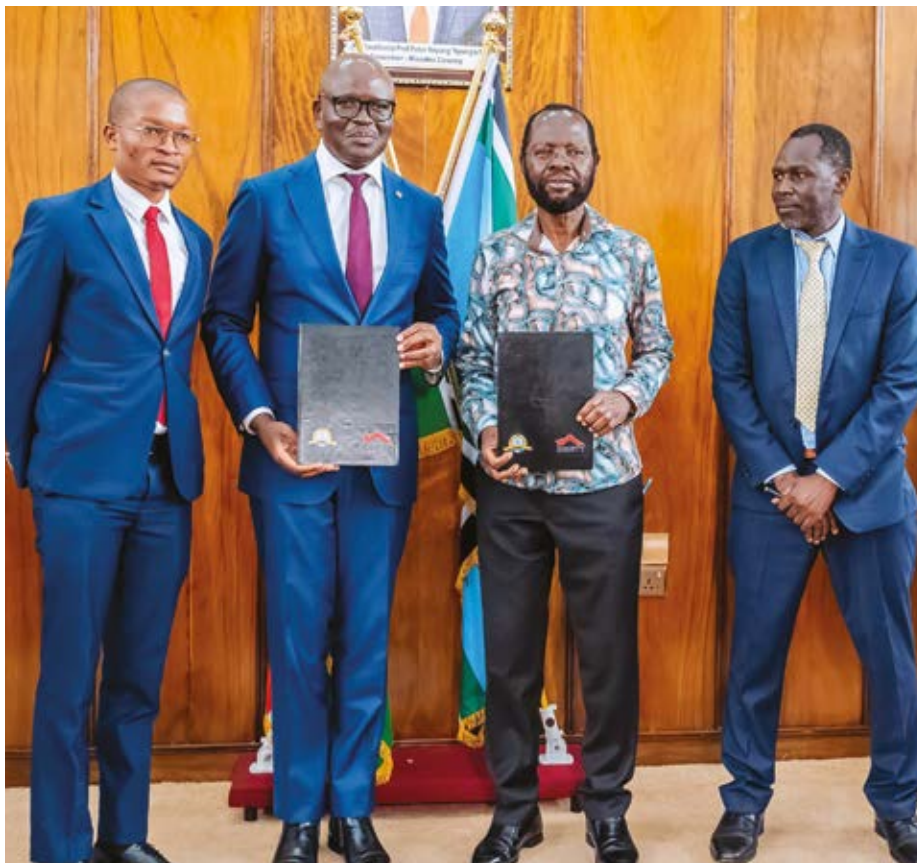

Watu binafsi na mashirika yatakayopatikana na hatia ya ufisadi yatakabiliwa na marufuku ya lazima ya miaka 10 kushiriki katika zabuni za umma, chini ya marekebisho mapya yaliyopendekezwa katika Mswada wa Marekebisho ya Sheria za Kupambana na Ufisadi wa mwaka 2025. Sheria hiyo inayopendekezwa inalenga kurekebisha baadhi ya sheria kuu za kupambana na ufisadi, ikiwemo Sheria ya Kupambana na Ufisadi na Uhalifu wa Kiuchumi, ili kumzuia mtu binafsi, shirika la kibiasara, au chombo kisicho cha kisheria kilichopatikana na hatia ya ufisadi kupewa kandarasi za umma. Hii ni hatua ya kuzuia wahalifu wa mara kwa mara na makampuni yanayodumisha ufisadi kupitia udanganyifu wa manunuzi. Akizungumza wakati wa kikao cha ushirikishwaji wa umma katika Kanisa la ACK Holy Trinity mjini Kericho, Mshauri Mkuu wa Kiserikali katika Ofisi ya Mwanasheria Mkuu, Bi. Claries Kariuki, alieleza kuwa marekebisho hayo yanalenga kufunga mianya ya kisheria ambayo yamewawezesha watu

hakikisha upatikanaji wa mbegu na pembejeo za ubora wa juu. Nyong'o alisema mpango huo utatekelezwa katika wadi zote 35 za kaunti, huku Idara ya Kilimo ikiongoza usajili na uthibitishaji wa wakulima wanaostahiki. Jukwaa la kidijitali litawaweze-sha wakulima waliosajiliwa ku-changia sehemu ya gharama ya pembejeo, kisha serikali ya kaunti itakamilisha kiasi kilichosalia kupitia mfumo wa vocha za kielektroniki wa Benki ya Equity. Baada ya malipo ya pamoja kukamilika, kiasi kamili cha ruzuku kitawekwa kwenye akaunti ya vocha ya kielektroniki iliyo salama na imefungwa, ambayo imeunganishwa na kila mkulima. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Benki ya Equity, Moses Nyabanda, alisema hatua hiyo inathibitisha dhamira ya benki hiyo katika kuimarisha usalama wa chakula na ujumuishi wa kifedha. "Kilimo ni msingi wa ukuaji wa uchumi wa Kenya. Kupitia jukwaa hili la kidijitali, wakulima wata-pata pembejeo bora na huduma za kifedha, ikiwemo fursa ya kufungua akaunti za benki na kujenga historia ya kifedha inayotambulika," alisema. sha tu wakulima kupanua biashara zao za kilimo, bali pia utachoea shughuli za kiuchumi katika mnyororo mzima wa thamani ya kilimo, hivyo kuimarisha biashara vijijini. "Fedha hizi zinaweza kukombolewa tu kwenye maduka ya pembejeo yaliyothibitishwa na yaliyoko kwenye vituo vya biashara vya karibu na wakulima, kuhakikisha upatikanaji rahisi wa pembejeozabowajuu," alisema. Nyabanda alibainisha kuwa

mpango huu wa Kisumu ni wa kwanza wa aina yake nchini na unalingana na mkakati mpana wa Equity Group chini ya Mpango wake wa Africa Recovery and Resilience Plan. "Benki inalenga kukuza mkopo na uwekezaji katika sekta ya chakula na kilimo hadi kufikia angalau asilimia 30 ya mizania yake, jambo linaloonyesha dhamira yake ya kubadilisha maisha kupitia huduma jumishi za kifedha," alisema.

Bi. Kariuki alisisitiza kuwa mswada huo pia unapanua mam-laka ya mashirika ya uchunguzi ya kukamata, kugandisha na kurejesha mali zilizopatikana kwa njia haramu, na unapanua maana ya

HELB yasaka usaidizi wa walimu kuwafikia wanafunzi wenye mahitaji kote nchini

NA SITATI REAGAN NA AMINA BAKARI, KNA

Bodi ya Mikopo ya Elimu ya Juu (HELB) imewasilihi walimu kote nchini kusaidia juhudi za kuwatambua wanafunzi wanaohitaji msaada wa kweli na kuhakikisha upatikanaji wa ufaadhili wa elimu ya juu kwa usawa. Akizungumza wakati wa Mkutano wa 48 wa Kila Mwaka wa Wakuu wa Shule za Upile za Kenya (KESSHA) uliofanyika Mombasa, Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa HELB Bw. Geoffrey Monari alisema bodi hiyo imejitoa kufadhili mtaji wa binadamu wa Kenya ili kuifanya nchi iwe na ushindani katika soko la ajira la kimataifa. “Maono yetu ni kufadhili nguvu kazi ya Kenya ili iweze kufanya kazi popote duniani. Mtaji wa binadamu ndio rasilimali ya thamani zaidi kwa taifa letu. Kama walezi, lazima tuwahimise wanafunzi kuendeleza masomo yao ya juu,” alisema Monari. Alibainisha kuwa mwanafunzi anayekamilisha programu ya Mafunzo ya Ufundi na Kitaaluma (TVET) anaweza kupata mshahara wa juu kwa asilimia 27 kuliko mhitimu wa Cheti cha Elimu ya Sekondari ya Kenya (KCSE), akisisitiza umuhimu wa kuendelea na elimu. Monari alielezea juhudi za HELB kusaidia wanafunzi katika vi-

wango mbalimbali, ikiwemo wanafunzi wa shahada ya kwanza, wanafunzi walio na ajira, na wanafunzi wa TVET. Tangu kuanzishwa kwake mwaka 1975, bodi hiyo imetoa zaidi ya Sh179 bilioni kwa zaidi ya wanufaika milioni 1.7. “Kufikia sasa, tuna wanakopa 463,150 wanaorejesha jumla ya Sh66 bilioni,” alisema. Licha ya juhudi hizi, Monari alifichua kwamba HELB bado inak-

abiliwa na upungufu wa ufadhili wa Sh36 bilioni. Bodi hiyo imepokea Sh41.5 bilioni kufikia sasa, lakini inahitaji rasilimali za ziada ili kukidhi mahitaji yote. Monari alisema kwa sasa bodi inafuatilia jumla ya akaunti za mikopo 490,817, ambapo 293,122 wanarejesha mikopo yao, ilhali 245,030 hawajalipa. Aliwaomba wadaiwa waliokosa

kulipa watekeleze wajibu wao wa kurejesha mikopo ili wanafunzi wengi zaidi waweze kunufaika na mfuko wa mzunguko. “Tunashukuru taaluma ya ualimu, kwani ndiyo ina idadi kubwa zaidi ya walipaji wa mikopo ya HELB,” aliongeza. Akijibu wasiwasi kuhusu gharama ya elimu ya chuo kikuu, Monari alikanusha madai kwamba mikopo ya HELB ni ghali, akitaja kiwango cha riba cha asilimia nne. “Kwa riba ya asilimia nne, nawa-hakikishia kwamba ni nafuu. Kutokuwa na elimu ndicho kitu cha gharama zaidi,” alisema. Monari alitoa wito wa ushirikiano wa karibu kati ya HELB na shule ili kuwatambua wanafunzi wanaostahili. Alibainisha kwamba jitihada za awali za kushirikiana na machifu kuthibitisha visa vya uhitaji zilishindikana kutokana na udanganyifu na madai ya malipo ya usaidizi. “Katika baadhi ya visa, ghafla kila mtu katika jamii alijitangaza kuwa mhitaji, na machifu walianza kudai malipo ili kutoa barua za mapendekezo,” alisema. Aliongeza kuwa baadhi ya wanafunzi wenye uhitaji wa kweli walikuwa na hofu ya kufichua hali zao kutokana na unyanyapaa, huku wengine kutoka familia tajiri wakijitangaza kama wahitaji kwa sababu hawakuwa na cha kupoteza.

Wizara ya Kilimo na Maendeleo ya Mifugo iliendelea zoezi la uhifadhi wa mifugo katika Kaunti ya Turkana, na kusambaza jumla ya mbuzi 4,400 kwa familia zinazohitaji. Mpango huo ni sehemu ya mpango mpana wa Rais, ambao umeanzishwa ruzuku katika sekta nyinginezo kama vile chai, kahawa na miwa. Pia inalenga maeneo kame na nusu kame kupitia mpango wa ufugaji wa mbuzi. Katika Kaunti Ndogo ya Lokichoggio, mbuzi 360 waligawiwa kwa kaya 72, huku kila kaya ikipokea mbuzi watano, akiwemo mbuzi mmoja. Kila moja ya kaunti ndogo 11 katika kaunti hiyo ilipokea mgao wa mbuzi kusaidia familia zenye uhitaji. Alipokuwa akiongoza mpango huo, Kamishna wa Kaunti ya Turkana Julius Kavita alisema, “Mbuzi hawafai kuuzwa; wanapaswa kuzaana na kuongezeka ili waweze kusaidia kaya katika siku zijazo.” Wakazi hao walitoa shukrani zao kwa serikali kwa kusaidia kuinua maisha yao.

Kwa sasa hakuna sheria iliyotengwa mahsusi kushughulikia mauaji ya wanawake nchini Kenya,” alibainisha. Dulu pia alieleza kuhusu uhaba mkubwa wa makazi salama kwa waathiriwa wa ukatili wa kijinsia.

PUBLIC NOTICE: WARNING AGAINST FRAUDULENT ACTIVITIES BY IMPOSTERS POSING AS KENYA BUREAU OF STANDARDS (KEBS) OFFICIALS

It has come to the attention of Kenya Bureau of Standards (hereinafter, 'KEBS') that certain individuals, working for a private company going by the name **Multi-Works and Rights Enforcements Co. Ltd** which identifies as a consumer rights/protection organization, are falsely claiming affiliation with KEBS and unlawfully engaging in enforcement activities under the pretext of implementing the Consumer Protection Act. KEBS strongly disassociates itself from these activities and condemns them in the strongest terms possible.

Numerous complaints from the public and business community across the country reveal an organized and widespread pattern of fraudulent conduct. The most recent and alarming incident was reported on **June 16, 2025**, in Longisa, Merigi, and Embu business centers in Bomet County. In this case, individuals masquerading as KEBS officers carried out illegal inspections and raids on retail shops and even entertainment clubs, extorting bribes of up to KSh. 20,000 per shop. Similar incidents have also been reported in Kakamega, Kisumu, Meru, Machakos, Voi, and Mombasa, indicating that this criminal activity is systematic and well-coordinated.

KEBS clarifies that **Multi-Works and Rights Enforcements Co. Ltd** (Company Registration No. C.115299), reportedly led by one Edward R. Olang, is a private company and is **not affiliated** with KEBS. KEBS is further aware that this company purported to operate as a Consumer protection organization by dint of gazette notices No. 7851 of 2023 and 208 Of 2024 which has since been cancelled through Kenya Gazette Vol. CXVII-No.31 issued on 14th February, 2025.

When legitimate KEBS personnel conduct official duties such as market surveillance, they strictly adhere to laid down protocols. They must produce their Certificate of Appointment as Inspectors under the Standards Act, Chapter 496 of the Laws of Kenya, and KEBS Staff Identification Card, which can be verified by sending the HR number from the staff Identity Card via SMS to 20023 (you will receive the officer's name, designation, ID number, and employment status). Alternatively, verification can be done by calling the KEBS **Toll-Free Line 1545** or emailing info@kebs.org. It is crucial to note that legitimate KEBS officers do not demand bribes, do not impose on-the-spot fines, and do not carry out arrests or detentions.

KEBS conducts enforcement strictly in accordance with the Standards Act Cap 496 and the Fair Administrative Action Act No. 4 of 2015. During legitimate inspections, Sample Collection Forms are issued when products are taken for analysis, and Seizure Notification Forms are provided in cases of non-compliance. Business operators are always given sufficient time to respond to findings, and no fines are imposed on-site. The Bureau is actively working closely with the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), National Police Service (NPS), Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP), and Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) to investigate and prosecute the perpetrators of these illegal acts. KEBS wishes to notify the public that there are active investigations against these perpetrators, including court cases.

KEBS urges all business operators and members of the public to remain vigilant. If approached by individuals claiming to be KEBS officers, demand identification and verify their authenticity immediately by sending the HR number to **20023** or calling the KEBS **Toll-Free Line: 1545** or emailing info@kebs.org. **Do not comply with illegal demands** such as bribes or on-the-spot fines from anyone who cannot provide valid documentation. Report **suspicious activities immediately** to the nearest Police Station and to KEBS via 1545 or info@kebs.org. Please **preserve any evidence**, such as names, phone numbers, photos, receipts, or videos, to assist in investigations.

As the custodian of quality standards in Kenya, KEBS remains steadfast in its mandate and is committed to protecting consumers, safeguarding legitimate businesses, and preserving the integrity of its enforcement activities.

Huduma ya Misitu ya Kenya (KFS), kwa ushirikiano na Shirika la Chakula na Kilimo la Umoja wa Mataifa (FAO), imeongeza juhudi za kurejesha misitu katika Mombasa. Juhudi hizi zinazingatia hasa mfumo wa ikolojia wa mikoko katika eneo la Tudor Creek. Mpango wa Accelerating Innovative Monitoring for Forests (AIM4Forests) — ambao ni mradi wa miaka mitano chini ya FAO — unatumia teknolojia za kisasa za ufuatiliaji, zikiwemo vipimo vya mbali (remote sensing) na data za anga, ili kuboresha uhifadhi wa misitu. Sehemu muhimu ya mpango huu ni ushirikishaji wa vijana kupitia mpango wa Young Forest Champions. “Mpango huu ulitokana na mradi wa IMPRESS na tangu wakati huo umebadilika. Vijana walihusishwa katika mjadala ya juu ya serikali, na tukafanikiwa kuhamasisha ufadhili wa kuzindua AIM4Forests,” alisema Bi. Ivana Tara, mratibu wa FAO wa mpango wa Young Forest Champions huko Jomvu, Mombasa. Mpango wa AIM4Forests unatekelezwa nchini Kenya, Uganda, Ghana, Peru, na Zambia. Timu ya vijana kumi imechaguliwa kuongoza shughuli za kijamii za ufuatiliaji na urejeshaji wa misitu hapa Kenya. Tangu Januari, mpango huu umehusisha wanajamii 10,550 wanaoishi karibu na misitu na kupanda zaidi ya miti 150,000. Balozi wa misitu, Brenda Kajuu, ambaye ni mwanafunzi wa Chuo Kikuu cha Kenyatta, alisema alivutiwa na uhifadhi kutokana na juhudi za jamii kurejesha Misitu wa Meru. Anatomia Geographic Information Systems (GIS) na teknolojia ya vipimo vya mbali (remote sensing) kuimarisha juhudi

za uhifadhi kupitia ufuatiliaji wa misitu, maeneo ya kijani, ubora wa ardhi na ubora wa hewa juu ya uso wa ardhi. “Mwaka huu nilichaguliwa kuwa balozi kijana wa misitu chini ya AIM4Forests. Alisema kuwa kama kaunti, Kirinyaga inatekeleza suluhu

endelevu na zinazoongozwa na wananchi. Alisisitiza kuwa mitungi hiyo ya gesi si kwa kupikia tu — bali pia inaleta manufaa ya kiafya, inalinda mazingira, na kuongeza hesima kwa maelu ya familia. inakadiriwa kuokoa zaidi ya miti 500 mikubwa kila mwaka. Mbali na ugawaji wa gesi, serikali ya Waiguru pia imeanzisha miradi mingine ya maendeleo inayokamilisha juhudi hizo, ikiwa ni pamoja na usambazaji wa maji na uhimilishaji wa umwagiliaji, usimamizi wa taka, na kilimo kinachozingatia mabadiliko ya tabianchi.

Wadau wa afya wametoa wito kwa serikali kufunga vifaa vya kuchunguza damu katika Hospitali ya Rufaa ya Kaunti ya Homa Bay ili kurahisisha huduma za upasuaji wa damu. Mratibu wa Udhidhi wa Maambukizi wa Kaunti, James Okuthe, alisema kuwa ucheleweshaji wa kupata damu iliyochunguzwa katika vituo vya afya unakwamisha juhudi za kuokoa maisha wakati wa dharura zina-zohitaji upasuaji wa damu. Okuthe alisisitiza umuhimu wa kuipatia benki ya damu ya Homa Bay vifaa vya kuchunguza damu hapo hapo ili kupunguza muda unaotumika kusubiri matokeo kutoka Kisumu. Alifafanua kuwa kaunti za Nyanza na maeneo jirani hutuma damu kwenye benki ya damu ya mkoa wa Kisumu kwa ajili ya uchunguzi na kwa kawaida husubiri kati ya siku tano hadi saba kabla ya kupokea matokeo. Aidha, alieleza kuwa upungufu wa vitendanishi (reagents) katika Kisumu wakati mwingine husababisha ucheleweshaji zaidi, hata pale wagonjwa wanapohitaji damu kwa dharura. Akizungumza wakati wa maadhimisho ya Siku ya Wafadhili wa Damu katika mji wa Oyugis, katika eneo bunge la Kasipul, Okuthe alisema hali kama vile upungufu wa damu (anemia), hemophilia, na ugonjwa wa seli munda zinahitaji damu ipatikane kwa haraka. Afisa wa Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), Polycarp Ogwen, alisema kuwa Kaunti ya Homa Bay inahitaji mapipa 11,400 ya damu kila mwaka ili kuhudumia idadi ya wagonjwa wanaoongezeka. Mwaka jana, kaunti ilipata mapipa 7,700 kupitia michango. Alisema Kaunti ya Homa Bay ni miongoni mwa kaunti zenye vifo vingi vya akina mama wajawazito, akibainisha kuwa kwa mujibu wa ripoti ya tathmini ya mwaka 2014, kiwango cha vifo kilikuwa vifo 583 kwa kila vizazi hai 100,000.

“Tuna changamoto ya uchunguzi wa damu kwa wakati. Muda unaohukuliwa kama madak-tari wakisubiri matokeo ya uchunguzi hauwezi kuturuhusu kupambana na kuvuja damu wakati wa kujifungua,” alisema.

Bodi ya Usajili wa Wasanifu Majengo na Wapimaji Kiasi (BORAQS) imewataka wataalamu katika sekta ya mazingira ya ujenzi nchini Kenya kuanza kutumia Teknolojia ya Akili Unde (AI) ili kuendeleza ubunifu, kuongeza ufanisi, na kuhimiza uendelevu. Waziri wa Barabara na Uchukuzi, Davis Chirchir, alisisitiza kwamba AI tayari imeunganishwa katika kazi za kila siku za wataalamu wengi kupitia majukwaa kama Microsoft Copilot, ChatGPT, na Google Gemini. “Ikiwa hutumii zana hizi, unapoteza fursa ya kufanikisha zaidi ya unachofanya sasa,” alisema Chirchir katika hotuba iliyosomwa kwa niaba yake na Evans Mutari, Katibu wa Utawala katika Idara ya Barabara, wakati wa kongamano la BORAQS 2025. Kongamano hilo lililoandaliwa kwa kaulimbiu “Kuwarezesha Wataalamu wa Mazingira ya Ujenzi Nchini Kenya Kupitia Akili Bandia,” lililenga jinsi AI inavyobadilisha usanifu, ujenzi, usimamizi wa miradi, na maendeleo ya miundombinu nchini. Chirchir alieleza kuwa AI inarahisisha ufanisi, kupunguza gharama, kuongeza ubunifu, na kuwezesha mipango inayotokana na uchambuzi wa data katika sekta ya ujenzi. Akizungumza kwenye kongamano hilo, Ka-

tibu Mkuu wa Ujenzi wa Umma, Joel Arumonyang, alisema AI ni muhimu katika kukabiliana na changamoto za upangaji miji. Aliwahimiza wataalamu kuachana na njia za kukabiliana tu na matakitizo baada ya kutokea, na badala yake kutumia AI kutabiri na kuzuia matatizo ya upangaji. “Kwenye miji kama Nairobi, lazima tubadilike na kuanza maendeleo ya kimkakati. AI inatupa uwezo wa kuchambua mitindo, kupanga ukungaji, na kufanya maamuzi bora ya miundombinu,” alisema Arumonyang. Mwenyekiti wa BORAQS, Mch. Silvester Muli, alibainisha kuwa wasanifu majengo sasa wanatumia zana kama MidJourney kutengeneza dhana za kimaono papo hapo kwa miradi. Muli alifafanua kwamba kwa kuandika tu maelezo mafupi yanayofafanua aina ya jengo, mtindo, vifaa, na kazi, AI huunda picha zinazosaidia kuanzisha mchakato wa ubunifu. “Sio kuhusu kubadilisha ubunifu, bali ni kuuboresha. Inatusaidia kuanza kufikiria haraka na kuchunguza uwezekano mpya wa miundo ambao hatungeweza kuzin-

gatia awali,” alisema. Bw George Ndege, Rais wa Chama cha Wasanifu Majengo wa Kenya (AAK), alitoa wito wa umoja na uwajibikaji wa pamoja katika kipindi cha mpito wa AI. “AI ipo na haitatoweka; lazima tuimiliki kama wataalamu. Lakini vilevile lazima tuhifadhi viwango vya maadili na uwajibikaji,” alisisitiza. Ndege aliongeza haja ya kuingiza AI katika mitaala ya vyuo na kuunda mifumo inayolinda maamuzi ya binadamu na uadilifu wa kitaaluma. Kongamano hilo lilijumuisha maonyesho ya moja kwa moja ya zana za AI ambazo tayari zinabadilisha usanifu na uhandisi. Ilibainika kwamba wahandisi wa miundo wanatumia AI katika programu kama Prota na Prokon kuchambua mizigo, kuiga vipengele vya kimuundo, na kuboresha uimara na usalama wa majengo. “Kile kilichokuwa kinachukua siku sasa kinachukua saa chache. Tunaweza kutoa miundo sahihi, salama, na yenye ufanisi kwa muda mfupi, jambo linalosaidia kuweka miradi kwenye ratiba na ndani ya bajeti,” alisema mhandisi mmoja. Mradi wa vijana wapunguza bei ya chakula cha samaki

Itakuchukua takriban dakika 23 kutoka mji wa Nyeri kufika katika kijiji tulivu cha Karurumo kilichoko Kiandu, katika Eneo Bunge la Tetu. Hakuna kitu cha kuvutia sana kuhusu jengo dogo lenye ukubwa wa mita za mraba 12 ambapo vijana watano wameanzisha shamba la kufuga nzi weusi (black soldier fly). Hata hivyo, ni matarajio ya kupunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa bei ya chakula cha samaki kwa wakulima wa samaki wa Kiandu ndilo linalofanya mradi huu uvutie. Wakulima wa samaki wa Tetu tayari wanaona mradi huu kama suluhisho la kipekee. Mradi huu unatarajiwa kutatua changamoto ya kupata chakula cha bei nafuu, ambayo imekuwa kikwazo kikubwa kwa zaidi ya wakulima 2,300 wanaojihusisha na ufugaji wa samaki katika kaunti hiyo. Matarajio yao si ya mbali na ukweli; utafiti wa kulinganisha wa mwaka 2018 kuhusu sekta ya ufugaji wa samaki ulionyesha kuwa wakulima wadogo wanakabiliwa na gharama kubwa za chakula. Kulingana na utafiti huo, chakula cha samaki kinachangia takriban asilimia 60-80 ya gharama zote za uzalishaji. Hali haijabadilika sana tangu 2018, kwani bei za sasa zinaonyesha kuwa gunia la kilo 50 la chakula cha samaki linagharimu kati ya Sh4,000 hadi Sh5,000. Bei hii huongezeka kwa Sh1,000-Sh2,000 ikiwa mtu ananunua chakula cha vifaranga. “Wazo letu lilizaliwa kutokana na juhudi za wakulima wa samaki kutafuta chakula cha bei nafuu lakini chenye ubora wa juu. Kwa sasa, changamoto

kubwa kwa wakulima wa samaki ni kupata chakula chenye protini ya juu, na kwa kuwa nzi weusi ana kiwango kikubwa cha protini, kuingia katika ufugaji huu kulionekana kama chaguo la asili kwetu,” alisema Charles Mwangi, mmoja wa wanachama watano wa kikundi cha kujisaidia cha Zabibu. Nzi mweusi (black soldier fly) anathaminiwa sana kwa uwezo wake wa kubadilisha taka za kikaboni kuwa mbolea tajiri inayojulikana kama frass akiwa katika hatua ya lava. Kwa upande mwingine, wafu-

gaji wa kuku, nguruwe, na samaki wanathamini sana lava zake kwa sababu zina kiwango kikubwa cha protini, hadi kufikia asilimia 45, hivyo kufanya ziwe chakula bora cha protini nyingi. Kikundi cha Zabibu kilianza mradi wa BSF mwanzoni mwa mwaka huu baada ya pendekezo lao la chakula mbadala cha samaki kupata ufadhili wa Sh450,000 kutoka Mpango wa Maendeleo ya Biashara ya Ufugaji wa Samaki (ABDP). Kikundi hiki ni miongoni mwa vikundi 42 vya ufugaji samaki kaunti ya Nyeri vilivyofaidi

kutokana na ruzuku ya Sh8.12 milioni iliyotolewa na ABDP na Mfuko wa Kimataifa wa Maendeleo ya Kilimo (IFAD) kwa Vikundi Vidogo vya Ufugaji Samaki (SAGs), Mashirika ya Usaidizi wa Ufugaji Samaki (ASEs), na Shule za Uwanjani za Ufugaji Samaki (AFSSs) ili kusaidia sekta hiyo kaunti ya Nyeri. Mwangi anasema kuwa kwa kutumia rasilimali hizo, waliweza kujenga jengo na pia kununua koloni ya kuanzia ya kilo tano za lava hai. Tulipowasili kwenye shamba, tulikuta wadudu hao wakiwa

katika hatua zote nne kwenye pembe nne za jengo la mbao. Nzi wakubwa wanahifadhiwa kwenye kiota cha wavu ambapo wanataga mayai. Katika hatua hii, Mwangi anasema, wanawalisha mchanganyiko wa molasses na maji. Anatumia kuwa nzi mmoja mzima anaweza kutoa kati ya mayai 320-620. Caroline Makena, mwana-chama mwingine wa kikundi, anasema kuwa mayai huchukua siku tano kuanziliwa na kuwa lava. Mchakato wa kulea lava hadi hatua ya pupa — ambayo ndio chakula cha protini wanachohitaji — huanza kwa kuhamisha lava kwenye mabeseni yenye taka za shambani au taka za jikoni. Ili kurahisisha kuoza kwa haraka, Makena anasema wanakata taka za shambani vipande vidogo. Alibainisha kuwa ili kuhakikisha kiwango kizuri cha ukauaji, joto katika jengo lazima lidumishwe kwenye nyuzi 27 za Celsius. “Tunaweza kupata taka kutoka mashamba yanayozunguka mradi huu. Kwa upande wa taka za jikoni, tumeshirikiana na wakazi ambao wanatuletea kwa malipo,” alisema Makena. Vijana hawa wanakadiria kuwa mradi wao una uwezo wa kuzalisha takriban kilo 2,000 za lava kwa mwezi. Kabla ya mwisho wa mwaka huu, wanatarajia kuzalisha angalau kilo 36,000 za chakula. Mwangi anasema wameweka bei ya kuuza lava kati ya Sh300-500 kwa kilo, bei ambayo ni nafuu kwa wakulima wengi. “Kati ya viambato vyote vina vyotumika katika utengenezaji wa chakula cha samaki, protini ndiyo ghali zaidi. Ukichukua chakula kavu na ukachanganya na lava waliokauka au lava hai, utakuwa umetatua tatizo hili kwa kiwango kikubwa,” anasema Mwangi.

Maafisa wa nyanjani Kaunti ya Kitui wapata pikipiki 21 kuzuru wakulima

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Kitui imesekabidhi pikipiki kwa maafisa wa ugani wa kilimo katika juhudi za kuboresha huduma kwa wakulima — hatua muhimu kuelekea mageuzi ya kilimo katika kaunti hiyo. Gavana Dkt. Julius Malombe, alipokuwa akikabidhi pikipiki 21 kwa maafisa hao katika hafla iliyofanyika nje ya ofisi yake mjini Kitui, alisema kuwa mpango huu unalenga kuimarisha huduma za ugani na ushauri wa kilimo, ili kuhakikisha wakulima wanapata kwa wakati teknolojia za kiasa za kilimo na mbinu bora. Dkt. Malombe alisisitiza kwamba kaunti imejizatiti kuendeleza sekta ya kilimo, kwa lengo la kuboresha usalama wa chakula na kuinua maisha ya wakazi wa kaunti ambao wengi wao wanategemea kilimo kama chanzo kikuu cha mapato.

Alisema utoaji wa pikipiki hizo umefanyika kwa ushirikiano na Mradi wa Kitaifa wa Kuendeleza Minyororo ya Thamani za Kilimo (NAVCDP), ambao umelenga kuongeza uzalishaji, kuimarisha ushiriki wa wakulima sokoni, na kuchochea uongezaji thamani kwa wakulima wadogo. Utoaji wa pikipiki 21 umeongezwa idadi ya pikipiki zilizotolewa hadi sasa katika wadi 40 kufikia 78. Pikipiki hizi zinasaidia kurahisisha harakati za maafisa wa ugani 98. Gavana alisema pikipiki hizo siyo tu vyombo vya usafiri, bali ni zana za mageuzi. Alibainisha kwamba zimewezesha maafisa kuwafikia kwa urahisi wakulima mashinani, kutoa mafunzo,

na kushughulikia changamoto za kilimo kwa haraka. Ili kuhakikisha pikipiki zinatumiwa kwa ufanisi, maafisa walipitia mafunzo ya kina yaliyotolewa na Toyota Kenya kuhusu usalama barabarani, matengenezo, na uendeshaji kwa kuzingatia sheria. Maafisa pia walipokea mavazi kamili ya uendeshaji na zana ndogo za matengenezo. Pikipiki hizo zimehakikishwa chini ya sera ya pamoja iliyosajiliwa na Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Usafiri na Usalama Barabarani (NTSA). Dkt. Malombe aliongeza kuwa Wizara ya Kilimo imepanga kutoa mafunzo ya kila mwaka ili kuwapa maafisa marudio na kuhakikisha wanafuata kanuni za usalama barabarani. Kaunti pia imeweka mifumo thabiti ya ufuatiliaji na tathmini, ikiwemo kuripoti kasoro, uhakiki wa matumizi ya mafuta, na mgao wa mafuta kila robo mwaka.

Katika kijiji cha Kaplan-gau, kilichoko katika Tarafa Ndogo ya Marakwet Magharibi, Kaunti ya Elgeyo-Marakwet, kilimo cha mboga kinachoendeshwa na vijana kinaendelea kupata umaarufu kama mbadala wa kiuchumi kwa maendeleo ya vijijini. Kwa kutumia umwagiliaji mdogo, mbegu zenye mavuno ya juu, na uzalishaji unaoendeshwa na soko, wakulima vijana kama Christine Jephumba wanabadilisha jukumu la vijana katika mifumo ya chakula nchini Kenya. Akiwa na umri wa miaka 25 pekee, Christine amejijengea jina kama mmoja wa vijana wanaoendesha maendeleo ya kiuchumi vijijini kupitia kilimo cha kisasa cha mboga. Christine, ambaye ana diploma ya Usimamizi wa Biashara kutoka Chuo cha Ufundi cha Eldoret, alianza kilimo mwaka 2022 baada ya miezi kadhaa ya kutafuta ajira bila mafanikio. Alianza na mtaji wa Shilingi 5,000 aliyopewa na mama yake, ambayo alitumia kununua mbegu za sukuma wiki, spinachi na nyanya, pamoja na vifaa vya msingi vya umwagiliaji. “Niliamua kuanza na robo ekari nyuma ya nyumba yetu. Nikiwa na ndoo, jembe, na ndoto kubwa, nilianza kupanda mboga ambazo familia yetu ilitumia. Baada ya mavuno ya kwanza, nilipata zaidi ya Shilingi 12,000 kutoka kwa wateja katika soko la Kapsowar,” anasema Christine huku akitabasamu. Leo, Christine anasimamia shamba la mboga lenye ukubwa wa ekari moja ambalo linapelika bidhaa kwa hoteli tatu mjini Iten, shule za msingi mbili, na maduka kadhaa ya jumla. Pia ameajiri vijana wawili kutoka kijiji jirani kumsaidia shambani. Zaidi ya biashara, Christine sasa ni balozi wa kilimo kwa vijana kupitia kikundi cha Koibarak Youth Growers, ambacho kinakutanisha vijana kujifunza mbinu bora za kilimo, hasa kilimo cha asili na matumizi ya mbolea za mboji.

Kwa kutumia teknolojia rahisi kama umwagiliaji wa matone, mbegu bora, na uuzaji wa moja kwa moja, vijana hawa wanabadilisha taswira ya kilimo katika eneo hilo. Wakati ambapo vijana wengi nchini wanaendelea kuhamia mijini kutafuta maisha bora, hali ni tofauti kwa baadhi ya vijana

Unapopanga, nakili, na uuze ipasavyo, ukulima unalipa

katika Wadi ya Koibarak. Hapa, kilimo cha mboga kimekuwa taa ya matumaini kwa wale wanaochagua kubaki nyumbani na kujijenga kupitia kilimo. Christine Jephumba ni miongoni mwa vijana wanaoamua kubaki vijijini na kuwekeza katika kilimo cha mboga kama chanzo cha kipato na njia ya kuboresha maisha ya familia zao. Serikali ya Kaunti ya Elgeyo Marakwet, kupitia Idara ya Kilimo, imeanzisha mafunzo mbalimbali, kusambaza miche bora ya mboga, na kuwaunganisha wakulima na masoko. “Tumeona kwamba vijana wanapofaidika na kilimo, wanaacha kuhamia mijini. Wanawekeza nyumbani na kusaidia kukuza uchumi wa vijijini,” anasema Raymond Cheboi, Afisa Kilimo wa Tarafa Ndogo ya Marakwet Magharibi. Vikundi vya vijana kama Koibarak Youth Growers vimekuwa mfano wa mafanikio, vikihamasisha vijana wengine kuingia kwenye kilimo kwa pamoja, kujifunza kwa vitendo, na kuuza mazao yao kwa wingi kupitia ushirika. Hata hivyo, changamoto kama ukosefu wa mikopo nafuu, mabadiliko ya tabianchi, na bei zisizotabirika bado ni vikwazo. Lakini kwa vijana kama Christine, kilimo ni biashara inayohitaji mipango. “Ukiplan, ukaandika matumizi yako, na kuuza vizuri, kilimo kinakulipa,” anasema. Mboga zinazolimwa na vijana hawa ni pamoja na sukuma wiki, spinachi, nyanya, vitunguu, pili-pili hoho, na mboga za kienyeji. Hizi si tu kuongeza kipato, bali pia kuboresha lishe katika jamii. Viongozi mbalimbali wamepongeza juhudi za vijana hao, wakisema kuwa kilimo ni injini kuu ya maendeleo ya vijijini. Vijana hawa si wakulima tu — bali ni washirika wa maendeleo katika jamii zao. Kadri bustani za mboga zinavyoendelea kunawiri mashambani, ndivyo matumaini na mwelekeo mpya wa maendeleo ya vijana katika Elgeyo Marakwet unavyoimarika.

Akizungumza katika Kaunti ya Nyeri, Lindon alibainisha kuwa mamlaka hiyo imepokea ripoti nyingi kutoka kwa umma kuhusu mashirika ya kijamii yasiyo aminika yanayoendesha shughuli nchini. Alisisitiza visa vingi vya aina hiyo vingeelezewa kama matokeo ya kutokufanya uchunguzi wa awali. “Tunasema kwamba kufanya uchunguzi wa kina ni jambo la lazima kwa kila mtu. Ikiwa mtu anakumbana na hali ambayo ana mashaka nayo, hasa inayohusisha fedha nyingi, si gharama kubwa kupiga simu kwa mamlaka ili kujua kama shirika analotaka kushirikiana nalo limesajiliwa ipasavyo. Chama cha Wamiliki wa Hoteli na Wahudumu wa Chakula nchini Kenya (KAHC) kina-toa wito wa kuongezwa kwa uwekezaji na marekebisha ya sera katika sekta ya utalii. Hii inalenga kusaidia nchi kufikia lengo lake kuu la wageni wa kimataifa milioni tano kufikia mwaka 2027. Akizungumza katika Mkutano wa 21 wa KAHC uliofanyika Mombasa, wenyewe kaulimbiu “Kuelekea Milioni 5,” Mwenyekiti wa Kitaifa wa KAHC, Chris Musau, aliwahimiza wadau kuboresha utofauti wa bidhaa za utalii na kuenyeleza bidhaa maalum ili kuvutia soko pana zaidi. Alisisitiza haja ya kuimarisha sera na mifumo ya kisheria ya utalii ili kuendana na mwelekeo wa kimataifa unaoibuka. Kwa mujibu wa data kutoka Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Utalii, Kenya ilipokea watalii wa kimataifa milioni 2.4 mnamo 2024, ongezeko la asilimia 15 ikilinganishwa na mwaka uliotangulia. Vilevile, mapato kutokana na utalii yalipanda kwa asilimia 19.8, kutoka Shilingi bilioni 377.49 mwaka 2023 hadi Shilingi bilioni 452.20 mwaka 2024. Bwana Musau alihimiza serikali kutoa leseni zaidi kwa ndege za moja kwa moja kutoka Mombasa na Nairobi, akipinga dhana ya kulinda shirika la ndege la kitaifa, Kenya Airways, dhidi ya ushindani.

Aidha, alikiri kwamba hali za kisiasa zisizo na uhakika zinaathiri vibaya sekta ya utalii, akibainisha kwamba maandamano yanayojirudia yanaharibu mafanikio yaliyopatikana na kuathiri vibaya sifa ya nchi. Serikali ilihimiza kuingia kwenye mazungumzo na vijana wanaoandamana ili kushughulikia malalamiko yao, kwani biashara katika maeneo ya biashara za kati (CBD) ziko hatarini. “Serikali inapaswa kuketi na hawa vijana na kuzungumza nao, lakini huwezi kutumia nguvu, haiwezi kufanya kazi,” alisema, akiongeza kwamba wanapouza utalii wa nchi, wanaulizwa ku-

husu maandamano, lakini hawana majibu. Alisisitiza kwamba wadau wanahitaji utulivu kwani nchi ina uwezo mkubwa wa kuvutia watalii zaidi, na sifa yake haipaswi kuharibiwa. Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa KAHC, Mike Macharia, alisema kwamba chachu kuu ya kufikia watalii milioni tano ni utalii wa Mikutano, Motisha, Mikutano Mikuu, na Maonyesho (MICE). Alihimiza serikali kuomba kuwa mwenyeji wa mikutano zaidi ya kimataifa na kujenga kituo kingine cha mikutano ili kuimarisha Kituo cha Kimataifa cha Mikutano cha Kenya (KICC) jijini Nairobi.

“Tunaweza kufanya ushirikiano wa sekta binafsi na serikali (PPP), na tuna eneo kubwa sana katika Bomas of Kenya, ambapo tunaweza kujenga kituo cha kisasa cha mikutano. Tunaweza kuweka miundombinu ya kuingia na kutoka,” alisema Macharia. Aidha, alihimiza serikali kukomesha mzunguko wa vurugu kupitia mazungumzo na vijana ili kuelewa changamoto zao na kupata suluhu ya pamoja ya kuendeleza nchi. “Hatuwezi kuendeleza uchumi bila vijana. Tunahitaji vijana wachukue nafasi wakati sisi tunaondoka. Tunahitaji utulivu na amani nchini,” alisema.

ili kupunguza utegemezi kwa vyanzo vya mbali. Afisa huyo aliongeza kuwa jitihada hizi zote ni kuhakikisha wakulima wanapata thamani ya fedha zao na waweze kugharamia mahitaji mengine, ikiwa ni pamoja na kulipia karo za watoto wao. Aliwahimiza wakulima wa kaunti kuanzisha vizalizi zaidi, akiwahakikishia kuwa serikali ipo tayari kuwasaidia. Kiruja alisema kuwa kaunti ilikuwa na vizalizi vinane kwa wakati huo, na serikali ya kaunti imejitolea kuvisaidia na kuvifuatilia ili kuhakikisha uzalishaji wa vifaranga bora kwa wakulima. “Serikali tayari imeanzia soko la samaki wabichi huko Chuka ambapo wakulima wanaweza kuuza samaki wao waliokomaa,” alisema Kiruja. Alisema kuwa mpango huu unaonyesha dhamira ya serikali ya kaunti katika kukuza ufugaji endelevu wa samaki na kuboresha maisha ya watu kaunti nzima.

KVDA yafufua bwawa kubwa Baringo ambalo limekwama kwa miongo kadha

Mamlaka ya Maendeleo ya Bonde la Kerio (KVDA) inakarabati miundombinu ya maji katika kaunti za Baringo na Elgeyo Marakwet ili kuimarisha usalama wa chakula na maji. Miongoni mwa miradi iliyotambuliwa kwa utekelezaji na ukarabati ni Bwawa la Chemeron na Bwawa dogo la Chemorongion katika Baringo, pamoja na Bwawa la Kabuswa na Bwawa dogo la Chemugul katika Keiyo. Huko Baringo, KVDA itatumia Shilingi milioni 400 kufufua Bwawa la Chemeron, ambalo lilianzishwa mwaka 1986 lakini likasimama muda mfupi baada ya kuanza kutumika.

Katika kipindi cha miaka 39 ya kutelekezwa, bwawa hilo — lililokuwa limebuniwa kuwa na uwezo wa kuhifadhi maji kiasi cha mita za ujazo 750,000 — lililwanufaisha wakazi walioko juu na chini ya mtiririko katika Baringo Kusini. Akizungumza wakati wa kuzindua rasmi kazi za ukarabati, Katibu Mkuu wa Idara ya Ardhi Kame na Maeneo Yenye Ukame na Maendeleo ya Kikanda, Kello Harsama, alieleza matumaini kwamba mradi huo utaboresha maisha ya kiuchumi na kijamii ya wakazi wa eneo la bonde hilo. Bw. Harsama, ambaye alifanya ziara ya kina ya kukagua miradi ya maji katika kaunti hizo mbili, aliwahakikishia wakazi kuhusu dhamira ya serikali ya kurejesha bwawa hilo kubwa
