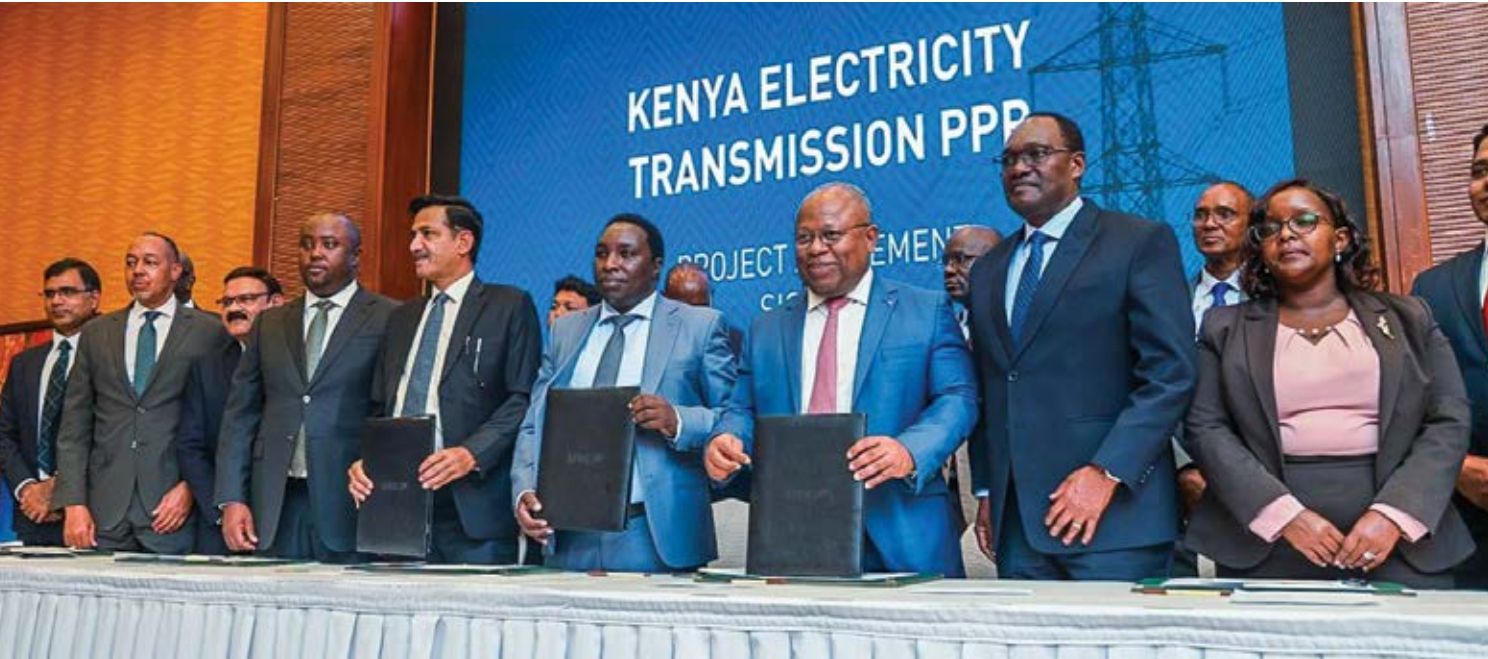

Wagunda, alisema kuwa kuwa na daftari kamili la mali zote za umma ni muhimu kwa matumizi bora ya rasilimali za serikali, kuongeza thamani, kuboresha utoaji wa huduma na kuimarisha utendaji wa kifedha. “Usimamizi makini wa mali na madeni ya umma huhakikisha manufaa ya juu zaidi ya kiu-chumi, kijamii na kimazingira kwa wananchi. NALM pia iliorodhesha magari ya serikali 25,081 yenye thamani ya jumla ya Sh bilioni 61.15 kutoka MDAs mbalimbali.

Katika kundi la Idara za Serikali, Idara ya Wanyamapori inaongoza kwa mali zenye thamani ya Sh milioni 159.93, ikifuatiwa na Jinisia (Sh milioni 137.41), Ikulu (Sh milioni 111.93), Biashara Ndogo na za Kati (Sh milioni 108.64), huku Idara ya Ugatuzi ikiripoti mali zenye thamani ya Sh milioni 105.12.

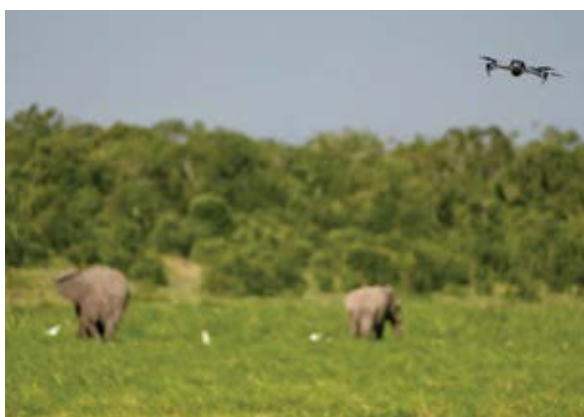

Kenya imechaguliwa kuwa mwenyeji wa Jukwaa la Kimataifa la Teknolojia ya Uhifadhi na Ndege zisizo na Rubani (Global Conservation Tech and Drone Forum – GCTDF 2026) baada ya Huduma ya Wanyamapori Kenya (KWS) kuthibitisha jukumu lake kama mshirika rasmi wa uhifadhi kwa tukio hilo la kimataifa, litakalofanyika Machi 2–6, 2026, jijini Nairobi na Konza Technopolis. KWS, ambayo ni wakala wa serikali ulioanzishwa chini ya Sheria ya Uhi-fadhi na Usimamizi wa Wanyamapori ya mwaka 2013, ina jukumu la kuhifadhi na kusimamia wanyamapori nchini Kenya kupitia ulinzi, utafiti, utekelezaji wa sheria, na ushirikiano na jamii na wamiliki wa ardhi. GCTDF 2026, yenye kaulimbiu “Teknolojia kwa Huduma ya Asili: Kulinda Wanyamapori, Kusaidia Watu, na Kurejesha Mifumo Ikolojia,” itawakutanisha walinzi wa wanyamapori, viongozi wa jamii, wataalamu wa teknolojia, watafiti, watunga sera na vijana kutoka barani Afrika na duniani kote. Jukwaa hilo litatoa nafasi ya kuchunguza jinsi teknolojia zinazoibukia kama ndege zisizo na rubani (drones), vihisi vya setilaiti, akili bandia (AI), mifumo ya taarifa za

kijiografia (GIS) na zana za kutumia takwimu zina-weza kutumika kulinda bayoanuai, kurejesha mifumo ikolojia iliyo-haribika, na kuimarisha ustahimilivu wa jamii. Katika taarifa iliyotolewa kabla ya tukio hilo, KWS ilisema ushirikiano wake na GCTDF unaendana na Mpango Mkakati wa KWS wa 2024–2028, unaosisitiza mbinu za uhifadhi endelevu, jumuishi na zinazozingatia jamii. Mali ya Sh3b ambayo haijadaaiwa yahusishwa na Kericho

Takriban watu binafsi na taasisi 30,000 wanaohusishwa na Kaunti ya Kericho wanakadiriwa kuwa na mali za kifedha ambazo hazijadaiwa, zenye thamani ya kati ya Sh bilioni 1.2 na Sh bilioni 3, kulingana na Mamlaka ya Mali za Kifedha Zisizodaiwa (UFAA). Taarifa hiyo ilitolewa wakati wa kliniki ya kuunganisha upya mali katika ngazi ya kaunti iliyofanyika katika Bustani za Uhuru, mji wa Kericho, ikiwa nisehemu ya mpango wa UFAA wa kusogeza huduma karibu na wananchi kwa lengo la kuharakaisha urejeshaji wa mali na kuboresha upatikanaji wa huduma za madai. Meneja wa UFAA anayesimamia Mahusiano na Wadau na Mawasiliano ya Shirika, Dkt Paul Muuya, alisema makadirio hayo yanatokana na rekodi za taasisi zinazotambua wamiliki wa mali kwa kutumia anwani za mwisho za miamala zinazohusishwa na Kaunti ya Kericho. “Kulingana na rekodi zilizowasilishwa na taasisi zinazowajibika kuripoti, tumebaini takriban watu binafsi na taasisi 30,000 wanahusishwa na Kaunti ya Kericho ambao wana mali za kifedha zisizodaiwa. Ingawa salio la kila mmoja linatofautiana pakubwa, jumla ya thamani inakadiriwa kwa tahadhari kuwa kati ya Sh bilioni 1.2 na Sh bilioni 3,” alisema Dkt Muuya. Alieleza kuwa urejeshaji wa mali zisizodaiwa una umuhimu mkubwa katika ngazi ya kaya na uchumi kwa ujumla,

akibainisha kuwa fedha zinaporejeshwa kwa wamiliki halali huingizwa tena katika uchumi wa ndani kupitia matumizi ya kawaida, elimu, huduma za afya na uwekezaji. Kwa kawaida, mali za kifedha zisizodaiwa hutokana na kutokuwepo kwa miamala kwa muda mrefu katika vyombo vya kifedha. Mara tu muda huo unapozidi viwango vilivyowekwa kisheria, mali hutambuliwa kuwa zimelala (dormant) na taasisi husika hutakiwa kukikabidhi kwa UFAA ili zihifadhiwe kwa niaba ya wamiliki. Mali hizo ni pamoja na amana za benki zisizotumika, mishahara na ujira ambao haujalipwa, gawio na hisa ambazo hazijadaiwa, mafao ya pensheni, malipo ya bima, amana za huduma za umma, na hundi za benki ambazo hazijawahi kukombolewa. Mamlaka ya Mali za Kifedha Zisizodaiwa ilianzishwa chini ya Sheria ya Mali za Kifedha Zisizodaiwa ya mwaka 2011, na ni shirika la serikali chini ya Hazina ya Kitaifa lenye jukumu la kupokea, kulinda na kuunganisha upya mali zisizodaiwa na wamiliki au wanufaika wake halali. Mamlaka ilianza kutekeleza majukumu yake kikamilifu mwaka 2015 na inajikita katika haki ya kikatiba ya umiliki wa mali, kuhakikisha kuwa umiliki unalindwa bila kujali kupita kwa muda au mabadiliko ya taasisi zinazohifadhi mali hizo. Dkt Muuya alisisitiza kuwa taasisi za kifedha na wahifadhi wengine wa mali wanawajibika kisheria kubaini akaunti zilizolala na kuwasilisha

mali husika kwa UFAA kila mwaka, huku Serikali ikifanya kazi kama Mdamini tu kwa niaba ya wamiliki wa mali na wanufaika wao. Katika mahojiano na Shirika la Habari la Kenya (KNA), Dkt Muuya alieleza kuwa aina mbalimbali za mali hufikia hadhi ya “zisizodaiwa” baada ya vipindi tofauti vilivyobainishwa kishe-ria. Akaunti za benki hutangazwa kuwa hazijadaiwa baada ya miaka mitano ya kutotumika, gawio na hisa baada ya miaka mitatu, mishahara isiyolipwa baada ya mwaka mmoja, na hundi za benki baada ya miaka mitano, kisha mali hizo kuhamishiwa kwa Mamlaka. Katika ngazi ya kitaifa, UFAA kwa sasa inasimamia mali za kifedha zisizodaiwa zenye thamani ya takriban Sh bilioni 101. Hii inajumuishwa zaidi ya Sh bilioni 41 taslimu na takriban hisa bilioni 1.9, zinazokadiriwa kuwa na thamani ya Sh bilioni 60 kulingana na bei za soko za sasa. “Kliniki ya Kericho ni sehemu ya mkakati wa kitaifa wa kuwafikia wananchi uliopangwa mahsusi kupunguza gharama za miamala kwa wadai, ambao awali wengi wao walilazimika kusafiri hadi Nairobi ambako UFAA ina ofisi yake pekee ya kimwili,” alisema Dkt Muuya. Aliongeza kuwa Mamlaka inapanga kupanua mpango huo hadi kaunti nyingine, zikiwemo Kakamega na Bomet, kama sehemu ya juhudi endelevu za kuboresha upatikanaji wa huduma za urejeshaji wa mali kote nchini. Kupitia mfumo wa huduma zote kwa kituo

kimoja uliotumika wakati wa kliniki hiyo, wadai waliweza kuthibitisha umiliki wa mali, kubaini taasisi zilikoanzia mali hizo, kupata nyaraka muhimu na kukamilisha mchakato wa madai kwa msaada wa mawakili, Mahakama na Ofisi ya Mdamini wa Umma, bila gharama yoyote. Kwa wadai binafsi, Kitambulisho cha Taifa kinahitajika. Madai yanayowasilishwa kwa niaba ya wamiliki waliofariki yanapaswa kuambatanishwa na Cheti cha

Kifo na nyaraka halali za urithi. Taasisi zilizojaliwa kama kampuni, makanisa, shule na vyama vya ustawi zinatakiwa kuwasilisha uthibitisho wa usajili na vitambulisho vya maafisa walioidhinishwa. Dkt Muuya aliwahimiza wananchi kutumia njia za kidijitali, zikiwemo msimbo wa USSD *361#, tovuti ya UFAA na jukwaa la e-Citizen, ili kuthibitisha hali ya mali zao kabla ya kufika ana kwa ana katika kliniki au ofisi za Mamlaka.

WHO yatoa ICU kwa hospitali ya Jaramogi Oginga Odinga

Wakazi wa Kisumu na wagonjwa katika Ukanda wa Ziwa watanufaika na huduma za rufaa za dharura zilizo za haraka na salama zaidi baada ya Hospitali ya Mafunzo na Rufaa ya Jaramogi Oginga Odinga (JOOTRH) kupokea ambulansi ya kisasa iliyo na vifaa kamili vya kuokoa maisha kutoka Shirika la Afya Duniani (WHO) kwa ushirikiano na Wizara ya Afya. Ambulansi hiyo ni miongoni mwa magari 14 ya dharura yaliyotolewa na WHO kwa hospitali saba za rufaa za kitaifa pamoja na Kituo cha Kitaifa cha Kukabiliana na Dharura, kama sehemu ya mageuzi yanayoendelea katika sekta ya afya chini ya mpango wa Huduma ya Afya kwa Wote (UHC). Afisa Mkuu Mtendaji (CEO) wa JOOTRH, Dkt Joshua Clinton Okise, alielezea gari hilo kama “chumba cha wagonjwa mahututi kinachosafiri,” kikiwa na vifaa vya kuokoa maisha vya kiwango cha ICU vina vyowezesha timu za kitabibu kuimarisha hali ya wagonjwa mahututi na kuwasafirisha huku wakiendelea kuwapatia huduma ya hali ya juu. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi katika hospitali hiyo, Dkt Okise alisema ambulansi hiyo itapunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa ucheleweshaji katika mwitikio wa dharura na kupunguza rufaa hatari shi kwenda hospitali za mbali kama Hospitali ya Kitaifa ya Kenyatta (KNH) na Hospitali ya Mafunzo na Rufaa ya Moi (MTRH). “Ambulansi hii si gari la kawaida; ni ICU kamili inayosafiri. Inatuwezesha kuwarejelea wagonjwa mahututi kwa usalama na heshima huku tukidumisha msaada wa hali ya juu wa kitabibu katika safari nzima,” alisema Dkt Okise. Alibainisha kuwa msaada huo umefika wakati muafaka kufuatia kuinuliwa kwa hadhi ya hospitali hiyo kuwa hospitali ya kitaifa ya mafunzo na rufaa, hatua iliyosababisha ongezeko

kubwa la idadi ya wagonjwa na ugumu wa visa vinavyoshughulikiwa. Dkt Okise aliongeza kuwa ambulansi mpya tayari imeanza kupunguza mzigo wa rufaa, huku wagonjwa wengi zaidisasa wakihudumiwa ndani ya hospitali hiyo. “Pale ambapo rufaa hazivezi kuepukika, wagonjwa sasa wanaweza kuhamishwa katika mazingira yaliyodhibitiwa na yenye vifaa kamili, jambo linaloongeza kwa kiasi kikubwa nafasi zao za kupona,” alisema. Zaidi ya JOOTRH, ambulansi hiyo itasaidia mwitikio wa dharura katika Ukanda mpana wa Ziwa na itaunganishwa katika Vituo vya Kikanda vya Uendeshaji na Uratibu wa Dharura, ikifanya kazi kwa karibu na hospitali za kaunti na zile za ngazi ya kaunti ndogo. “Ambulansi hii itahudumia eneo lote. Kupitia mifumo ya dharura iliyoratibiwa, wagonjwa mahututi wataunganishwa haraka na kituo kinachofaa zaidi bila ucheleweshaji usio wa lazima,” alisema Dkt Okise. Aliahidi matumizi na matengenezo sahihi ya gari hilo, akisisitiza kuwa litatumika kamilifu kwa dharura za kitabibu na kuendeshwa na wahudumu waliopata mafunzo maalum. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Fedha na Utawala

Lengo letu ni kuhakikisha wagonjwa wanaweza kupata huduma ya juu hapa

wa JOOTRH, Evans Oloo, alielezea msaada huo kama nyongeza kubwa kwa uwezo wa hospitali hiyo katika huduma za dharura. “Tunaishukuru sana WHO kwa kutupatia ambulansi hii iliyo na vifaa kamili. Itaongeza kwa kiasi kikubwa uwezo wetu wa kushughulikia wagonjwa mahututi, hususan wale wanahitaji rufaa ya ngazi ya juu,” alisema Oloo. Aliongeza kuwa ambulansi hiyo ni muhimu sana katika kushughulikia rufaa tata, ikiwemo visa vinavyoweza kuhitaji uokozi wa anga au uingiliaji wa kitabibu wa hali ya juu. “Vifaa vilivyowekwa ni vya kiwango cha juu sana na vinafaa kwa usimamizi wa visa hatarishi wakati wa rufaa, jambo litakaloboreshwa kwa kiasi kikubwa usalama wa wagonjwa namatokeo ya matibabu,” alisema. THE SENIOR SCHOOL IN THE COMPETENCY BASED CURRICULUM
Senior School is the fourth level of Basic Education in the Competency Based Curriculum (CBC) that learners shall proceed to after the Pre-Primary School, Primary School and Junior School levels. The essence of Senior School is to offer learners a pre-tertiary/university/ pre-career experience in which the learners have an opportunity to choose pathways and tracks where they shall have demonstrated interest and/or potential at the earlier levels. Senior School comprises three years of education for learners generally in the 16-18 years age bracket and lays the foundation for further education and training at the tertiary level and the world of work. In the CBC vision, learners exiting this level are expected to be *engaged, empowered and ethical citizens* ready to participate in the socio-economic development of the nation.

At this level, learners shall take seven (7) learning areas as recommended by the *Presidential Working Party on Educational Reforms* (PWPER, 2023). These shall comprise four core learning areas namely: English, Kiswahili, Essential Mathematics/Core Mathematics and Community Service Learning (CSL). Learners will choose between Core Mathematics (for learners pursuing the Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics Pathway) and Essential Mathematics (utilitarian skills for non-STEM learners). The learner will select three learning areas depending on their career choice, aptitude, interest and personality with guidance by the career teacher at Senior School.

LEARNING OUTCOMES FOR SENIOR SCHOOL

By the end of Senior School, the learner should be able to:

1. Communicate effectively and utilise information and communication technology across varied contexts.
2. Apply mathematical, logical and critical thinking skills for problem solving.
3. Apply basic research and scientific skills to manipulate the environment and solve problems.
4. Exploit individual talents for leisure, self-fulfilment, career growth, further education and training.
5. Uphold national, moral and religious values and apply them in day-to-day life.
6. Apply and promote health care strategies in day-to-day life.
7. Protect, preserve and improve the environment for sustainability.
8. Demonstrate active local and global citizenship for harmonious co-existence.
9. Demonstrate appreciation of diversity in people and cultures.

Manage pertinent and contemporary issues responsibly.

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Makueni, kupitia Idara ya Kilimo, Mifugo na Uvuvi, imezindua Mradi wa Mifugo Ni Mali katika Kituo cha Mafunzo ya Kilimo cha Kwathoka (ATC) kwa lengo la kuimarisha ufugaji wa kuku katika eneo hilo. Mpango huo, unaotekelezwa kwa ushirikiano na Taasisi ya Kenya Commercial

Bank Foundation (KCBF), unalenga kuimarisha uzalishaji wa kuku kupitia mafunzo ya kina kwa wakulima, ushauri elekezi na ufuatiliaji wa karibu (coaching na mentoring). Tafadhali msikae nyumbani bila shughuli; ingieni katika biashara hii ili kujipatia kipato na kuunda utajiri,” alisema Naibu Gavana wa Makueni, Lucy Mulili, aliyefungua rasmi mradi

huo katika eneo la Kwathoka. Mulili aliwahimiza pia wanawake na watu wenye ulemavu kujihusisha na ufugaji wa kuku, akisema serikali iko tayari kuwaunga mkono na kuhakikisha wanafanikiwa katika biashara zao. Alifichua kuwa ufugaji wa kuku ndio shughuli ya mifugo iliyoenea zaidi katika Kaunti ya Makueni, ambapo takriban

asilimia 85 ya wakulima kulingana na takwimu za mwaka 2023 wanajishughulisha na ufugaji wa kuku. Naibu Gavana alisema hali hiyo inaashiria ongezeko la asilimia 55 tangu mwaka 2013, akibainisha mchango unaoongezeka wa sekta hiyo katika mapato ya kaya pamoja na usalama wa chakula na lishe. “Takwimu za Statistical Abstract zilizothibitishwa mwaka 2023 zinaonyesha kuwa sekta ndogo ya ufugaji wa kuku ilikuwa na thamani ya Sh bilioni 3.77, ikitegemezwa na kuku milioni 1.57,” alisema. Kwa mujibu wa Makubaliano ya Ushirikiano (MOU), KCB Foundation itaunga mkono ukuaji wa biashara ndogo na za kati kupitia maendeleo ya biashara kwa lengo la kuunda utajiri na ajira kwa vijana na wanawake. Serikali ya Kaunti itatoa huduma za ugani, msaada wa mifugo na upatikanaji wa miundombinu ya mnyororo baridi na utunzaji wa chanjo kwa wakulima wanaoshiriki, ili kuimarisha uzalishaji na udhibiti wa magonjwa katika ngazi ya mashinani. Meneja wa Rasilimali Watu wa KCB, Cleopas Ambira, alisema wanakusudia kuwaunga mkono wakulima kwa kuwafadhili na kuhakikisha wanaunda utajiri ili kuinua viwango vyao vya maisha. Ambira aliongeza kuwa ushirikiano wao na Serikali ya Kaunti pamoja na kampuni ya Kenchic utahakikisha wakulima wanaunganishwa na masoko, ili waweze kupata maeneo ya kuuza mazao yao na kufikia malengo yao.

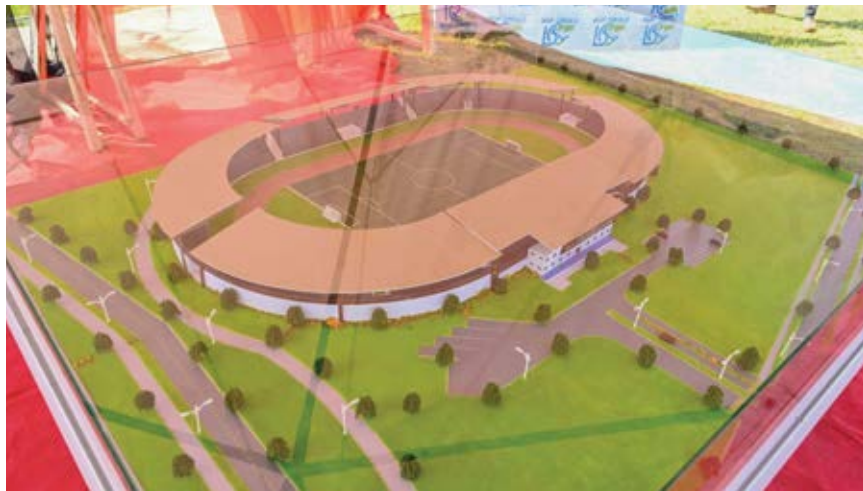

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to the Public Finance Management Act 2012 Section 73(5) and Reg. 174(1) of the Public Finance Management (National Governments) Regulations 2015 and the Audit Committee Guidelines issued by The National Treasury vide gazette Notice Vol. CXVIII – No. 40 dated 15th April, 2016; The Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions calls on all interested and suitably qualified persons to submit applications to serve as Chairperson of the Audit Committee.

JOB PURPOSE

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPOINTMENT

For appointment to this position a person should:

- Be a member of a recognized professional body in good professional standing;
- Progressive work experience of not less than ten (10) years expertise in legal practice, civil society's activities, audit, financial management, public procurement, risk management, or accounting at senior management level in a reputable organization;
- Not be a past or present employee of the ODPP, and shall not have served as an employee or agent of a business organization which has carried out any business with the ODPP in the last two (2) years;

The Audit Chairperson shall perform the following duties and responsibilities among others:

- Provide overall leadership to the Committee;

- Set the agenda of the Committee meetings in consultation with the other members and the Secretary of the Committee;
- Provide quarterly updates on governance, risk and control processes and any other related issues thereof to the DPP;
- Periodically arrange for review of the effectiveness and performance appraisal of the Internal Audit and Risk function;
- Lead the performance management of Audit and Risk Committee, including conducting periodic performance evaluations, providing constructive feedback, and developing individual and collective capabilities to enhance the Committee's overall effectiveness and strategic contribution;
- Conduct efficient committee meetings and guide its decision-making process;
- Encourage members to participate fully in committee deliberations;
- Harness the collective skills of the committee members;
- Be available for consultations with the DPP, the Head of Internal Audit and the external auditors; and

Baringo, tunu ya Kenya kwa wanyamapori, safari

Katika mwaka ambapo Kenya inaadhimisha miaka 62 ya uhuru chini ya kaulimbiu ya Utalii na Wanyamapori, maeneo machache yanachangia roho hiyo kwa uwazi kama Kaunti ya Baringo—eneo ambapo jiolojia, utamaduni, na wanyamapori vinapovutiwa katika onyesho lisilopatikana popote pengine duniani. Hapa, asili inaonyesha bu-rudani yake kila siku. Vumbi la mvuke linatoka ardhini, flamingo zinapaka upeo wa anga kwa rangi ya pinki, na milima ya kale husimulia hadithi za mamilioni ya miaka. Muunganiko huu wa nadra wa uzuri na umuhimu wa kisayansi ndio unao-sukuma Baringo kuelekea juhudi zake za kupata hadhi ya UNESCO Geopark. Kwenye Ziwa Bogoria, dunia inaonekana kama inapata pumzi. Geysers zinatokea kwa nguvu, chemchemi za moto zinachuruzika kando ya pwani, na wageni huk-usanyika karibu na Releng’ Springs kuchemsha mayai katika maji yaliyopashwa moto chini ya ardhini. Hewa imejaa kelele na sauti za flamingo—mijibizo ya mamia ya maelfu—wakicheza katika wingu linalobadilika la pinki juu ya ziwa. “Ni onyesho ambalo halizuii kuwa la kuvutia,” anasema Michael Kimeli, mlinzi wa Hifadhi ya Taifa ya Ziwa Bogoria. Kobe wanapita barabara ya Nakuru—Marigat kwa kasi yao yenye utulivu. Strauchi wanapita kwenye nyasi wazi, huku greater kudu na pundamilia wakiingiliana kwenye misitu yenye miiba. Migongano kati ya binadamu na wanyamapori ni nadra—isipokuwa kwa nyoka—shukrani kwa tamaduni ya

kuishi kwa amani ambayo imelelewa vizazi vingi. Kwenye pwani za mashariki za Ziwa Baringo, Ruko Conservancy inasimama kama ushuhuda wa kile jamii zinaweza kufanikisha wanapochagua amani badala ya migongano. Hapo awali waliokuwa wapinzani wa kishindo, Ilchamus wa Ruko na Pokot wa Komo-lion waliweka silaha zao chini na kuungana kulinda wanyamapori. Leo, wanashiriki kulea zaidi ya twiga 42 wa Rothschild, spishi iliyokuwa hatarini kutoweka. “Uhifadhi umeleta faida zaidi kuliko migongano yoyote,” anasema James Kipkurui, Meneja wa Hifadhi. Kenya Revenue Authority set to rebrand to ease tax compliance

Mamlaka ya Mapato Kenya (KRA) imo katika mchakato wa kubadilisha jina na kufanyiwa marekebisho ya kimfumo ili kuwa Huduma ya Mapato Kenya (Kenya Revenue Service), hatua kubwa ya kiasasi inayolenga kugeuza shirika hilo kutoka lenye mkazo wa utekelezaji wa sheria hadi kuwa taasisi inayoelekea huduma, ikizingatia urahisi wa utekelezaji wa kodi kwa watoaji kodi. Kamishna wa KRA anayesimamia Biashara Ndogo, Ndogo Zaidi na Watoaji Kodi Wadogo (MSMEs), Bw. George Obell, alisema kuwa mabadiliko yanayopendekezwa ya jina yanaakisi ajenda pana ya marekebisho inayolenga kuboresha utoaji wa huduma, kurahisisha mifumo ya kodi, na kupanua upatikanaji wa huduma za kodi kote nchini. “Tuko katika mchakato wa kubadilisha jina letu kuwa Kenya Revenue Service. Tunataka kuhakikisha tunatoa huduma bora na kurahisisha utekelezaji wa kodi kwa watoaji kodi. Hii ni safari, na haiwezi kufanyika mara moja,” alisema Bw. Obell. Alizungumza katika Kendu Adventist School of Medical Studies (KSMS) katika Kaunti ya Homa Bay, wakati wa maktaba ya umma iliyofanyika kama sehemu ya mpango wa elimu na uhamasishaji wa watoaji kodi unaoendelea wa Mamlaka. Bw. Obell alisema kuwa maoni yaliyochukuliwa kupitia utafiti wa kina wa watoaji kodi yanaonyesha kuwa Wakenya wengi wanataka kutimiza wajibu wao wa kodi, lakini mara nyingi wana-

chochewa na taratibu changamano, upatikanaji mdogo wa taarifa, na gharama kubwa za kusafiri hadi ofisi za KRA. “Watoaji kodi walisema, ndiyo, tunataka kufuata sheria na tunajua ni wajibu wetu wa kiraia, lakini tusaidie. Tuwape zana rahisi na tusifanye wasafiri umbali mrefu tu ili kutimiza wajibu wetu,” alisema. Kama sehemu ya mchakato wa kuwa taasisi inayolenga huduma, Bw. Obell alisema kuwa Mamlaka inapanua uwepo wake zaidi ya ofisi za kimwili kwa kuimarisha ush-

irikiano wa kijamii, kuunda ushirikiano na mashirika, na kuzindua suluhisho za kidijitali zinazowezesha watoaji kodi kutimiza wajibu wao kwa mbali. Aliongeza kuwa KRA pia inafanya kazi ya kuunganisha mifumo ya malipo ya kodi na majukwaa ya kifedha yanayotumika sana, ikiwemo huduma za simu za kifedha na programu za benki, ili kufanya malipo ya kodi kuwa rahisi na yanayopatikana kwa urahisi. “Iwapo ninatumia simu yangu kupokea malipo kupitia mobile money au benki na ninalipa

wasambazaji wangu kwa kutumia majukwaa hayo, basi pia ni lazima niweze kulipa kodi zangu kwa njia hiyo,” alisema. Kamishna alieleza kuwa marekebisho yanayoendelea yamebuniwa kuondoa viziwi vya kiserikali, huku pia kuanzishwa mipaka yenye msaada inayohamasisha utekelezaji wa hiari badala ya kutegemea tu hatua za adhabu. Aliongeza kuwa Mamlaka inatekeleza mfumo rahisi wa kuwasilisha taarifa kwa watoaji kodi wasio na mapato, unaojulikana kama nil returns, ili kupunguza mzigo wa utekelezaji wa kodi unaokabili mamilioni ya Wakenya. Wakati huo huo, KRA inaongeza mfumo wa kikumbusho kuhakikisha watoaji kodi wanasajili taarifa zao kwa wakati na kuepuka adhabu. Kutoshirikisha taarifa kunachangia adhabu ya asilimia 25 ya kodi inayotakiwa au Sh10,000, ile iliyokuwa kubwa zaidi, hata kwa watoaji kodi wasio na mapato. “Hatutaki kumshangaza mtu. Tutawakumbusha watoaji kodi kwa wakati kupitia barua pepe na ujumbe wa simu, kwa sababu tunaelewa watu wana majukumu mengi,” alisema Bw. Obell. Alijaribu kuwawezesha wananchi kuelewa kuwa si mawasiliano yote kutoka KRA yanayohusiana na utekelezaji wa sheria, baadhi ya ujumbe ni wa kijasusi au ni ujumbe wa heri wa msimu. Ndani ya Mamlaka, Bw. Obell alibainisha kuwa KRA imezindua mpango wa kina wa mabadiliko ya tamaduni kuelimisha upya wafanyakazi na kuandaa timu kwa mabadiliko ya kuwa taasisi inayolenga huduma.

Mapema siku hiyo, Wandayi alikuwa amezindua mradi wa last mile connectivity katika Kijiji cha Oriang katika jimbo hilo. Alisema mradi huu umebuniwa kuhakikisha kila kijiji na kila kaya katika Kaunti ya Homa Bay inapata umeme, jambo muhimu kwa maendeleo ya kitaifa. Wandayi aliagiza maafisa wa wizara na wawakilishi wa Kenya Power kuhakikisha mradi unakamilika ifikapo Februari 2026.

“Kaunti ya Homa Bay, kwa mara ya kwanza, imetengewa Sh2.1 bilioni kwa ajili ya kuunganisha kaya za mwisho. Jimbo la Kabondo Kasipul pekee limepokea takriban Sh200 milioni kufikia kaya 2,000,” alisema, akibainisha kuwa makusanyo makubwa kama haya hayajawahi kuonekana katika kaunti tangu uhuru.

Serikali imezindua rasmi Mpango wa Kitaifa wa Dharru wa Kuz Respondi Mvuke na Mafuriko ya Mafuta Baharini (National Marine Spills Response Contingency Plan), mfumo wa kina ulioundwa ili kuimarisha maandalizi na uwezo wa nchi kushughulikia kwa ufanisi uchafuzi wa mafuta na hidrokaboni katika maji ya Kenya. Kenya Roads Board (KRB) is a statutory body established by the Kenya Roads Board Act Cap 408A. The object and purpose for which KRB was established is to oversee the road network in Kenya and coordinate the maintenance, rehabilitation and development funded by the Fund and to advise the Cabinet Secretary responsible for roads on all matters related thereto.

The Board seeks to recruit a qualified, competent, experienced and result oriented person to fill the position of Director General-KRB 1.

Job Purpose

The Chief Executive Officer (Director General) is the accounting officer and is responsible for providing strategic leadership and overall management of the Kenya Roads Board.

- Foster innovation, good governance and integrity across all KRB operations.
- Serve as Secretary to the Board of Directors.
- Represent KRB in national, regional and international forums on road infrastructure and financing.

- Holds a degree in finance, accounting, law or engineering from a university recognised in Kenya or any other related field;

- Has undertaken a Leadership course from a recognized institution;
- Possesses knowledge and a clear understanding of the road sector;
- Demonstrates a clear understanding of local, national and international policies and regulatory frameworks governing the road sector;
- Satisfies the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

- Excellent negotiation and stakeholder engagement skills;

Kituo cha Kilimo na Sayansi ya Biolojia Kimataifa (CABI), kwa kuhirikiana na Serikali ya Kaunti ya Nakuru, kimezindua mpango mpana wa kukabiliana na magonjwa hatari ya viazi kupitia uangalizi ulioboreshwa, utafiti, na mafunzo kwa wakulima. Mpango huu unalenga Blackleg (*Pectobacterium* spp.) na Soft Rot (*Dickeya* spp.), magonjwa mawili ya bakteria yanayoenlelea kuhatarisha sekta ya viazi nchini Kenya na yanayokadiri kuweka maisha ya karibu wakulima milioni moja wa mitaa midogo kwenye hatari. Kulingana na Mwenyekiti wa Waziri wa Kilimo, Mifugo, Samaki na Huduma za Mifugo, Bw. Leonard Bor, mfululizo wa mkutano ya Afya ya Mimea (Plant Health Rallies – PHRs) uliolenga kusaidia wakulima wa viazi katika baadhi ya tarafa za kilimo cha viazi tayari umeanza kufanyika chini ya mpango huu. Bw. Alibainisha kuwa CABI, kwa kuhirikiana na Idara ya Kilimo ya kaunti, pia itapanga siku za mafunzo shambani na mafunzo maalumu kwa maafisa wa ugani na wakulima. “Hali hizi zitazingatia usimamizi mzuri wa magonjwa, utambuzi mapema wa maambukizi, umuhimu wa kutumia mbegu zilizothibitishwa, na uboreshaji

wa mbinu za kilimo ili kuongeza mavuno,” alisema Bor. Akizungumza wakati wa kufungua mafunzo kwa Maafisa wa Kilimo wa Tarafa, CECM alithibitisha dhahiri kwa Kaunti ya Nakuru ya kuimarisha ushirikiano na CABI ili kukuza kilimo endelevu, kuongeza uzalishaji, na kuboresha maisha ya wakulima wa viazi katika kaunti nzima. Juhudi za uangalizi na ujenzi wa uwezo za CABI chini ya mpango huu hazizingatii Nakuru tu, bali zinahusisha kaunti nyingine zinazozalisha viazi kwa wingi, ikiwemo Elgeyo Marakwet, Meru, Narok, Nyandarua, na Trans Nzoia. Bw. Bor alibainisha kuwa ki-

kundi cha wanasayansi kutoka CABI kilifanya uchunguzi wa kina katika kaunti hizi ili kubaini na kuchora ramani ya ueneaji wa spishi za *Pectobacterium* na *Dickeya* zinazosababisha Blackleg na Soft Rot, pamoja na *Clavibacter michiganensis* subsp. *sepedonicus*, bakteria inayosababisha potato ring rot. TVET zote kutumia nishati ya jua kufikia Juni

Idara ya Serikali ya Elimu Iya Ufundi na Mafunzo ya Kitaaluma (TVET) imetangaza mpango wa kitaifa wa kushinisha mfumo wa jua katika taasisi zote 246 za mafunzo za umma kufikia Juni 2026, kupitia ushirikiano na Kenya Commercial Bank (KCB). Hatua hii ni sehemu ya marekebisho makubwa yanayolenga kupunguza gharama za uendeshaji, kudemisha umeme thabiti kwa warsha na maabara za kidijitali, na kuimarisha uimara wa taasisi kwa kukuza mazingira ya mafunzo yanayozingatia hali ya hewa na yanayopunguza uzalishaji wa kaboni. Akizungumza na waandishi wa habari baada ya ufun-guzi rasmi wa warsha ya ujenzi wa uwezo na Mkutano Mkuu wa Kenya Association of Technical Training Institutions (KATTI) uliofanyika Mombasa, Katibu Dkt. Esther Thaara Muoria, alisema mradi wa solarization utakuwa mabadiliko makubwa kwa sekta. “Hadi Juni 2026, taasisi zote za TVET zitasakinishwa mfumo wa jua. Hii itakuwa mabadiliko makubwa katika taasisi zetu mwaka ujao,” alisema Dkt. Muoria. Mpango huu, uliosawazishwa kupitia Makubaliano ya Ushirikiano (MoU), utaona nusu ya gharama za umeme za sasa za kila taasisi zikielekezwa kulipia mkopo wa KCB.

Kaunti ya Trans Nzoia inakaibuka kama mojawapo ya walionufaika wakubwa na Mradi wa Pili wa Uboreshaji wa Mabanda ya Hali ya Chini (KISIP2), mpango wa mageuzi unaounga mkono Idara ya Hali ya Makazi na Maendeleo ya Miji, Benki ya Dunia, Agence Française de Développement (AFD), na Umoja wa Ulaya. Kwa thamani ya zaidi ya Sh900 milioni katika miundombinu, KISIP2 inabadilisha mabanda ya miji zisizo rasmi kote Kitale. Barabara zimeboreshwa hadi kiwango cha bitumen, mistari mipya ya maji imewekwa, na taa za barabara za kisasa pamoja na taa za juu zimepandishwa. Pia vituo vya choo vimejengwa, vikileta heshima na usalama uliotarajiwa kwa wakazi. Kulingana na Mratibu wa Mradi wa KISIP2 Kaunti ya Trans Nzoia, Edith Baraza, lengo

ni rahisi lakini la kina: kuhakikisha mabanda ya miji yasiyo rasmi yanakuwa sehemu ambazo kila mkazi anaweza kuishi kwa heshima.

Mabanda matano—Kipsongo, Matisi, Tuwan, Mitume na Shanti—tayari yanahisi manufaa. Wanafunzi kutoka Kitale National Polytechnic wanasema kuwa taarifa bora za barabara na mwanga sasa zinawawezesha kusoma hadi usiku na kurudi nyumbani kwa usalama, tofauti kubwa na zamani. Wakazi waliolazimika kuhama ili kuruhusu kazi za mradi walisaidiwa katika mchakato huo. Licha ya usumbufu wa muda kwa makazi na biashara, wakazi wengi walitumia fursa hii kuanzisha miradi mipya. Kwa Wilberforce Nekoye wa Stabicha, Kata ya Matisi, mradi huu ulikuwa mabadiliko makubwa. Akihitaji kuhama ili kuruhusu ujenzi wa barabara, aliomba mkandarasi kuweka

baadhi ya udongo wa chini kwenye kipande chake kidogo cha ardhi. Kwa hiyo, alianza kutengeneza matofali. Akitumia sehemu ya fedha alizopokea kwa ajili ya kuhamishwa, alikodisha vijana watano ku-saidia. Ndipo alipotengeneza matofali 12,000. Akiyauza kwa Sh15–Sh20 kila moja, alipata takriban Sh180,000, na akabaki na zaidi ya Sh150,000 baada ya gharama. Kwa yeye, mradi huu ulikuwa “baraka mara mbili”—barabara mpya hadi nyumbani na kipato kilichomwezesha kumelisha watoto wake watatu na

kupanua biashara ya familia. Peter Mabonga pia alipata fursa isiyotarajiwa. Awali alikuwa na wasiwasi kuwa hatapata kazi za ujenzi kutokana na ushindani mkali, lakini alijaribu na kupata nafasi ya wiki mbili. Alipogundua kuwa mkandarasi anahitaji mahali pa kuweka udongo wa chini, aliwashawishi familia yake kuruhusu kwenye ardhi yao. Akitumia mshahara kutoka kwa kazi hiyo ya muda mfupi, alikusanya marafiki kuanza kutengeneza matofali. Kwa wiki mbili, walitengeneza matofali 20,000. Licha ya changa-

moto za kupata kuni, aliweza kuyakaanga na kuuza kwa takriban Sh300,000, akibaki na Sh270,000 baada ya gharama. Mabonga alisema alipata zaidi ya angepata kutokana na kazi ya muda peke yake, akisema mradi huu ni “baraka mara tatu”—ajira, mtaji wa kuanzisha biashara, na miundombinu bora. Muuzaji wa chakula Mary Wachira pia alipata mabadiliko. Ingawa biashara yake ilipunguza kutokana na kazi za barabara, aliendelea kutumia fedha za urahisishaji. Wakati mashine nzito zafika, aliona fursa mpya: kulaidia wafanyakazi wa ujenzi. Biashara yake ilikua haraka alipokuwa akisambaza chai, mandazi, chapati, githeri na ugali. Baadaye, aliwapa ajira zaidi ya vijana 25 kusambaza chakula kwenye maeneo ya ujenzi. Kwa barabara, maji na mwanga ulioimarishwa kuongeza biashara za eneo, sasa anapanga kufungua mgahawa mkubwa zaidi. Katika kambi ya Shanti, kanisa la Rev. Lucy Waitthera pia lilinufaika. Kwa kuwa hapa kuwa na choo kwa wafanyakazi mwanzoni mwa ujenzi, timu ya usalama wa mazingira ilifika kanisani, likiwa na choo kisasa.

Ambitious date palm project set to transform Kenya's arid lands

Serikali imezindua mpango mkubwa wa kuanzisha sekta ya miti ya tarehe yenye thamani ya mabilioni ya shilingi katika mikoa ya kame na nusu kame (ASALs) nchini Kenya, ikionyesha mwelekeo wa kimkakati kuelekea kilimo cha ardhi kavu huku nchi ikitafuta kufungua uwezo mkubwa usiotumika wa maeneo yanayounda asilimia 83 ya eneo lote la nchi. Mpango huu ulipata mwendo zaidi wakati wa ziara ya ngazi ya juu kwenye Kutch Farm huko Kibwezi, Kaunti ya Makueni, iliyoongozwa na Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Mamlaka ya Kilimo na Chakula (AFA), Dr. Bruno Linyiru, Chaiman wa Baraza la Magavana na Gavana wa Wajir, Ahmed Abdullahi, pamoja na timu za kiufundi kutoka KEPHIS na KALRO. Ujumbe huo ulitembelea aina zinazofaa za miti ya tarehe kutoka India na Israeli kama sehemu ya juhudi kubwa za serikali kuharakisha kuingizwa kwa Kenya kwenye mnyororo wa thamani ya tarehe duniani. Katika shamba hilo, maafisa waliona miti ya tarehe iki-toa hadi kilogramu 200 kwa kila mti na kupitia mzunguko mzima wa uzalishaji kuanzia uchaguzi wa mimea ya kiume na kike, uchavushaji wa kudhibitiwa, umwagiliaji, kuvuna hadi kuongeza thamani, ikionyesha ahadi kubwa ya kibiashara kwa ASALs nchini Kenya. Hatua hii inafika kwa wakati muhimu, huku mabadiliko ya tabianchi yakiendelea kuathiri kilimo kinachotegemea mvua, ikisisitiza haja ya mifumo ya uzalishaji yenye uimara inay-

ofaa hali za ASALs. Kihalisia, tarehe ni bidhaa yenye thamani ya mabilioni ya dola, inayotawaliwa na nchi kama Misri, Saudi Arabia, Iran, Iraq, Algeria na UAE, ambazo hali ya joto na ukame wa kiwango cha chini wa unyevunyevu inalingana na mikoa ya kaskazini na mashariki ya Kenya. Licha ya faida hii ya asili, Kenya ilizalisha kilogramu 1,100 tu za tarehe mwaka 2023 na kutumia

zaidi ya Sh359 milioni kuagiza tarehe mwaka 2024, jambo linaloonyesha gap kubwa kati ya uwezo na uzalishaji. Maafisa wa serikali wanasema kuwa tofauti hii ni moja ya fursa zinazovutia zaidi za kuwekeza ASALs kama mashine za ukuaji wa kilimo. Ujumbe pia ulipitia mfano bunifu wa kilimo mchanganyiko ambapo miti ya tarehe inakuzwa pamoja na maembe, pixies, machungwa, kunde na mazao mengine ya bustani, kuongeza uzalishaji wa ardhi huku wakulima waki-pata mapato mchanganyiko. Kwa kaunti za ASALs ikiwa ni pamoja na Wajir, Mandera, Marsabit, Turkana, Garissa, Kitui, Tana River na Makueni, serikali inasema kilimo cha kibiashara cha miti ya tarehe kinaweza kudumisha mapato ya kaya, kupunguza hatari ya ukame na kufungua masoko mapya ya kuuza nje. Dr. Linyiru alisisitiza kuwa kukumbatia kilimo cha ardhi kavu sasa ni msingi wa mipango ya kitaifa. "Asilimia 83 ya ardhi ya Kenya ni kame na nusu kame. Ikiwa tunataka kufikia kikamilifu uwezo wetu wa kilimo, lazima tuchangie kwenye mazao yenye thamani kubwa, yanayostahimili hali ya tabianchi, yanayofaa kwa mikoa hii. Mpango huu unalingana na Ajenda ya Uongofu wa Kiu-chumi Kutoka Chini (BETA) na mfumo wa Baraza la Maendeleo ya Kaunti za Pwani (FCDC), unaolenga mazao ya thamani kubwa, yanayostahimili hali ya hewa. Aina za premium kama Medjool, zinazouzwa hadi Sh1,200 kwa kilo katika masoko ya nje, zinaweza kuzaa Sh3.4 hadi 4.4 milioni kwa hekta kwa mwaka mara zitakapokomaa.

Benki ya Dunia kurejesha mifumo ya ikolojia iliyoharibika Kaunti ya Makueni

Benki ya Dunia (WB) kupitia Mpango wa Kuboresha Huduma za Mito ya Maji Kenya (KEWASIP) itatumia Sh150 milioni kurejesha mifumo ya ikolojia iliyoharibika katika Kaunti ya Makueni, amesema Gavana wa eneo hilo, Mutula Kilonzo Jr. Mutula alisema maeneo yaliyoharibika yanayotarajiwa kurejeshwa ni pamoja na mifumo ya maji ya mito, kurejesha afya ya ikolojia, kuboresha usalama wa maji na kuimarisha uimara wa mabadiliko ya tabianchi. "KEWASIP, pamoja na marekebisho yetu ya kiutawala na miundombinu ya maji ya kaunti,

yataimarisha uwezo wetu wa kusimamia maji kwa njia endelevu," alisema Mutula baada ya kusoma hotuba yake wakati wa sherehe za Siku ya Uhuru zilizofanyika katika Shule ya Kikima Comprehensive. Aidha, aliwataka kila mkazi, kiongozi, mkulima, vijana na wanawake kuunga mkono juhudi za serikali katika kurejesha mandhari ya ardhi, kuhifadhi misitu na mifereji ya maji, na kufanya Makueni kuwa mfano wa maendeleo endelevu, yanayostahimili hali ya hewa kwa vizazi vijavyo. "Tunaposherehekea uhuru wa taifa letu leo, tuhakikishe pia kuwa tunaimarisha dhamira yetu: kulinda mandhari yetu,

kuhifadhi maji yetu na kujenga Makueni ambapo hakuna mtoto anayekosa maji, shamba linastawi na ambapo binadamu na mazingira vinaishi kwa ushirikiano," aliongeza. Gavana alisema Kaunti ya Makueni imepatiwa Sh130 milioni chini ya Mpango wa Usafi wa Maji na Usafi wa Mazingira (K-WASH) unaolenga kuboresha upatikanaji wa maji safi na usafi wa mazingira. "Maendeleo haya yametokana na kaunti kuandaa Mkakati wa Maji na Usafi wa Mazingira pamoja na Mpango wa Uwekezaji. Kampuni ya Maji Kibwezi pia imepatiwa Sh37 milioni za ziada kwa ubora wa taarifa za kifedha na imepokea maoni ya ukaguzi bila masharti," alisema Mutula. "Rasilimali hizi zitawekezwa katika kuboresha huduma za maji na usafi wa mazingira, ikiwa ni pamoja na kutangaza vijiji zaidi kuwa huru kutoka kwa utupa wa kinyesi, ili kuhakikisha usafi wa jamii unaoendelea," gavana alisisitiza.

Wakuzaji miwa nchini wananufaika na aina mpya ya mbegu za Kichina

Mwekezaji mmoja wa Kichina nchini Kenya yuko kwenye jitihada za kuboresha uzalishaji wa miwa na kutoa mapato bora kwa wakulima wa Kenya kutokana na zao lao. Mwekezaji huyo, Jack Liu, anayefanya kazi na timu ya watafiti kupitia kampuni ya Kenya, Crevation International Limited, kwa sasa anazalisha aina mbili mpya za mbegu za miwa kwa njia ya tissue culture, zenye mzunguko mfupi wa ukuaji, kustahimili ukame na magonjwa, pamoja na kiwango cha sukari kilichoboresha, ili kuongeza mapato ya wakulima na kupunguza athari za mabadiliko ya tabianchi kwenye kilimo. Liu na timu yake ya wataalamu 15 tayari wamepokea idhini kutoka Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate Services (Kephis) kufanya majaribio katika Rongai Sub-County kwa aina ya 'Golden Fruit 2' inayotengenezwa kwa ajili ya utengenezaji wa sukari ya viwandani, na 'Golden Fruit 1' kwa matumizi ya kunywa moja kwa moja au utengenezaji wa juisi ya miwa. Mnamo Mei 2022, Liu alikodisha ekari 50 za ardhi katika eneo la Kambi Ya Moto, Rongai Constituency, Kaunti ya Nakuru, ambapo alianza majaribio hayo. Shamba hilo sasa limegeuka

kuwa kituo cha mafunzo na maonyesho, ambapo kampuni, mashirika na taasisi zinakuja kujifunza kuhusu aina hizo mbili za miwa ambazo zitaruhusiwa sokoni Juni 2026 baada ya idhini ya Kephis. Liu anabainisha kuwa mbegu hizi zilizo na teknolojia ya China huchukua miezi 7-10 kumakaa, ikilinganishwa na aina nyingi zilizopo sokoni zinazochukua miezi 18-24, jambo ambalo hufanya kilimo kuwa cha faida na endelevu kwa kupunguza hasara na kuongeza mavuno. Mwekezaji huyo wa kilimo anasema kuwa aina mpya pia huongeza kiwango cha sukari na mavuno kwa ujumla,

hivyo kuongeza faida kwa wakulima katika maeneo muhimu ya kilimo cha miwa. Liu anabainisha kuwa baada ya idhini ya Kephis, aina hizo mbili zitasambazwa kwa wakulima katika Magharibi mwa Kenya (Kakamega, Bungoma, Busia, Kisumu, Migori, Nandi), sehemu za Rift Valley (Narok, Trans-Nzoia, Kericho) na baadhi ya sehemu za Pwani (Kwale, Tana River, Kilifi, Lamu). Majaribio yameonyesha kuwa 'Golden Fruit 2' ina 80% ya juisi, huku 'Golden Fruit 1' ikitoa tona 15 za sukari iliyosafishwa kutoka tona 100 za miwa, ikiwa na kiwango cha sukari cha angalau 50% zaidi ku-

liko mbegu za kawaida. Liu amewaahidi wakulima kuwa aina hizi mpya za miwa zimeundwa kustahimili athari za mabadiliko ya tabianchi, ikiwemo kustahimili ukame na upinzani dhidi ya wadudu na magonjwa. "Miwa ni zao linalohitaji maji mengi. Linafaika zaidi katika maeneo yenye mvua ya 1,100-2,500 mm kwa mwaka, joto la wastani, na udongo wenye rutuba na maji yanayopitia vizuri. Kaunti kama Kakamega, Bungoma, Busia, baadhi ya Nyanza na Rift Valley kwa muda mrefu zimekuwa mazingira bora kwa kilimo cha miwa," anasema mwekezaji huyo.

Serikali yagawa chanjo ya ugonjwa wa Miguu na Midomo kwa katika kaunti 11

Kampeni ya taifa ya chanjo ya mifugo dhidi ya ugonjwa wa mdomo na mguu (FMD) imezinduliwa kote nchini. Kampeni hii inalenga ng'ombe milioni 22 na kondoo na mbuzi milioni 50, na tayari imeanza katika kaunti 11, ikiwa ni pamoja

na Bomet, Narok, Meru, Kiambu, Uasin Gishu, Laikipia, Kajiado, na Bungoma. Lengo la mradi ni kufikia asilimia 70 ya mifugo iliyotolewa chanjo ndani ya miaka minne, kiwango kinachohitajika kudhibiti FMD kwa ufanisi. Wafanyakazi wa mpango huu wameripoti kuwa, hadi tarehe 27 Novemba 2025,

wakulima takriban 40,000 na ng'ombe 250,000 walikuwa wamesajiliwa, huku mifugo 185,719 tayari ikiwa imepewa chanjo. Chini ya mpango huu, chanjo zinapunguza bei ili kupunguza mzigo wa kifedha kwa wakulima, hasa wakulima wadogo. Wakulima hu-

lipa Sh50 kwa kila mnyama kwa chanjo ya FMD, huku serikali ikichangia Sh110 kupitia e-subsidy. Mradi huu ni sehemu ya mpango mpana wa serikali wa kubadilisha kilimo, ukizingatia kuwa mifugo inachangia Sh1.4 trilion kati tika uchumi na kuajiri nusu ya nguvu kazi ya kilimo.

Serikali kutekeleza vitengo vyote vya utawala-Katibu

NA MAKOKHA KHAOYA (KNA)

Katibu wa Masuala ya Ndani na Utawala wa Ndani, Raymond Omollo, ameahidi kuwa serikali itafanya kazi ili kurahisisha huduma kwa wananchi kwa kuanzisha rasmi vitengo vyote vya kiutawala vilivyopangwa kote nchini. Omollo aliyasema hayo wakati akihudhuria harambee ya Shirika la Kijamii (CBO) katika Kijiji cha Agenga, K Ward ya Kaskazini Kadem, Sub-kaunti ya Nyatike, akibainisha kuwa ndani ya miezi sita, vitengo hivyo vitakuwa vikifanya kazi kikamilifu ili kuhakikisha usawa wa huduma kwenye ngazi za kijamii. Katibu pia alikutana na vijana wa Kijiji cha Agenga katika mpango wa uwezeshaji unaoimlenga mtu mmoja mmoja, akiwahimiza kutochukuliwa na wanasiasa kutimiza masuala yao ya kisiasa. "Nawaasa vijana wachukue fursa zinazotolewa na serikali kujiendeleza kiuchumi,

badala ya kusubiri msaada kutoka kwa wanasiasa wanaowatumia kufanikisha ajenda zao za kisiasa," alisema Omollo. Aidha, Katibu wa Ndani alibainisha kuwa serikali ipo katika hatua za kupanua Mpango wa Umwagiliaji wa Lower Kuja ili kuongeza uzalishaji wa mpunga na kuunda ajira kwa vijana wa Nyatike na Migori kwa ujumla. Hivi sasa, ekari 7,200 zinamwagiliwa kwenye mpango huo na kuna uwezekano wa kupanuliwa hadi ekari 19,000. Omollo, ambaye pia alizindua Timu ya Mpira wa Konyango West, alifafanua kuwa mpango wa Huduma Mashinani utarahisisha upatikanaji wa huduma kwa vijana, hususan kwa ajili ya upatikanaji wa Kitambulisho cha Taifa (ID). Aliwahimiza vijana kutumia mpango huo kupata ID, nyaraka muhimu zinazohitajika kupata huduma za serikali na pia nyaraka ya kupiga kura, huku taifa likijandaa kwa uchaguzi wa 2027.

Baiskeli 150 kuboresha huduma za afya Tharaka

Wahudumu wa Afya wa Jamii (CHPs) katika Kaunti ya Tharaka Nithi wamepata msaada mkubwa baada ya kampuni ya Buffalo Bicycles, kwa kushirikiana na Village Hopecore International, kutoa baiskeli 150 kusaidia utoaji wa huduma za afya ya msingi katika jamii. Baiskeli hizi zinatarajiwa kuboresha usafirishaji wa CHPs, kuwaruhusu kufika kwa kaya kwa ufanisi zaidi, hasa katika maeneo magumu kufikiwa na yaliyoeenea kijiografia kote kaunti. Mwanzilishi wa Village Hopecore International, Kajira Mugambi, alipongeza kazi ya CHPs, akiieleza kama wito unaotoa maana na kusudi maishani. Aliwahimiza wahudumu wa afya kuendeleza matumaini wanapohudumia jamii zao, akibainisha kuwa kuishi maisha yenye maana ni chaguo. "Kuishi kama CHP ni kuchagua kuishi maisha

yenye umuhimu kwa wengine. Mito ya matumaini yenu haipaswi kuzimika mnapoendelea kuhudumia wananchi," alisema Bw. Mugambi, huku pia akimshukuru mtoaaji wa msaada na serikali ya kaunti kwa kuunga mkono wahudumu wa afya za jamii. Kocha wa Mkoa wa Afrika wa Buffalo Bicycles, Maureen Kolenyo, alibainisha kuwa shirika linatambua nafasi muhimu ya CHPs katika kuboresha matokeo ya afya. Alisema baiskeli hizi zitaboreshwa maisha yao huku zikiengeza ubora wa utoaji wa huduma. "Katika afya, umbali ni kila kitu. Unaweza kuamua kati ya maisha na kifo, matibabu ya mapema au kuchelewa, janga au sulu-hisho," alisema Bi. Kolenyo. Aliongeza kuwa baiskeli hizi zina uwezo wa kubeba mizigo hadi kilo 100, kuruhusu CHPs kutekeleza majukumu yao kwa ufanisi huku pia wakiweza kufika masoko kuboresha kipato cha familia.
