kuwa mfumo wa vocha ya kielektroniki (E-voucher) umeweze-sha serikali kusajili zaidi ya wakulima milioni 6.5 kote nchini. Mfumo huo wa ubunifu wa E-voucher pia umeweze-sha usambazaji wa zaidi ya magunia milioni 14.7 ya mbolea ya bei nafuu tangu mwaka wa 2022, na kushusha bei ya gunia la kilo 50 kutoka KSh7,500 hadi KSh2,500. Aliongeza kuwa uwekezaji katika kilimo umechangia kushuka kwa bei ya pakiti ya unga wa mahindi wa kilo mbili kutoka KSh250 hadi KSh150, jambo ambalo limeongeza usalama wa chakula nchini na kupunguza uagizaji wa mahindi kwa asilimia 66. “Tuna matumaini kuwa mwaka huu tutaziba pengo hilo na pengine kuondoa kabisa uagizaji wa mahindi kutoka nje,” alisema. Katika sekta ya mifugo, Waziri aliripoti kuwa uzalishaji wa maziwa umeongezeka na kufikia lita milioni 5.4 mwaka 2024. Uuzaji wa mifugo na bidhaa zake—ikiwa ni pamoja na nyama, maziwa, na mifugo hai—umevuka mipaka na kufikia masoko ya Oman, Uganda, Seychelles, Falme za Kiarabu na maeneo mengine.

Alisema kuwa Wizara inaendeleza kwa kiwango kikubwa programu za uzalishaji wa mifugo na kuongeza tija, ikiwa ni pamoja na huduma za upandikizaji wa mbegu (AI), na ukuzaji wa malisho na lishe bora ya mifugo. “Mpango wetu wa Kitaifa wa Chanjo ya Mifugo unalenga kuchanja ng’ombe milioni 22 na kondoo na mbuzi milioni 50 dhidi ya magonjwa kama vile Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) na Peste des Petits Ruminants (PPR) kufikia mwaka 2028. Tayari, wanyama milioni 3.7 wamechanjwa kwa kutumia chanjo zinazotengenezwa hapa nchini na Taasisi yetu ya Uzalishaji Chanjo za Mifugo ya Kenya (KEVEVAPI),” aliongeza. Kuhusu mnyororo wa thamani wa chai, Waziri alieleza kuwa uzalishaji wa kitaifa umeongezeka kutoka kilo milioni 535 mwaka 2022 hadi kilo milioni 598 mwaka 2024, huku mapato yakiongezeka kutoka KSh bilioni 138 hadi KSh bilioni 181. “Tunakuza miche ya chai inayostahimili mabadiliko ya tabianchi na kuongeza thamani kupitia viwanda vidogo, hasa vinavyoungwa mkono na biashara ndogo na za kati (MSMEs),” alisema.

Pia alisisitiza hatua kubwa zilizopigwa katika sekta ya miwa, akieleza kuwa uzalishaji wa sukari katika viwanda umeongezeka kutoka tani 796 mwaka 2022 hadi tani 832 mwaka 2024. “Ili kuongeza tija zaidi, tumeanzisha viwanda vipya 27 vya kusindika miwa. Nimejitolea kushirikiana na waziri mwenzangu wa nishati kuhakikisha kuwa viwanda vya sukari vya Kakamega na maeneo mengine vinaweza kuuza umeme kwa gridi ya taifa, kwani vina uwezo wa kutoa mchango mkubwa,” Waziri alieleza. Ili kuimarisha uzalishaji wa mafuta ya kupikia, Waziri alieleza kuwa serikali inasambaza

mbegu za alizeti na miche ya nazi kwa wakulima kote nchini.

Alisema kuwa kutokana na juhudi hizo, ardhi inayotumika kwa kilimo cha mimea ya mafuta imeongezeka kutoka hekta 60,000 mwaka 2022 hadi hekta 114,000 kwa sasa, hatua inayoliweka taifa karibu na lengo la kupunguza uagizaji wa mafuta ya kula kwa asilimia 50 kufikia mwaka 2027-2028. Waziri alieleza kuwa serikali inatekeleza miradi mbalimbali katika maeneo ya Magharibi mwa Kenya kama vile Mradi wa Kibiashara wa Ufugaji Kenya (KeLCoP), Mpango wa Ustahimilivu wa Mifumo ya Chakula (FSRP) miongoni mwa mingine.

iwa katika serikali zilizopita. Rais Ruto amejiri idadi kubwa zaidi ya walimu kuwahi kuajiriwa na anaendelea kujitolea kuwajiri wengi zaidi,” alisema Bitok. “Tunaandaa mfumo, kwa kushirikiana na wadau wote, ambao utahakikisha kila mwalimu anayehitimu kutoka chuo kikuu au chuo cha ualimu anapokea barua ya ajira moja kwa moja. Ni mpango wa muda mrefu, lakini tumejizatiti kuhakikisha unatekelezwa,” aliongeza. Alifafanua zaidi kuwa, “Tunaelewa kuwa hili ni jukumu lenye gharama kubwa, lakini tumeamua kuhakikisha kuwa kila mwalimu aliyepata mafunzo anaajiriwa moja kwa moja—kama ilivyo kwa wanajeshi na maafisa wa polisi wanaoajiriwa mara tu baada ya mafunzo. Hatutaki kuona walimu waliohitimu wakiteseka vijijini kwa sababu ya ukosefu wa ajira.” Kuhusu miundombinu ya shule, Katibu huyo alisema kuwa serikali itajenga maabara 1,600 kote nchini kati ya Julai na Desemba mwaka huu kama sehemu ya dhamira yake ya kutoa elimu bora.

Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) has simplified the PAYE return filing and payment process to align with feedback received from taxpayers.

The simplified PAYE return aims to improve the user experience for all including the public, not-for-profit and private sector.

The simplified process facilitates employers to file returns relevant to their categories of employees. It also integrates with government human resource information system, IFMIS and CBK through API integration for seamless filing and payment of PAYE, Affordable Housing Levy, NITA Levy and other labour related deductions and contributions.

KRA wishes to inform all employers that the full roll out to file using simplified excel PAYE return will be effective from **1st July, 2025**. Employers should access and use the simplified excel PAYE return and sample CSVs from the KRA Website: link <https://www.kra.go.ke/publications>, to align their payroll processes.

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Wanafunzi 1.2m wa darasa la 9 kujiunga na shule ya upili 2026

Wanafunzi wote wa Darasa la 9 wapatao milioni 1.2 kwa sasa watahamia shule za sekondari ya juu mnamo Januari 2026. Wizara ya Elimu inaandaa miongozo na taratibu kuhakikisha kwamba kila wanafunzi wa Darasa la 9 anapata fursa ya kujiunga na shule ya sekondari ya juu. Katibu wa Elimu ya Msingi, Prof. Julius Bitok, alisema: “Tunawapa watoto wote nafasi. Bila kujali alama wanazopata katika Darasa la 9, kila mmoja lazima aendelee na masomo katika shule ya sekondari ya juu ili kusomea masomo waliyoyachagua.” Aliongeza, “Hili litakuwa jambo gumu zaidi katika utekelezaji wa mfumo wetu wa Elimu ya Msingi ya Umahiri (CBE), tukizingatia kuwa ni mara ya kwanza kuwahamisha wanafunzi wote milioni 1.2 wa Darasa la 9 kwenda sekondari ya juu.” Alikuwa akizungumza katika eneobunge la Turbo alipokuwa akizindua miradi ya miundomsingi katika shule mbalimbali. Wanafunzi wa Darasa la 9 kwa sasa wanafanya maombi ya kujiunga na shule za sekondari ya juu ambazo zimegawanywa katika makundi manne:

Kundi la 1 linajumuisha shule 255 za zamani za kitaifa, Kundi la 2 linajumuisha shule 755 za zamani za mikoa, Kundi la 3 lina shule 1,300 za zamani za kaunti, kundi la 4 lina shule 7,250 ambazo ni za zamani za kutwa na zile za kaunti ndogo. “Wizara iliamua kuanza mchakato huu mapema ili kuwapa wanafunzi wa shule ya msingi ya chini nafasi ya kuchagua njia zao za taaluma na makundi ya masomo kwa msaada wa walimu wao kwa ushauriano na wazazi, ili ifikapo Jan-

uari 2026, wote milioni 1.2 wawe wamepata nafasi katika shule ya sekondari ya juu,” alisema. Katibu huyo alisema serikali imetumia mfumo wa kiteknolojia kuruhusu shule zote za sekondari kupakia mahitaji yao. “Wanafunzi na wazazi wao, kwa msaada wa walimu, wanaweza kuingia kwenye tovuti: selection.education.go.ke kuchagua njia zao za masomo na mchanganyiko wa masomo,” alisema PS. Kama sehemu ya juhudi zake za kuhakikisha elimu bora, serikali itajenga maabara 1,600

kote nchini kati ya Julai na Desemba mwaka huu, aliongeza. Prof. Bitok alisema wizara itaendelea kushirikiana na Hazina ya Kitaifa kuhakikisha kwamba fedha za elimu zinatengwa mapema na kufikishwa kwa wakati, japokuwa kumekuwepo changamoto katika kutoa mgao wa fedha kwa shule kutokana na matatizo ya bajeti kutoka hazina kuu. “Serikali inafanya kila iwezalo kuhakikisha watoto wetu wanapata elimu bora. Wiki mbili zilzipita, tuliweza kutoa Shilingi bilioni 2 kusaidia shule katika uendeshaji wake,” aliongeza. Alisema wizara inaendelea kumimarisha Mfumo wa Usimamizi wa Taarifa za Elimu nchini Kenya, yaani KEMIS, ili kuhakikisha kila shule inapata ufadhili kulingana na idadi ya wanafunzi. Katibu huyo alisema maendeleo ya elimu yanahitaji juhudi za pamoja, na kwamba wadau wa sekta ya elimu wameendelea kuunga mkono juhudi hizo na hivyo kuchangia maendeleo ya sekta hiyo. Wadau hao ni pamoja na serikali kuu, serikali za kaunti, Hazina ya Maendeleo ya Maeneobunge (NG-CDF), wawekezaji katika elimu na sekta ya kidini miongoni mwa wengine. Alisema serikali imejitolea kuboresha miundomsingi katika shule za umma ili kuhakikisha wanafunzi wote wanasomakatika madarasa mazuri. “Wizara ya Elimu itashirikiana na wadau wote katika kisasaishaji wa shule. Elimu itaimarika sana iwapo itatolewa katika mazingira bora ya kujifunzia.

Wanafunzi wa STEM kusoma Hisabati za msingi, wengine kuchukua Hisabati muhimu

Shule za upili zita-Stoa aina mbili za Hisabati: moja kwa wanafunzi wanaoifuata njia ya Sayansi, Teknolojia, Uhandisi na Hisabati (STEM), na nyingine kwa wale wanaochagua njia ya sanaa, michezo, na sayansi za jamii.

Chama cha Taasisi ya Kuendeleza Mtaala Kenya (KICD), Prof. Simon Gicharu, alisema wanafunzi katika njia ya STEM watachukua hisabati za msingi, wakati wale walioko katika njia ya sanaa, michezo, na sayansi za jamii watachukua hisabati muhimu. Prof. Gicharu, am-

baye aliiongoza kundi la wanafunzi waliomaliza kutoka Shule ya Upili ya Murang'a katika ziara ya shule hiyo, alisema hisabati muhimu katika shule za upili itakuwa na nafasi muhimu katika kukuza uwezo wa wanafunzi wa kufanya mahesabu, kufikiri kwa kina, na kutatua matatizo. "Awali hisabati hai-

kuwekwa kuwa sharti katika shule za upili, lakini baada ya wadai kuomba somo hilo liwe mojawapo ya masomo ya lazima, KICD ilichukua hatua ya kuingiza hisabati na kuibuni katika aina mbili." Mwenyekiti alibainisha. Alieleza kwamba hisabati hasa inalenga nambari na algebra kama msingi wa kozi hiyo katika kukuza fikra za kihesabu na algebrai. "Pia inajumuisha vipimo vya kiasi mbalimbali, hasa hisabati ya kibiashara ambayo ni mu-

himu kwa unyumbufu wa maarifa ya kifedha katika maisha halisi," alisema Gicharu, ambaye pia ni mwanzilishi wa Chuo Kikuu cha Mount Kenya. Alibainisha kwamba baadhi ya dhana za jometri zipo kwa sababu si tu zinasaidia katika mahusiano ya nafasi bali pia katika ujuzi wa urambazaji, huku takwimu na uwezekano vikichukuliwa kuwa muhimu katika utafiti na kuelewa mienendo ya idadi ya watu na matukio ambayo ni muhimu katika kutatua matatizo ya kila siku.

Profesa aliongeza kwamba wanafunzi watapeleka fursa kupitia Mafunzo ya Huduma za Jamii (CSL) kuunganisha ujuzi mbalimbali na maelekezo pamoja na tafakari ili kuboresha uzoefu wa kujifunza, kuimarisha wajibu wa uraia na kuimarisha ushiriki wa jamii. "Hii itafanyika kupitia uzoefu wa kujifunza kwa makusudi ambao utawezesha wanafunzi kutumia maarifa, ujuzi, maadili na uwezo kutatua matatizo yaliyobainika karibu nao," alisema.

“Kila mwaka, sekta ya elimu pekee hutumia takriban miti milioni 10. Shule moja inaweza kuharibu hadi ekari 56 za msitu ili kukidhi mahitaji yake ya kupikia. Hili hal- iwezi kukubalika ikiwa tunamaanisha kuhusu uendelevu,” alisema Wandayi. Akinukuu takwimu kutoka Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Kimatibabu ya Kenya (KEMRI), Waziri huyo alisema uchafuzi wa hewa kutokana na kupikia husababisha vifo takriban 23,000 kila mwaka nchini Kenya, wakiwemo wapishi wa shule, wanafunzi na walimu. Mpango wa LPG kwa Taasisi za Elimu ni sehemu ya mpango mpana wa Kuongeza Matumizi ya Gesi ya Kupikia (ELUP), na unahusiana moja kwa moja na Ajenda ya Mageuzi ya Kiuchumi ya Kutoka Chini Kwenda Juu (BETA). Kulingana na Wandayi, mpango huu unaunga mkono malengo muhimu ya kitaifa na ki-

mataifa ikiwemo Lengo la Maendeleo Endelevu (SDG) namba 7 kuhusu nishati safi na nafuu, na SDG namba 13 kuhusu hatua dhidi ya mabadiliko ya tabianchi. “Hatuhimizi tu matumizi ya LPG, bali tunasisitiza matumizi salama, yanayozingatia kanuni, na endelevu,” aliongeza. Waziri wa Elimu Julius Ogamba alisema kuwa mpango huu tayari unanufaisha maelfu ya wanafunzi na wafanyakazi kwa kuondoa matumizi ya kuni hatari na kuleta nishati safi. Katika hotuba iliyosomwa kwa niaba yake na Katiibu wa Utawala katika Elimu ya Msingi, Florence Amoit, Ogamba alieleza kuwa zaidi ya asilimia 90 ya shule zinategemea kuni, hali inayochangia uharibifu wa misitu na hatari kubwa za kiafya. “Nishati safi si suala la mazingira tu, bali ni suala la heshima na ustawi wa jamii zetu za shule,” alisema Ogamba.

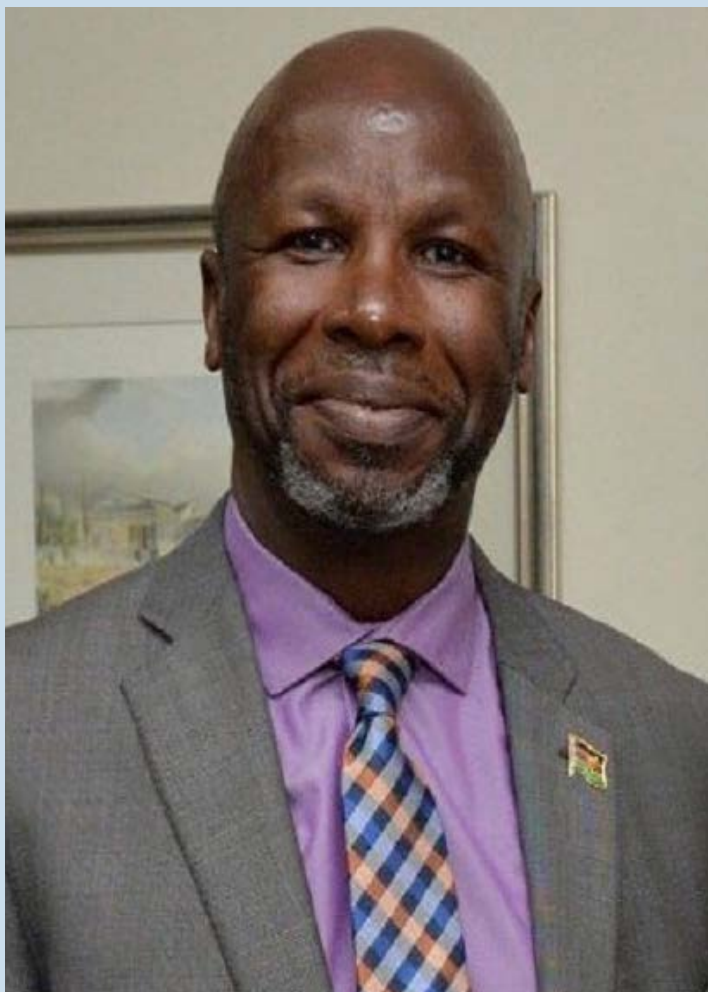

Muchiri shares significant milestones achieved between January and June 2025, offers insights into the PSC's strategic direction, and reaffirms the Commission's commitment to delivering a professional, efficient, and citizen-centric public service. He spoke with the Acting Director of the Government Advertising Agency, Michael Okidi.

Q: What is the mandate of the Public Service Commission?

Amb. Muchiri: PSC is an independent body established under Article 233 of the Constitution of Kenya, with the critical mandate of managing human resources across the public service and ensuring that the public service is professional, efficient, and citizen-centric.

We oversee the recruitment, career progression, performance, and exit of public servants. Our core functions are clearly outlined in Articles 234, 155(3)(a), 158(2)(3) and (4), 171(2), 230(2)(b), and 236 of the Constitution in addition to other functions provided in National legislation such as the Political Parties Act and the Independent Policing Oversight Authority Act.

Q: How does the Commission ensure citizens receive quality services?

Amb. Muchiri: At the heart of our mission is the citizens—the very reason we exist. We are driven by the goal of ensuring that every Kenyan receives quality, efficient, and responsive services when engaging with public institutions. We ensure merit-based recruitment of individuals with the right skills, qualifications, and mind-set to serve effectively.

To set the right foundation,

we have issued directives for mandatory induction programs for all new officers joining the public service. This process introduces them to the norms, culture, and values of public service, aligning them with the principles of integrity, accountability, and professionalism from day one. We don't stop there—continuous in-service training is a cornerstone of our approach. By upskilling public servants through targeted training programs, we equip them to adapt to evolving demands and deliver exceptional services.

Additionally, we work closely with Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs) to streamline processes, enhance accountability, and ensure that public servants are not only competent but also committed to serving citizens with courtesy and efficiency.

Q: Amb. Muchiri, you have been at the helm of the Commission for the past three years. What can you say about your tenure so far?

Amb. Muchiri: Since taking office in late 2021, my tenure has been guided by a singular vision: to transform Kenya's public service into a dynamic, responsive, and inclusive institution. This was the pledge I made during my swearing-in, and every step

we have taken as a Commission has been geared towards that goal. I am proud to say we have made tremendous progress over the past three years, despite the complex and evolving landscape.

One of our key achievements has been the comprehensive review of human resource instruments and approval of organizational structures for over 100 MDAs, including 45 in 2025 alone. These reviews have enhanced operational efficiency and aligned public institutions with the government's priorities, ensuring they are fit for purpose.

We have also on-boarded and trained over 15,000 fresh graduates through the Public Service Internship Programme (PSIP), injecting new talent and energy into the public service while equipping young Kenyans with practical skills and experience.

We also rolled out a new programme – the Public Service Emerging Leaders Fellowship Program – a one-year transformative training initiative designed to develop a pool of high-achieving, ethical and effective leaders within the public service. Some 116 young entry level public servants have successfully gone through the programme and plans are underway to grow the numbers of public servants the programme can en-

list.

During the recent overnment transition period, the Commission played a pivotal role in ensuring a seamless handover. We issued two advisories to the executive on reorganization of government and also facilitated the creation of key offices and appointment of critical personnel, including Principal Secretaries, the Governor and Deputy Governor of the Central Bank, and other senior management roles. This smooth transition enabled the current administration to hit the ground running and deliver on its mandate.

Q: What were the findings of the HR audit the Commission undertook to rid the service of employees with fake certificates?

Amb. Muchiri: Our 2024 HR audit revealed a shocking reality: over 2,000 officers across 195 MDAs held forged certificates, with 1,280 verified as fake by the Kenya National Examinations Council (KNEC). Since January 2025, we have taken decisive action, including dismissal of 449 civil servants found with fake certificates. So far, 134 investigation files have been completed, and 33 cases are before the courts. To prevent future occurrences, we have reformed our recruitment process to require certificate authentication before any ap-

pointment is finalized. This proactive step ensures only qualified candidates enter the service.

EACC is also working to recover salaries and benefits fraudulently obtained by these officers. However, challenges persist—some officers resign before disciplinary action can be taken, attempting to evade accountability. To counter this, we have established a multi-agency task force to fast-track investigations, prosecutions, and recovery of lost funds. Our goal is clear: to uphold meritocracy, restore public confidence, and ensure the public service is staffed by competent and qualified professionals.

The prevalence of officers with fake credentials undermines the integrity of the public service and erodes public trust. It is a key reason for declining service quality, and addressing this menace remains a top priority for the Commission. I am happy to report that our collaboration with EACC and other stakeholders is helping to restore integrity and meritocracy in the public service, ensuring that only qualified individuals occupy public office.

Q: With the new Commissioners joining early this year, what has changed?

Amb. Muchiri: The arrival of our new commissioners and

a Commission Secretary/CEO has brought renewed energy and purpose to the Commission. I must commend their passion and deep understanding of what it takes to serve in the Commission. Their diverse expertise—spanning public administration, and human resource and performance management—has strengthened our oversight and strategic direction.

Q: What would you consider to be the key achievements of the Commission during the first half of this year?

Amb. Muchiri: The Commission has achieved remarkable progress in the first half of 2025, thanks to the commitment of our new Commissioners and the secretariat.

Key achievements include processing of applications, interviewing and recommending 109 persons for consideration for appointment to Principal Secretary positions by H.E. the President, finalizing the recruitment of 23 positions of Vice Chancellor/Deputy Vice Chancellor/Principal/Deputy Principal for Public Universities and conclusion of the recruitment process for 113 positions that were advertised in 2024 for various Ministries/State Departments.

We are current processing applications for 80 positions advertised in 2025, all

of which are scheduled for finalization within the first week of July, 2025 and, going forward, we have instituted measures to ensure no delays in processing applications for advertised positions.

We have also determined 113 county appeals and 33 State Corporations and Public Universities appeals within these six months, ensuring justice and fairness in public service matters.

On the policy front, the Public Service Commission (State Corporations and Public Universities Disciplinary Appeals Procedure) Regulations were approved by the National Assembly and published in February. Additionally, we developed the draft Affirmative Action Regulations, 2025, which underwent public participation to ensure inclusivity and is currently going through the legislative process.

All these efforts reflect the Commission's resolve to transform the public service to ensure stability in governance, seamlessness in management and leadership transition, and continuity in service delivery.

Q: What is the Commission seeking to address with the Public Service Commission (Affirmative Action) Regulations, 2025?

Amb. Muchiri: The Public

Service Commission (Affirmative Action) Regulations, 2025, represent a strategic effort to address persistent inequalities in public sector hiring and ensure the public service reflects the true face of Kenya, as mandated by the Constitution.

Current data paints a stark picture: only three MDAs have met the two-thirds gender principle, none have achieved proportionate ethnic representation, and the representation of persons with disabilities (PWD) stands at 1.8% against the constitutional target of 5%. These gaps highlight systemic inequities that we are determined to address.

The Draft Affirmative Action Regulations, 2025, seek to institutionalize equitable representation in the public service as required by Article 232(1) (g), (h) and (i) of the Constitution. Over a three-year period (2025/26–2027/28), these regulations will require implementation of affirmative action programs to ensure fair access to employment, promotions, and training for women, ethnic minorities, PWDs, and marginalized groups. Quarterly monitoring and evaluation reports will track progress, ensure accountability and measurable outcomes.

By addressing cultural and historical disparities, we aim to build a diverse, inclusive,

and citizen-centric public service that serves all Kenyans equitably and with dignity.

Q: In May 2025, you issued a circular to MDAs asking them to submit Annual Recruitment Plans by 1st July. Why is this important?

Amb. Muchiri: The Commission issues circulars from time to time to guide the public service on issues of human resource management and in response to emerging realities. We issued the circular on Annual Recruitment Plans as the past, haphazard planning and poor-quality indents led to inefficiencies, delays, and non-compliance. By requiring MDAs to submit their recruitment needs by 1st July each year, we will be able to develop an Annual Recruitment Calendar to guide our operations for each fiscal year.

The Annual Recruitment Plan brings several benefits: Ensures predictable workload management, allowing the Commission to plan and allocate resources effectively; Enhances transparency by making the recruitment process clear and structured; Enables timely and merit-based appointments by reducing delays and promoting equitable recruitment practices; and finally, it aligns hiring with organizational priorities and wage bill constraints, ensuring fiscal sustainability.

Q: Any notable challenges you have faced as a commission?

Amb. Muchiri: The persistent issue has been non-compliance with PSC decisions and circulars by a few MDAs, with delays in implementing promotions and attempts to challenge the Commission's authority. We are addressing this through sanctions, sensitization workshops, and stronger enforcement mechanisms.

Wage bill pressure remains a concern, with nine MDAs over-established and 154 officers serving beyond the 60-year retirement age in 2025, thereby straining fiscal sustainability. Diversity gaps are also stark—only about 17% of MDAs meet ethnic representation standards, and PWD representation lags at 1.8% against the 5% constitutional target.

The proliferation of fake certificates continues to undermine public trust. Institutions cite budget constraints in finalizing certificate authentication. We are engaging these entities to ensure conclusion of the HR audit. Additionally, overstaying officers, often

backed by some HR heads, resist transfers, disrupting mobility. We have tackled these challenges through payroll cleansing, certificate verification, and affirmative action programs. However, systemic gaps require continuous policy reviews and robust enforcement.

Q: What can Kenyans expect from the Commission going forward?

Amb. Muchiri: Going forward, Kenyans can expect rigorous implementation of reforms such as the Annual Recruitment Plans and Affirmative Action Regulations, 2025, to enhance transparency and inclusivity. We will intensify efforts to close diversity gaps, targeting the 5% PWD representation goal and equitable ethnic and gender balance.

Wage bill sustainability will be prioritized through workload analysis and payroll cleansing. The new Strategic Plan 2025–2029 which we will shortly be launching – together with a new Service Charter – will integrate emerging technologies like Artificial Intelligence to modernize service delivery and demonstrate commitment to service excellence.

We are expecting an enhanced budgetary allocation under the values and governance framework to enable us to undertake robust programmes to ensure compliance with the values under Articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution from the current 42% to 70% in five years. This will help to realize the much-desired value-laden, merit-based, and citizen-centric public service.

Q: What is your closing message for Kenyans?

Amb. Muchiri: My message to Kenyans is one of optimism and shared responsibility. The Public Service Commission is unwavering in its commitment to building a professional, inclusive, and citizen-centric public service that upholds the values and principles of Articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution. Despite challenges, we are making significant strides towards a better public service.

I urge all Kenyans to embrace integrity, support our efforts to create a diverse and equitable workforce, and hold us accountable as we work tirelessly to ensure every citizen is served with dignity, respect, and excellence. Together, we can build a public service that truly reflects the aspirations of our great nation.

Kenya imeweka ajira kuwa kiini cha mkakati wake wa maendeleo ya kitaifa. Akizungumza wakati wa Mkutano wa Shirika la Kazi Duniani (ILO) uliofanyika Geneva, Uswisi, Katibu Mkuu wa Idara ya Kazi na Maendeleo ya Ujuzi, Shadrack Mwandime, alisema kuwa serikali imechukua hatua mahsusi za kuchezea ajira katika sekta zote kupitia mbinu jumishi. Hii inajumuisha uwekezaji katika miundombinu, motisha mahususi kwa biashara ndogo, ndogo sana na za kati (MSMEs), pamoja na upatikanaji mpana wa mikopo kupitia Hazina ya Hustler. Alibainisha kuwa serikali inaendelea kuendesha ukuaji wa uchumi kwa kuunda nafasi za ajira kwa vijana, hasa kupitia Mpango wa Nyumba za Bei Nafuu, ambao ta-

yari umezalisha zaidi ya ajira 244,232 katika sekta ya ujenzi. Akijibu ripoti ya Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa ILO, Gilbert F. Houngbo, wakati wa ufunguzi wa mkutano huo, Katibu huyo alikaribisha mada ya ripoti ya mwaka huu, akisema inaligan-gana kwa karibu na malengo ya Ajenda ya Mageuzi ya Ki-uchumi ya Chini kwenda Juu (BETA) ya serikali ya Kenya. Alisema kuwa BETA inazingatia kukuza uchumi jumishi na endelevu kupitia ajira yenye tija na haki ya kijamii. Katibu huyo aliongeza kuwa Kenya imeimarisha usimamizi wa uhamiaji wa wafanyakazi kupitia utekelezaji wa Mkakati wa Usimamizi wa Uhamiaji wa Kazi, unaolenga kukabiliana na ukosefu wa ajira kwa vijana na kutolingana kwa ujuzi nchini. Mkakati huu unahusisha mikataba ya ajira baina ya nchi, mafunzo ya awali kabla ya kuondoka nchini, na huduma

za kuwawezesha wahamiaji kurejea na kujiimarisha. “Hatua hizi zimechangia pakubwa katika kulinda na kuongeza tija kwa wafanyakazi wahamiaji wa Kenya,” alisema. Aliripoti kuwa Kenya imeharakisha kuingiza katika sheria za kitaifa mikataba ya ILO iliyoridhiwa. “Hii inajumuisha mabadiliko ya hivi karibuni ya Sheria ya Ajira, Sheria ya Taasisi za Kazi, na Sheria ya Usalama na Afya Kazini, ambazo sasa zimeambatana na mfumo wa kisheria wa nchi unaolenga masuala mapya ya kazi zenye hadhi,” alisema. DENIAL OF MARKET ACCESS TO INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDERS (ISPs) BY REAL ESTATE DEVELOPERS AND RESIDENTIAL ESTATE MANAGEMENT

The Competition Authority of Kenya is established under the Competition Act CAP 504 Laws of Kenya (the Act). The Authority's mandate is to promote and safeguard competition in the national economy and to protect consumers from unfair and misleading market conduct, including sanctioning against foreclosure of competitors.

It has come to the Authority's attention, through market surveillance and numerous consumer complaints, that property developers and estate managers are signing exclusive contracts with specific Internet Service Providers (ISPs) and restricting competing firms from offering alternative services.

The Authority wishes to notify parties engaging in such practices that:

- Section 21(1) of the Act** prohibits undertakings from engaging in conduct that has the intention or effect of preventing, distorting or lessening competition in the trade of goods or services in Kenya. This includes parties in a vertical relationship like an undertaking and its suppliers and/or customers.
- Section 21(3)(e) of the Act** makes it illegal for undertakings to limit or control market access, technical development or investments.
- Section 21(3)(f) of the Act** prohibits undertakings from applying dissimilar conditions to equivalent transactions with trading parties, thereby placing them at a competitive disadvantage.

Parties are cautioned that exclusive dealings, including those entered into by certain ISPs and real estate developers/estate managers, deny Kenyan consumers choice of services that meet their specific needs, contrary to the Constitution of Kenya and the Act.

This conduct by ISPs denies consumers the benefits of competition which include fair pricing, enhanced service quality, and innovative solutions. Further, foreclosing competitor ISPs from accessing certain markets risks creating monopoly-like enterprises in the affected estates.

Undertakings that infringe the Act risk being penalized up to 10% of their preceding year's gross annual turnover in Kenya. For criminal prosecutions, they face fines of up to Ksh10 Million and imprisonment for a maximum of five (5) years, or both.

THEREFORE, property developers, real estate managers and ISPs engaging in exclusive internet service provision agreements that have anti-competitive effects are hereby directed to:

- Cease engaging in this exclusive conduct and prevent its recurrence; and
- Facilitate entry of competitor ISPs in their developments

Wafugaji katika Kaunti ya Narok hawatuipeni tena ngozi na mahewa ya mifugo, shukrani kwa mradi unaoahidi kuongeza kipato katika hali zote za hewa. Uanzishwaji wa kiwanda cha ngozi cha Mamlaka ya Maendeleo ya Ewaso Nyiro Kusini (ENSDA) umekuwa suluhisho lililosubiriwa kwa muda mrefu na wafugaji hao. Serikali iliwekeza Shilingi bilioni 1.1 kujenga na kukitayarisha kiwanda hicho ambacho sasa kimekuwa mkombozi kwa wafugaji waliokuwa wakikumbwa na madhara ya mabadiliko ya tabianchi kwa muda mrefu. Kwa mujibu wa Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Kukabiliana na Ukame (NDMA), takriban mifugo milioni 2.61 waliangamia katika kaunti kame na nusu kame kote nchini Kenya kufikia Machi 2023 kutokana na ukame. Hii ilikuwa pigo mara mbili kwa wafugaji ambao walipoteza mifugo wao na pia kipato walichotegemea kutokana na uuzaji wa mifugo au mazao yake. Hata hivyo, hali hiyo imebadilika. Kiwanda hicho kilichoanza kufanya kazi miaka mitano iliyopita na kuzinduliwa rasmi na Rais William Ruto mnamo Mei 2025, kina uwezo wa kuchakata zaidi ya tani milioni 2.4 za ngozi na mahewa kila mwaka. Kime-wapa wafugaji soko la moja kwa moja, tofauti na awali walipolazimika kutupa bidhaa hizi au kuziuzia kwa bei ya hasara. Afisa Mkuu Mtendaji wa ENSDA, Ngala Oloiptip, alisema katika mahojiano kuwa kiwanda hicho

kinapata malighafi kutoka kwa jamii za wafugaji wa Kimaa-sai walioko maeneo ya jirani. Oloiptip aliongeza kuwa uwezo wa uzalishaji wa kiwanda hicho umeongezeka kutoka futi za mraba milioni 1.2 hadi futi za mraba milioni 2.4 za ngozi kwa mwaka. Alisema upanuzi huo unalenga kupunguza utegemezi wa bidhaa za ngozi zinazoagizwa kutoka nje na unatarajiwa kuunda takriban ajira 500 za moja kwa moja na zaidi ya ajira 1,000 zisizo za moja kwa moja. “Kiwanda chetu kwa sasa kinatumika ipasavyo. Tupo katika hatua ambayo tunaweza kusema kwa kujiamini kuwa tunaweza kujitegemea.

mifugo iliyotiwa alama huuzwa kwa bei ya chini ikilinganishwa na ile ya mifugo isiyo na alama. Mary Kipai, mfugaji kutoka Loita na mtengenezaji wa mapambo ya shanga, alisema kiwanda hicho kimekuwa baraka kwa jamii ya Maa ambao zamani walikuwa wakitupa ngozi na mahewa msituni ambako wanyama wa porini walikuwa wakiila. “Sasa tunapata thamani ya ngozi na mahewa kwa kuwa tuna soko la moja kwa moja la kuuza. Hata mifugo wetu wanapokufa kwa magonjwa au ukame, mkulima hapotezi kila kitu kwani ana soko tayari la kuuza ngozi,” alisema. Emily Kipila, mfanyabiashara wa shanga, alisifu kiwanda hicho akisema kimebore-sha uchumi wa watu wa eneo hilo kwani vijana wasio na ajira wamepata nafasi za kazi, za kitaaluma na za vibarua. “Kiwanda kimeleta matumaini kwa jamii. Vijana waliokuwa hawana kazi sasa wanapata riziki kupitia sekta hii. Wamerudi nyumbani kuwasaidia wazazi wao wazee hivyo kuingia jamii,” alisema Bi Kipila. Oloiptip alisema kuwa sekta ya ngozi barani Afrika inaingiza hadi dola bilioni 100 kila mwaka, na Kenya inapaswa kunufaika na fursa hiyo ili kuinua uchumi wa wafugaji. Mkurugenzi wa Kanda ya South Rift katika Chama cha Kitaifa cha Biashara na Viwanda (NCCI), David Mpatiany, alisisitiza haja ya sekta ya ngozi kushirikiana na kiwanda hicho ili kuongeza uzalishaji na kukidhi mahitaji ya soko. “Wadau wote wa sekta ya ngozi wanapaswa kushirikiana kuhakikisha sekta hii inafanikiwa. Sisi kama wafanyabiashara tuko tayari kushirikiana na serikali kuhakikisha sekta ya ngozi inafanikiwa katika shughuli zake,” alisema.

Wanawake wa Kaunti ya Nandi. Mpango huu unabadilisha simulizi kwa kuwapa wanawake umiliki wa moja kwa moja wa miti ya kahawa, mafunzo ya kilimo bora, na fursa ya kufikia masoko. Muge, ambaye ndiye kinara wa mpango huo, alieleza kuwa katika mwaka wa majaribio (2023/2024), mradi ulisambaza zaidi ya miche 150,000 ya kahawa aina ya Ruiru 11 na Batian kwa wanawake 900 waliopangwa katika vikundi vya kusaidiana 63. Katika awamu ya pili iliyozinduliwa, miche mingine 500,000 ilisambazwa, na hivyo kufikisha jumla ya miche zaidi ya 650,000 na wanawake karibu 4,000 kunufaika katika kaunti nzima. Maeneo ya Nandi Hills, Aldai, Mosop, Chesumei, Emgwen, na Tinderet ni baadhi

ya maeneo yanayonufaika na mpango huu, ambapo Nandi Hills inaongoza kwa idadi kubwa ya washiriki, zaidi ya wanawake 1,000 wamepokea

miche na kupatiwa mafunzo. Mpango huu hauchangamshi tu mashamba ya kahawa yaliyotelekezwa, bali pia unawapatia wanawake mapato

ya uhakika kupitia vikundi kama Mogobich Progressive, Kapng’etuny Women na Kap-tis Women. Katika eneo la Aldai, kikundi cha Cheboite Women Empowerment Group hupanda kahawa pamoja na parachichi ili kuongeza kipato. Mradi huu haujakuwa tu wa majaribio, bali ni harakati inayozaa matunda—kwa maana halisi na ya kiuchumi. “Safari hii, kahawa ni yetu. Sisi wanawake hatupandi tu kahawa, tunapanda uhuru, tunabadili mizani ya mamlaka majumbani, na kufufua zao lililosahaulika,” alisema Sarah Jepkurui, wa kikundi cha Tulwop Ngetuny kilichoko Chesumei. Sheria mpya ya Ushirika inatarajiwa kuzinduliwa wakati wa Maadhimisho ya Siku ya Ushirika ya mwaka 2025, hatua itakayoweke alama muhimu katika maendeleo ya harakati za ushirika nchini Kenya. Mswada huu unalenga kutoa mfumo kamili wa kisheria kwa usajili, uongozi na usimamizi wa vyama vya ushirika, kwa madhumuni ya kuboresha uendelevu wao, ushindani, na mchango wao katika ajenda ya maendeleo ya kijamii na kiuchumi ya Kenya. Unatekeleza Kifungu cha 186 na Ratiba ya Nne ya Katiba kwa kubainisha kwa uwazi majukumu ya serikali ya kitaifa na za kaunti katika maendeleo ya ushirika. Ulinganifu huu unalenga kuratibu sekta hii ndani ya mfumo wa ugatuzi uliowekwa na Katiba ya Kenya ya mwaka 2010. 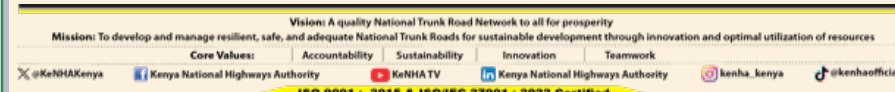

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS OF SPECIAL PURPOSE MOTOR VEHICLES

The Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) is a statutory body established under the Standards Act, Cap. 496, Laws of Kenya, and is mandated to provide conformity assessment based on Kenya Standards or approved specifications, among other services.

KEBS enforces KS 1515:2000 - Kenya Standard Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles, which prohibits the importation and registration of motor vehicles older than eight (8) years from the year of first registration. KS 1515:2000 further prohibits the importation and registration of Left-Hand Drive (LHD) vehicles. However, special-purpose vehicles that are over eight (8) years old and/or Left-Hand Drive (LHD) may be allowed entry into the country, subject to the fulfilment of the following conditions:

- Proof of customization
- Provision of a record of serviceability
- Evidence that the vehicle is no more than 20 years old from the year of manufacture.

Details regarding the waiver requirements for the importation of special-purpose vehicles are available on www.kebs.org, and all stakeholders are advised to review and familiarize themselves with these requirements prior to initiating any importation process. All importers of special purpose vehicles are encouraged to apply for and obtain the requisite waivers before shipping the said units into the country to avoid inconveniences.

ioni 206.77 zenye thamani ya Shilingi bilioni 70. Dkt. Rono aliongeza kuwa mageuzi haya pia yanahusisha minyororo mingine ya thamani ya kilimo kama vile kahawa, pyrethrum, parachichi, na miwa. Alitaja kuwa Kericho ni miongoni mwa kaunti 19 zitakazonufaika na miche zaidi ya 500,000 ya pyrethrum, miche milioni 1.2 ya kahawa, na aina 27 za miwa yenye mavuno mengi, inayohimili ukame, magonjwa na inayokomaa kwa haraka. Aidha, serikali inaunga mkono vyama 1,450 vya ushirika katika wadi mbal-

imbali nchini, ambako wakulima watapata miche iliyothibitishwa na ufadhili kwa ajili ya mazao yao. Dkt. Rono pia alitangaza uzinduzi wa vituo vya usambazaji wa mbolea hadi kwa wakulima, ambako watapata mbolea kwa bei nafuu pamoja na huduma za mafunzo ya ugani. Spika wa Kaunti ya Kericho, Dkt. Patrick Mutai, aliipongeza serikali kwa kuunga mkono minyororo mbalimbali ya thamani kama kahawa, pyrethrum, parachichi, na mageuzi katika sekta ya chai.

Akitoa maelezo kwa Kamati ya Bunge ya Kitaifa kuhusu Utekelezaji—inayooongozwa na Mbunge wa Budalangi (Mbunge) Raphael Wanjala—wakati wa ziara ya kukagua shughuli za SGR mjini Mombasa, Mku-

rugenzi Mkuu wa KRC (MD) Philip Mainga alisema kuwa mradi huo uko tayari kuzinduliwa.

Mradi ulioanzishwa Septemba 2022, ulipata ucheleweshaji kutokana na changamoto za utwaaji wa ardhi.

Baadaye, Wizara ya Uchukuzi ilitenga Sh1.1 bilioni kwa Tume ya Kitaifa ya Ardhi, kuwezesha utwaaji wa ardhi, na kutengeneza njia ya ukarabati wa njia ya Reli ya Mombasa Mita ya Kupima Reli (MGR) hadi Miritini.

Serikali kutumia Sh6B kujenga vyumba vya vya wanafunzi Makueni

Serikali itatumia zaidi ya Sh6b kujenga mabweni katika taasisi tatu ili kuhudumia wanafunzi katika Kaunti ya Makueni, Naibu Rais (DP) Profesa Kithure Kindiki amesema. Prof. Kindiki alisema kuwa serikali itajenga mabweni yenye vyumba 1,500 kila moja katika Taasisi ya Mafunzo ya Kiufundi ya Wote (WTTI) na Chuo cha Mafunzo ya Tiba ya Kenya (KMTC) – Tawi la Wote, kwa gharama ya Shilingi bilioni 3 kwa kila taasisi. Aidha, vitengo 300 vya mabweni vitajengwa katika Chuo cha Mafunzo ya Kilimo cha Mafunzo (ATC) kwa gharama ya Shilingi milioni 300. Alitoa kauli hiyo katika Uwanja wa Michezo wa Polisi mjini Wote, alipokuwa mgeni rasmi kwenye hafla ya kuchangisha fedha kwa ajili ya vikundi vya kina mama na vijana, yenye lengo la kuwawezesha kiuchumi na

kuboresha maisha yao. “Serikali itajenga mabweni ili kuhakikisha kuwa wanafunzi wanapata makaaizi bora na salama na waweze kusoma bila changamoto,” Prof. Kindiki aliwaambia wanawake na vijana waliohudhuria hafla hiyo. Ingawa Naibu Rais hakutaja tarehe ya kuanza kwa ujenzi huo, alisema vyuo vingine vya afya na taasisi za mafunzo ya kiufundi na ufundi stadi pia zitanufaika kupitia mpango huo wa serikali unaotekelezwa kote nchini. Wakati wa hafla hiyo, Prof. Kindiki alifichua kuwa vijana 70 kutoka kila wadi nchini wanaojishughulisha na biashara ndogo ndogo watapata Shilingi 50,000 kupitia Mradi wa Fursa kwa Vijana wa Kitaifa (NYOTA) ili kupanua biashara zao. “Tumeanza mpango wa kusaidia biashara ndogo ndogo mashinani kama useremala, uchocheaji, kinyozo na maduka ya vifaa vya umeme.”

Serikali yaonya dhidi ya unyanyasaji wa wazee

Serikali imewaonya Wakenya dhidi ya kukiuka haki za wazee, ikisisitiza kwamba yeyote atakayepatikana na hatia atachukuliwa hatua kali za kisheria. Katibu wa Usalama wa Jamii na Masuala ya Wazee, Joseph Motari, alisema kuwa Wizara ya Kazi na Ulinzi wa Jamii inaweka sera kali ili kuwalinda wazee dhidi ya aina zote za ukatili. Motari aliongeza kuwa serikali imeandaa Mswada wa Ulinzi wa Jamii ambao kwa sasa unajadiliwa katika Bunge la Taifa, na iwapo utapitishwa kuwa sheria, utawalinda wazee dhidi ya unyonyaji na ukatili. “Idara ya Ulinzi wa Jamii na Masuala ya Wazee inakamilisha Mswada wa Wazee, ambao unalenga kulinda haki zao kwa kina. Mswada huo umepitia mchakato wa ushirikishwaji wa umma na sasa unasubiri kuthibitishwa na kamati husika,” alisema. Katibu huyo alibainisha kuwa kupitia Mpango wa Kitaifa wa Kujikimu (National Self-Net Program),

serikali inaendelea kutoa msaada wa kijamii kwa makundi yaliyo hatarini. “Kufikia Mei 2025, Mpango wa Uhamisho wa Fedha kwa Wazee ulikuwa umefikia walengwa milioni 1.2,” alisema Motari, na kuongeza kuwa tangu mwaka wa 2023, serikali imepanua mpango huo hadi kuwafikia walengwa milioni 2.5. Aliyasema haya katika Taasisi ya Elimu Maalum ya Kenya jijini Nairobi, wakati wa maadhimisho ya Siku ya Uhamasishaji Dhidi ya Ukatili kwa Wazee Duniani. Kaulimbiu ya maadhimisho ya mwaka huu ilikuwa: “Kuawezesha Wazee, Kujenga Jamii Imara Isiyo na Ukatili.” Katika hotuba yake, Motari alifichua kuwa wazee katika jamii wamekuwa wakikumbwa na ukatili wa kimwili, kihisia, na kifedha kwa muda mrefu. “Ukatili dhidi ya wazee ni tatizo la dunia linalokua kwa kasi na ni suala linalotia wasiwasi mkubwa, likiwaathiri mamilioni ya watu. Ukatili huu hujitokeza kwa njia mbalimbali—ukatili wa kimwili, kihisia, kifedha na hata kutelekezwa,” alieleza.
