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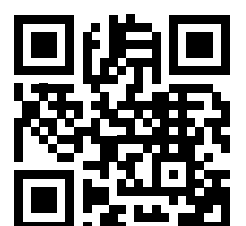


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# Mradi wa NYOTA wa Sh5b kuinua vijana 800,000

Waziri wa Masuala ya Vijana, Uchumi wa Ubunifu na Michezo, Salim Mvurya, amesema mpango wa Sh5 bilioni wa Fursa za Kitaifa kwa Ajili ya Maendeleo ya Vijana (NYOTA) ni hatua thabiti itakayochangia uthabiti wa kijamii kwa muda mrefu. Waziri Mvurya alisema kuwa mradi huo, unaendesha na serikali kuu na kufadhiliwa na Benki ya Dunia, unaweza kuwa “dawa ya ajira ya vijana kutokuwepo kwa wingi” na matatizo yanayohusiana kijamii nchini. Alibainisha kuwa mradi wa kitaifa unalenga kushughulikia changamoto kubwa ya ukosefu wa ajira kwa vijana kupitia mafunzo ya ujuzi, msaada wa ujasiriamali, ushauri wa kiufundi, na kuwahusisha vijana na fursa za ajira. Mvurya aliongeza kuwa mradi huo unalenga kushughulikia kiwango kikubwa cha ukosefu wa ajira kwa vijana na umasikini uliopo kwa wingi huku ukichangia uthabiti wa kijamii kupitia upataji wa ujuzi na ujasiriamali. Alisema kuwa mpango huo utaunda fursa za ajira endelevu kwa vijana kwa kuwapa ujuzi wa vitendo unaohusiana na tasnia. Mpango wa kuboresha uwezo wa vijana unalenga kuongeza ajira kwa vijana kwa kupanua fursa za ajira, kusaidia akiba ya vijana kupitia Bidhaa ya Akiba



ya Sekta Isiyo Rasmi ya NSSF ya Haba Haba, kuimarisha mifumo ya ajira ya vijana, kukuza ujasiriamali wa vijana, na kutoa majukwaa ya biashara mtandaoni (soko) ili kuhakikisha uendeleu na upanuzi wa biashara. Mvurya, aliyeambatana na Katibu Mkuu wa Sayansi, Utafiti na Ubunifu, Prof. Abdulrazak Shaukat, alizungumza katika Kaunti ya Kwale wakati wa uzinduzi wa jukwaa la uhamasishaji wa NYOTA kwa viongozi wa ngazi ya chini kote nchini. Majukwaa hayo yanakusudia

kuwaelimisha viongozi na wadau kuhusu fursa 820,000 zilizopo kwa vijana walioko hatarini wenye umri wa miaka 18–29 katika kata zote 1,450, ili waweze kuunganishwa na miradi iliyopo katika maendeleo ya biashara, mafunzo ya ujasiriamali, na uzoefu wa kazi—yote kwa lengo la kubadilisha maisha ya vijana. Ushiriki wa kikamilifu wa viongozi wa ngazi ya chini unahakikisha kuwa taarifa muhimu na fursa zinawafikia vijana kila kata. Dirisha la maombi kwa mzunguko wa pili wa msaada wa

biashara litaanza kutoka Oktoba 6 hadi 12, 2025. \*Piga 254# kuomba na uwe na nafasi ya kupata Sh50,000 kwa msaada wa biashara na mafunzo. Maombi ya NYOTA yanafanywa kupitia jukwaa la kidijitali (254#) ambalo ni wazi na linaweza kufikiwa. Wanawake, vijana, watu wenye ulemavu, na makundi mengine yaliyo hatarini au yaliyoko pembezoni mwa jamii wanahimizwa kuomba. Jukwaa la uhamasishaji la NYOTA pia liliwahi kuhudhuriwa na Gavana wa Kwale

Fatuma Achani, Kamishna wa Kaunti Stephen Orinde, Wabunge wa eneo hilo Kassim Tandaza (Matuga), Feisal Bader (Msambweni), Gonzi Rai (Kinango), Mangale Chiforomodo (Lunga Lungu), na Wajumbe kadhaa wa Bunge la Kaunti (MCAs). “Malengo makuu ya mradi wa NYOTA ni kuongeza fursa za ajira, kuongeza mapato, na kuendeleza utamaduni wa akiba miongoni mwa vijana,” alisema Mvurya. Alibainisha kuwa NYOTA itaunda ushirikiano kati ya upataji ujuzi na ujasiriamali kwa kuwawezesha vijana kupata ujuzi wa vitendo wa kutumia fursa za kiuchumi—ambayo itasababisha ongezeko la ajira na ukuaji wa uchumi. Mradi unalenga vijana 820,000 walioko hatarini wenye umri wa miaka 18–29, na hadi miaka 35 kwa watu wenye ulemavu, katika ngazi nne za elimu. Jumla ya vijana 100,000 wata-saidiwa kitaifa, na 70 kila mmoja katika kila kata kati ya kata 1,450. Kila mshiriki atapokea Sh50,000 kwa kuanzisha biashara. “NYOTA pia inahusisha mafunzo kwa vijana 90,000 katika ujuzi wa vitendo, huku wengine 600,000 wakipatiwa mafunzo ya Kupata Fursa za Manunuzi ya Serikali (AGPO),” alisema Mvurya. Alieleza kuwa AGPO ni mpango wa hatua ya kuthibitisha ili kuhakikisha wanawake, vijana, na watu wenye ulemavu wanapata fursa sawa katika maisha.

## USE OF FIREWORKS DURING DIWALI AND HINDU NEW YEAR CELEBRATIONS

This is to inform the general public that Diwali and Hindu New year celebrations will be held from **Friday 17<sup>th</sup> October to Monday 20<sup>th</sup> October 2025**. These festivities are traditionally celebrated with fireworks in authorized venues.

Consequently, the Hindu community is requested to ensure that fireworks displays are carried out within the requirements of the Explosives act Cap 115 Laws of Kenya. Fireworks displays should be carried out in an orderly manner so that the general public are not inconvenienced. In this regard, the parties carrying out displays shall ensure that: -

- The necessary permits to hold fireworks are obtained from State Department for Mining, County Mining offices;
- Fireworks are used only at the authorized venues such as clubs, hotels, temples, sports grounds, school compounds or any other venue as may be authorized by an Inspector of Explosives;
- The displays are held between **1900hrs** and **2300hrs** only during the authorized dates;
- Display shells are limited to a maximum of four-inch caliber in all venues in urban and built-up areas except as may be exempted by an Inspector of Explosives and
- Only qualified, experienced and sober persons shall be allowed to fire aerial shells and other aerial display fireworks.

Firework Dealers shall ensure that: -

- Fireworks are **not** sold to any child who is below age Thirteen (13) years as doing so is an offence under Explosives Act, Cap 115;
- Aerial display fireworks (Shells, Rockets, Roman Candles and Cakes) are sold to holders of permits to display fireworks duly signed by an Inspector of Explosives.

We take this opportunity to wish the Hindu Community a Happy Diwali and a Prosperous New year.

# Daraja refu zaidi la juu ya maji Afrika Mashariki laleta enzi mpya kibiashara

Barabara ya Sh45 bilioni ya Dongo Kundu Bypass katika jiji la pwani la Mombasa imepongezwa kama mradi wa kipekee unaotarajiwa kubadilisha taswira ya kijamii na kiuchumi ya eneo hilo. Barabara hiyo yenye urefu wa kilomita 18 inaunganisha Miritini upande wa magharibi wa bara na Ng'ombeni kando ya pwani ya kusini, ikiepuka foleni katika Kiwango cha Likoni Ferry. Ikitoa njia ya moja kwa moja inayoboresha muunganiko na shughuli za kiuchumi katika eneo la pwani, bypass hiyo iko tayari kwa asilimia 98 na tayari inatumika na madereva huku ikisubiri kufunguliwa rasmi. Barabara hiyo inaongeza hatua kwa hatua shughuli za kijamii na kiuchumi kwa kurahisisha usafirishaji wa bidhaa, huduma, na watu. Wadau wanasema barabara hiyo itaboresha usalama na muunganiko katika kaunti za pwani za Mombasa, Kwale, na Kilifi, na kurahisisha usafiri salama na wa haraka. Inayojulikana pia kama Mombasa Southern Bypass Highway, mradi huo una daraja tatu — ikiwemo daraja refu zaidi juu ya maji katika Afrika Mashariki — na unalenga kupunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa muda wa safari kuelekea Diani na pwani ya kusini, kuongeza biashara za kanda, kukuza utalii, na kuhamasisha maendeleo yanayotarajiwa ya Eneo Maalum la Kiuchumi la Dongo Kundu (SEZ). Bypass hii inahudumia kama njia muhimu ya usafirishaji kwa trafiki inayoelekea ndani ya Kenya na nchi jirani, huku

pia ikikuza urahisishaji wa biashara na maendeleo ya kijamii na kiuchumi. Mradi huu

unagusa kaunti za Kwale na Mombasa, ukianzia Daraja la Mteza na kumalizika Kibun-

dani kando ya Barabara Kuu ya Mombasa-Lungalunga. Pia inatoa muunganiko muhimu kuelekea Uwanja wa Ndege wa Kimataifa wa Moi na mwisho wa Reli ya Kisasa (SGR), iki-boresha utalii na sekta ya ukarimu katika eneo la pwani. Kukamilika kwa bypass kumepunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa utegemezi wa njia ya Likoni Ferry, ambayo inahudumia watu takriban 300,000 na

magari 6,000 kila siku wakitumia feri kama MV Jambo, MV Kwale, MV Likoni, MV Kilindini, MV Nyayo, na MV Harambee. Huduma za feri, ambazo zilianza mwaka 1937, kwa muda mrefu zilikuwa kiungo pekee kuelekea pwani ya kusini kabla ya kufunguliwa kwa Dongo Kundu Bypass. Ingawa feri zinatoa huduma muhimu, pia zimekuwa “kizazi cha usumbufu” kwa abiria na madereva kutokana na matatizo ya mitambo, ucheleweshaji, foleni, na masuala ya usalama yanayoathiri wenyeji na watalii. Naibu Kaimu Mkuu wa Ofisi ya Rais, Eliud Owalo, alielezea Dongo Kundu Bypass kama njia muhimu ya usafirishaji inayounganisha barabara kuu za miundombinu, ikiwa ni pamoja na Barabara Kuu ya Mombasa-Nairobi, hivyo kuongeza ufanisi wa usafirishaji kwa jumla. Owalo alisema mradi huo unaimarisha miundombinu, kuunda ajira, na kurahisisha usafirishaji wa bidhaa na huduma, hivyo kuhimiza ukuaji wa uchumi katika eneo la pwani. “Pia utatoa muunganiko kutoka Uwanja wa Ndege wa Kimataifa wa Moi na SGR, hivyo kuboresha utalii na ukarimu katika Kwale,” alisema wakati wa ziara ya ukaguzi wa miradi ya miundombinu katika eneo hilo. Naibu Kaimu Mkuu wa Ofisi ya Rais aliongeza kuwa Mradi wa Maendeleo ya Eneo Maalum la Kiuchumi la Dongo Kundu ni mojawapo ya miradi ya msingi ya Ajenda ya Taifa ya Vision 2030. SEZ, lenye ukubwa wa takriban ekari 3,000 karibu na Bandari ya Mombasa katika Halimashauri Ndogo ya Likoni, linaendelezwa kwa gharama ya Sh30 bilioni. Lina nafasi muhimu yenye uwezo mkubwa wa maendeleo na ushindani katika usafirishaji na miundombinu, likiwa karibu na bandari, Bypass ya Kusini, SGR, na Uwanja wa Ndege wa Kimataifa wa Moi.

# Kisumu yashirikiana na NSSF kujenga mradi wa nyumba za thamani ya Sh2.4b

Mfuko wa Kitaifa wa Hifadhi ya Jamii (NSSF) unashirikiana na Serikali ya Kaunti ya Kisumu katika ujenzi wa nyumba 164 za kisasa katika Makazi ya Milimani kwa gharama ya Sh2.4 bilioni. Mradi huu, ambao utajumuisha nyumba 102 zenye vyumba viwili vya kulala na makazi 62 yenye vyumba vitatu vya kulala pamoja na sehemu za watumishi (SQs), unatarajiwa kukamilika ndani ya miezi tisa na utatumia teknolojia na miundo ya kisasa kujenga makazi yanayofaa kwa familia za kisasa. Mradi huu pia unajumuisha maboresho ya miundombinu muhimu, ikiwemo maboresho ya mfumo wa maji na majitaka, njia zilizopakwa lami, na kuongeza usalama. Huu unafuata makubaliano mengine ambayo kaunti hivi karibuni iliyasaini na UN-Habitat ya kujenga nyumba za bei nafuu zenye thamani ya Sh2.7 bilioni katika maeneo ya Kibuye na Muhoroni. Akiwahutubia wakati wa sherehe ya kuanza kwa mradi katika eneo la Milimani, Gavana wa Kaunti ya Kisumu Prof. Peter Anyang' Nyong'o alisema mradi huu ni sehemu ya mpango mpana wa kurejesha makazi ya zamani na kubadilisha Kisumu kuwa mji wa kisasa mfano. Alibainisha kwamba athari zake zitakuwa za haraka na kubwa kwa sababu ajira zitaundwa, fursa kwa mafundi wenye ujuzi na hata kazi za mikono zitapatikana, na hizi fursa zinapaswa kuwafikia wananchi wa Kisumu. Gavana pia alisisitiza kwamba wasambazaji pia wanapaswa kuonekana kutoka Kisumu. "Mradi huu unaonyesha tunaweza kufanikisha mafanikio makubwa kupitia ushirikiano wa kimkakati. Kuendeleza kipande hiki cha ardhi kutaunda jamii yenye mshikamano ambayo itaboresha muonekano wa mji na kuboresha maisha ya wakazi wa Kisumu, na tumerahisisha mifumo



ya idhini kwa huduma mbalimbali kama vile maji na majitaka ili kurahisisha utoaji wa huduma kwa wakazi," alisema Prof. Nyong'o. Gavana alibainisha kwamba mradi huu ni sehemu ya maono makubwa ya mstari wa mbele wa ziwa wenye miundombinu bora na uchumi wa samahani unaokua. Mkurugenzi Mtendaji na Msimamizi Mkuu wa NSSF, Bw. David Koross, kwa upande wake, alieleza mradi huu kama alama muhimu ya ushirikiano. Alibainisha kwamba sekta ya mali isiyo-hamishika na ujenzi sasa zinachangia zaidi ya asilimia 14 ya Pato la Taifa (GDP) la Kenya, ishara ya nguvu ya ushirikiano wa kimkakati na athari za ugutuzi. "Sherehe hii si tu kuanza kwa maendeleo ya mali; ni sherehe hai ya ushirikiano, ishara hai ya kile kinachowezekana wakati taasisi za serikali zinashirikiana kama washirika wa kweli," alisema Koross. Alieleza kwamba makubaliano haya ya ubunifu ya kubadilishana ardhi kama njia ya kutatua deni la muda mrefu yanazidi mila za jadi, yakionyesha enzi mpya ya jinsi

tunavyokabiliana na maendeleo na fedha za umma nchini Kenya, na hatua hii inaweka mfano kwa kaunti na taasisi nyingine kukumbatia suluhisho bunifu lenye manufaa kwa pande zote. "Roho hii ya ushirikiano si ya kipekee Kisumu peke yake; Nairobi, uwekezaji wa NSSF umekuwa muhimu katika kubadilisha muonekano wa miji, kuunda ajira, na kundeza uchumi. Maono yetu sasa yanapanuka hadi kaunti kote nchini, yakionyesha kila mara kwamba tunaposhirisha nguvu zetu, matokeo ni makubwa zaidi kuliko yale yoyote taasisi moja ingeweza kuyafanikisha peke yake." Mkurugenzi Mtendaji alionyesha kwamba uwekezaji uko kiini cha dhamira ya NSSF na kwamba ahadi yao ni kuongeza thamani ya Mfuko kwa kutafuta uwekezaji mbadala utakao-toa faida endelevu. "Nilipojiunga na Mfuko miaka miwili iliyopita, nililenga kuongeza thamani ya Mfuko hadi Sh600 bilioni. Nina furaha kutangaza, kwa niaba ya Bodi ya Wajitoleaji, kwamba Mfuko umevuka alama ya Sh600

## Serikali yataka mradi wa lango la Pembe ya Afrika kukamilika kwa wakati

Katibu wa Barabara, Mha. Joseph Mbugua, amewaonya mashirika yanayotekeleza Mradi wa Maendeleo ya Lango la Afrika Kaskazini (HoAGDP) kuongeza kasi ya utekelezaji wa mradi na kuimarisha ushirikiano wa mipaka. Mradi huu wa Dola za Kimarekani 750 milioni, unaofadhiliwa na Benki ya Dunia, ni mojawapo ya miradi mikubwa ya miundombinu nchini Kenya na umebuniwa ili kuongeza uhusiano, biashara ya kikanda, na ukuaji wa uchumi kaskazini mwa Kenya na katika eneo pana la Afrika Kaskazini. Akiwa kwenye mkutano wa tathmini ya robo mwaka katika

Jengo la Works jijini Nairobi, Eng. Mbugua alisisitiza umuhimu wa kuharakisha utoaji wa fedha na kuona matokeo wazi kadri mradi unavyokaribia tarehe ya ukamilisho Juni 2028. Alibainisha kuwa mradi huu unapaswa kuleta faida halisi kwa jamii za kaskazini mwa Kenya. “Lazima tuzingatia hatua zenye athari kubwa na kuhakikisha mradi huu unaacha urithi wa kudumu wa ukuaji, upatikanaji, na fursa katika Lango la Afrika Kaskazini,” alisema Bw. Mbugua. Alipongeza mbinu ya mashirika mengi inayosukuma mradi huu, akibainisha kuwa muundo wake wa pamoja unachangia maendeleo katika usafirishaji, miundombinu ya kidijitali, na ujumuishaji wa kikanda. Kulingana na tathmini ya hivi karibuni, kiwango cha utoaji wa fedha kwa mradi kimeongezeka hadi asilimia 32 (Dola za Kimarekani 253.5 milioni), kutoka asilimia 26 robo ya mwaka iliyopita, ikionyesha kasi ya maendeleo. Tutahakikisha kuwa eneo la kisasa limejengwa ili kutoa huduma bora ya maegesho. Tuna idara inayoshughulikia masuala ya afya kwenye kituo cha mpaka, lakini pia

Seneta wa Kaunti ya Uasin Gishu, Jackson Mandago, aliitaka Serikali ya Kaunti kuhakikisha wanajenga miundombinu itakayoweze kupata mapato kutoka kwa biashara za mpaka. “Serikali ya Kaunti ya Busia inapaswa kuhakikisha inakamilisha eneo la maegesho ya malori, ili iweze kupata mapato yake mwenyewe. Tunapaswa kukumbuka kuwa biashara katika kaunti za mpaka inahusisha nchi nyingi. Tuna mfumo wa Ushirikiano wa Afrika Mashariki na makubaliano ku-

husu kodi ambayo tunapaswa kuyazingatia kama taifa. Hatuwezi kuzidi kile tunachopaswa kukusanya. Nchi yetu ndiyo faidika mkubwa kutokana na biashara zinazofanywa kupitia mpaka huu,” alisema. Seneta wa Nandi, Samson Kiprotich Cheragey, alisema kuwa miundombinu kwenye kituo cha mpaka inahitaji kuboreshwa ili kutoa huduma bora. “Changamoto tulizooni ni pamoja na eneo la maegesho lenye uwezo wa malori 40 pekee. Muda wa kusubiri ukaguzi ni dakika 30, jambo ambalo halipaswi kuwa hivyo katika zama hizi. Tuna zaidi ya mashirika 22 na hili limepelekea kucheleweshwa kwa ukaguzi na kuzuia biashara huru Afrika.

Kikao hicho kilitoa mwelekeo wa hatua muhimu ambayo maafisa waliieleza kama hatua ya msingi kuelewa ukubwa na hali halisi ya makazi yasiyo rasmi katika Kaunti ya Kiambu. Zoezi hilo la uchoraji ramani linatarajiwa kutoa taarifa za kina kuhusu maeneo, idadi ya watu, miundombinu iliyopo, na mapungufu ya huduma katika makazi yasiyo rasmi kote kaunti nzima.

kazi wote, wakiwemo wale wa maeneo yaliyosahaulika. KISIP, yaani Kenya Informal Settlements Improvement Project, ni mpango wa serikali unaolenga kuboresha hali ya

maisha katika makazi yasiyo rasmi kupitia maendeleo ya miundombinu, usalama wa umiliki wa ardhi, na ujenzi wa uwezo kwa mamlaka za mitaa. “Maisha katika makazi yas-

iyo rasmi kama yetu yamekuwa magumu kwa miaka mingi,” alisema Mary Wanjiru, mkazi wa moja ya makazi yasiyo rasmi ya Kiambu. “Hatuna barabara nzuri, mifereji ya maji, na wakati mwingine hata maji safi. Ikiwa zoezi hili la uchoraji ramani litaleta maboresho halisi katika maisha yetu, litakuwa mabadiliko makubwa kwa jamii yetu. Tunatumaini serikali itatumia takwimu hizi kutuletea huduma tunazohitaji sana,” alisema. John Kimani, kiongozi wa jamii katika makazi mengine yasiyo rasmi, alionyesha matumaini yenye tahadhari kuhusu mradi huo. “Tumeona tafiti na tathmini nyingi hapo awali, lakini swali halisi ni utekelezaji. Tunakaribisha mpango huu na tuko tayari kushirikiana kikamilifu na washauri. Hata hivyo, tunatarajia kwamba baada ya uchoraji ramani kukamilika, hatua madhubuti zitachukuliwa. Wizara ya Nishati na Mafuta ya Petroli inaweka kituo cha kisasa cha kuhifadhi Gesi ya Kupikia Isiyo na Hatari (LPG) cha tani 40,000 kwa ajili ya wananchi wa Kaunti ya Kitui. Hii ilifichuliwa jana na Waziri wa Nishati na Mafuta ya Petroli, Opiyo Wandayi, wakati wa ziara ya ukaguzi katika Chuo cha Mafunzo ya Walimu Kitui (KTTC), ambapo mradi wa ujenzi wa kituo hiki cha kuhifadhi LPG unaendelea. Akizungumza wakati wa ziara hiyo, Wandayi alisisitiza kwamba mradi huo unalenga kuhakikisha kila kaya, shule, na taasisi ya umma katika Kaunti kubwa ya Kitui inapata gesi ya kupikia salama na ya bei nafuu kwa urahisi. “Urahisi wa kupata na bei nafuu ni msingi wa mkakati wetu. Kwa kujenga miundombinu na kuhamasisha ushindani, tutaweza kupunguza bei na kuongeza usambazaji. Hii ndicho jinsi tunavyopanga kuhakikisha nishati safi kwa Wakenya wote huku tukilinda misitu yetu na mazingira,” alisema Wandayi. Wizara ya Nishati na

Mafuta ya Petroli pia inatarajia kusambaza zaidi ya silinda 24,000 za gesi kwa wakazi wa kaunti hiyo katika maeneo yote nane ya uchaguzi. Waziri aliyeandamana na kikosi cha maafisa wakuu kutoka wizara yake, alitembelea maandalizi yanayoundelea ya maonyesho ya nishati safi, huku nchi ikijiandaa kusherehekea “Wiki ya Nishati” inayotarajiwa kuanza wiki ijayo kuanzia Jumatatu ya tarehe 13 hadi Ijumaa ya tarehe 17, itakayofanyika katika Chuo cha Walimu cha Kitui (KTTC). “Wiki ya Nishati” inafanana na kaulimbiu ya sherehe za Siku ya Mashujaa za mwaka

huu, ambayo ni ‘Nishati Safi’ na pia ni maandalizi ya awali ya sherehe za Siku ya Mashujaa, ambazo pia zitaendelea kufanyika katika kaunti ya Kitui na zitakazopewa heshima na Rais Dr. William Ruto,” alisema Waziri Opiyo Wandayi. Wakati wa ziara yake, Wandayi alisema kwamba wizara yake inashirikiana na mashirika mbalimbali ikiwa ni pamoja na Kenya Power and Lighting (KPLC), KETRACO, Kenya Pipeline miongoni mwa mengine, ambao pia wanashirikiana kuandaa sherehe za Siku ya Mashujaa za mwaka huu, na kufanya kazi kuboresha maisha ya wananchi wa Kenya.

## Serikali kujumuisha viongozi wa wanafunzi kamati za usalama

za kuimarisha ushirikiano kati ya viongozi wa wanafunzi na mashirika ya usalama, na kueneza ufahamu kuhusu jukumu la vijana katika kukuza amani,” alisema PS. Akizungumza alipokuwa akiongoza mfululizo wa Jukwaa La Wasomi uliofanyika Chuo Kikuu cha Nairobi, Dkt. Omollo alibainisha kwamba Wizara imeshirikiana na Chama cha Amani cha Wanafunzi wa Vyuo na Chuo Kikuu nchini Kenya (UCSPAK) ili kuimarisha ushirikiano kati ya wanafunzi na mashirika ya usalama kote nchini. Alisema, “Tunaendelea kuandaa mikutano yenye matunda kati ya viongozi wa wanafunzi na kamati za usalama za kaunti.”

# Wafugaji wahimizwa kukumbatia mifugo wa hali ya juu kuongeza faida

Wakulima wa mifugo kote nchini wametakiwa kuanzisha mbolea za kisasa zenye mazao mengi ili kupata faida nzuri sokoni na kuongeza ushindani wa Kenya katika biashara ya mifugo duniani. Akizungumza katika Jiji la Kitui wakati wa ufunguzi wa semina ya mafunzo ya siku tatu kuhusu ujenzi wa uwezo na uhusiano wa masoko kwa ushirika unaoongoza mbele, Katibu Mkuu wa Maendeleo ya Mifugo, Jonathan Mueke, alisisitiza kuwa mbolea za ubora na mbinu bora za afya ya wanyama ni muhimu katika kubadilisha sekta hiyo kuwa biashara inayotoa faida na yenye uimara. Katibu pia alionyesha wasiwasi wake kuhusu unyonyaji wa wakulima na madalali wasio waaminifu wanaonunua wanyama kwa bei za chini mno, na kuacha wakulima na faida ndogo sana. Aliwataka wakulima kujiunga na vyama vya ushirika vya mifugo ili



kuimarisha nguvu zao za mazungumzo na kupata masokoyahakinayuhakika. Mueke alibainisha kuwa masoko ya mifugo nchini Kenya bado yamegawanyika na kuendeshwa kibinafsi, jambo linalowa-

zuia wakulima kunufaika na faida za kiwango kikubwa na minyororo ya usambazaji thabiti. Warsha hiyo iliyoandaliwa na Idara ya Hali ya Taifa ya Maendeleo ya Mifugo kupitia Huduma

ya Taifa ya Maendeleo na Uendelezaji wa Mifugo (NLD&PS) na Mradi wa DRIVE, kwa ushirikiano na Chuo Kikuu cha Strathmore. Katibu alieleza kuwa vyama vya ushirika vinawapa wakulima upatikanaji wa huduma muhimu kama mafunzo, mbolea bora, pembejeo nafuu, chanjo, na huduma za wanyama. Pia vinawawezesha kushirikiana katika mazungumzo, kujumlisha bidhaa, na kupata bei bora kwa masoko ya ndani na ya nje. Kaunti ya Kitui ni mzalishaji wa pili mkubwa wa mbuzi wa Galla na chanzo kikuu cha kuku wa kienyeji nchini Kenya, lakini minyororo yake ya thamani ya mifugo bado haijakamilika na imegawanyika. Alithibitisha ahadi ya serikali ya kuinua wakulima wa mifugo kupitia maendeleo, uendelezaji, na urahisi wa biashara ya mifugo na bidhaa zake. # Barabara Kuu Mombasa Kwa-Jomvu kufunguliwa karibuni-KeNHA

Ni afueni kwa madereva na wasafiri wanaotumia barabara kuu ya Mombasa-Kwa Jomvu, huku ujenzi wa barabara ya juu ya Kwa Jomvu Interchange ambao ulikuwa umesimama kwa muda mrefu, ukikaribia kukamilika. Mradi huo wa barabara ya juu wenye urefu wa mita 900, ambao ulikuwa umesitishwa kwa zaidi ya miaka minane kutokana na mizozo ya ulipaji fidia ya ardhi, sasa umekamilika kwa asilimia 95. Tume ya Kitaifa ya Ardhi (NLC) ilitengewa shilingi bilioni 5.2 kwa ajili ya kufidia Walioathirika na Mradi (PAPs), hatua iliyoweza kuanza tena kwa kazi katika makutano ya Jomvu Kuu ambako shughuli zilikuwa zimesimama. Barabara ya juu hiyo ndiyo awamu ya mwisho ya mradi wa barabara ya Mombasa-Kwa Jomvu Dual Carriageway unaogharimu shilingi bilioni 11, ulioanza mwaka 2017 kwa ufadhili wa Benki ya Maendeleo ya Afrika (AfDB). Mradi huo unajumuisha ujenzi upya wa tabaka la barabara kwa kutumia Continuous Re-

inforced Concrete Pavement (CRCP) na Stone Mastic Asphalt Concrete (SMA), ujenzi wa barabara kuu tatu zenye madaraja ya juu na ya chini, pamoja na upanuzi wa barabara za njia mbili na nne kuwa barabara ya njia sita ya pande mbili. “Inatarajiwa kwamba katika wiki mbili zijazo, mkandasi atafungua eneo hili ili magari yapite kwa muda kwa ajili ya kushindilia udongo zaidi ili kuongeza uimara kabla ya kuwekwa tabaka la lami,” alisema Mhandisi Simon Omuono, Mkurugenzi wa Kanda ya Pwani wa KeNHA. Aliongeza kuwa uamuzi wa kutumia Road Maintenance Levy Fund kama dhamana umeiwezesha serikali kupata fedha za kufidia walioathirika, na hivyo kuweka mazingira mazuri ya kukamilisha mradi huo. “Umuhimu wa barabara hii katika kuwezesha biashara hauwezi kupuuzwa. Ni sehemu ya Korridori ya Kaskazini inayorahisisha usafirishaji wa mizigo kutoka Bandari ya Mombasa na kuchochea biashara ya kikanda na ya ndani. Pia inaboresha utalii kwa kuwezesha usafiri wa har-

Mamlaka ya Barabara Kuu Nchini (KeNHA) imezindua kampeni ititwayo “Safari Salama” yenye lengo la kuhamasisha usalama barabarani na uelewa kuhusu afya ya akili miongoni

mwa watumiaji wa barabara. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi wa kampeni hiyo katika Kaunti ya Homa Bay, Mkurugenzi wa Kanda wa KeNHA, Mhandisi Julius Mak’Odero, alisisitiza umuhimu wa wananchi kuwajibika kuhusu afya yao ya akili na usalama wao wanapotumia barabara. “Mpango huu ni sehemu ya

dhamira yetu ya kuhakikisha safari salama na kuokoa maisha. Usalama barabarani si suala la miundombinu pekee, bali linahusisha pia changamoto za kisaikolojia na kitabia zinazowaathiri watumiaji wa barabara,” alisema Mhandisi Mak’Odero. Alieleza kuwa KeNHA inafanya tathmini za usalama

barabarani na kubaini maeo hatarishi ili kuongeza usalama wa watumiaji. Aidha, mamlaka hiyo inaweka vipengele maalum kwa watembea kwa miguu na watumiaji wa vyombo visivyotumia injini kama vile njia za waenda kwa miguu, barabara za huduma na sehemu za kuvukia salama. “Hapa Homa Bay, tunajenga barabara yenye njia mbili kila upande ya urefu wa kilomita tano kutoka Got Rabuor hadi Kona-Kodoyo, ambayo itajumuisha njia za watembea kwa miguu, taa za barabarani na maeneo salama ya kuvukia. Hii ni kuhakikisha usalama wa kimwili kwa watumiaji wote wa barabara,” aliongeza. Mhandisi huyo alisisitiza kwamba KeNHA inapanga kuendesha kampeni hiyo kote nchini kama sehemu ya jukumu lake pana la kuhakikisha barabara salama na kuimarisha ustawi wa Wakenya wote. Kampeni hiyo iliwaleta pamoja wadau muhimu wakiwemo Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Usafiri na Usalama Barabarani (NTSA), Msalaba Mwekundu wa Kenya, Go Beyond Limited, Huduma ya Polisi ya Taifa, na jamii ya boda boda. Meneja wa Kanda ya Kusini mwa Nyanza wa NTSA, Adan

Adow, alionyesha wasiwasi kuhusu ongezeko la ajali za barabarani, akibainisha kuwa vifo 4,748 viliripotiwa mwaka 2024, huku kati ya watu 10,000 na 12,000 wakijeruhiwa. “Takwimu hizi huenda ni kubwa zaidi kwa kuwa baadhi ya visa haviripotiwi. Zaidi ya asilimia 80 ya ajali husababishwa na makosa ya kibinadamu, si hitilafu za mitambo au ubovu wa barabara. Ni lazima tubadili mitazamo yetu na kuwajibika kwa pamoja kuhusu usalama barabarani,” alisema Adow. ## Serikali yaagiza ukaguzi mkuu wa viwanda vya KTDA kuhusu bonasi

Kupitia miradi hii, kufikia mwaka 2032 tunatarajia kuuza chai kwa Sh100 kwa kilo,” aliongeza. Katibu huyo alisema kuwa serikali tayari imepata tena fedha kiasi cha Shilingi bilioni 2.7 zilizokuwa zimepotea kupitia mi-amala isiyoieleweka na kuzirejesha kwa wakulima kupitia KTDA. Aidha, alifichua kuwa Sh2b zilitolewa kure-

jeshwa kwa wakulima kwa ajili ya mbolea, na nyingine Shilingi bilioni 3.7 zilitolewa hivi karibuni kuboresha shughuli za viwanda vya chai. Hata hivyo, Dkt. Ronoh alibainisha kuwa licha ya juhudi zinazoendelea za serikali, changamoto bado zipo katika usimamizi wa viwanda vya KTDA, huku akielezea wasiwasi wake kuhusu mienendo ya baadhi ya wakurugenzi wa viwanda, hasa katika eneo la West Rift, ambao waliripotiwa kufanya mkutano zaidi ya 165 katika mwaka mmoja.

Kenya imeungana na jamii ya kimataifa kusherehekea Siku ya Posta Duniani kwa kuapa upya kubadilisha huduma zake za posta na uwasilishaji kuwa nguzo yenye nguvu katika uchumi wa kidijitali. Sherehe hizo, zilizofanyika Nairobi, zilianzishwa kwa ajili ya serikali ya kuimarisha Shirika la Posta la Kenya (PCK) na kupanua upatikanaji wa huduma zinazojumuisha wote na zina-zotegemea teknolojia. Isaboke alibainisha kuwa uthabiti wa sekta hii na uwezo wake wa kubadilika unaonekana katika mchakato wake wa kuhamia kutoka barua za jadi hadi majukwaa ya kidijitali na huduma za biashara mtandao. “Mada ya mwaka huu, ‘Posta kwa Watu: Huduma za Ndani, Ufikaji wa Kimataifa,’ inaendana na Ajenda ya Serikali ya Mabadiliko ya Kiuchumi Kutoka Chini Hadi Juu kwa kuhakikisha ukuaji na fursa kwa kila Mkenya kutoka ngazi za chini hadi kimataifa,” alisema Katibu Mkuu. Aidha, Isaboke alisisi-

tiza kuwa serikali inashirikiana na Shirika la Posta kutekeleza mageuzi makubwa yanayolenga uhuru wa taasisi, uboreshaji wa mali, ujumuishaji wa kidijitali, uboreshaji wa huduma, uthabiti wa kifedha na ushirikiano wa kimkakati. “Lengo letu ni kubadilisha Ofisi za Posta kuwa vichocheo vya ukuaji wa uchumi wa ndani. Ingawa Shirika limekabiliana na changamoto, hii pia ni fursa ya kujiendeleza. Mageuzi hayako tena chaguo; ni jambo la lazima,” alisisitiza Isaboke. Wakati huo huo, Katibu Mkuu alifichua kuwa serikali inaanazisha vituo vya kidijitali katika kata zote 1,450 za uchaguzi na vituo 25,000 vya Wi-Fi bure kote nchini ili kupanua upatikanaji wa kidijitali.

# Mudavadi azitaka kaunti kuongeza mapato kuepuka kutegemea Hazina Kuu

NA SALOME ALWANDA NA RODGERS OMONDI (KNA)

Kiranja wa Mawaziri ambaye pia ni Waziri wa Mambo ya Nje na Masuala ya Diaspora, Musalia Mudavadi, amezitaka serikali za kaunti kuzingatia zaidi ukusanyaji wa mapato yao ya ndani badala ya kutegemea tu mgao kutoka kwa serikali kuu. Akizungumza mjini Busia wakati wa uzinduzi wa mpango wa kujenga uwezo wa serikali za kaunti katika mipango ya kiuchumi, Mudavadi alisisitiza kuwa nguvu halisi ya ugatuzi itadhihirika pale kaunti zitakapotumia ipasavyo vyanzo vya mapato vilivyoko ndani ya maeneo yao kufadhili shughuli zao nyingi. “Kaunti kadhaa zimeacha juhudi za kukuza vyanzo vyao vya mapato na sasa zinategemea kabisa mgao wa serikali kuu. Takwimu zinaonyesha kwamba katika baadhi ya kaunti, mapato yanayokusanywa ni chini hata ya yale yaliyokuwa yakipatikana wakati wa halmashauri za miji. Hali hii inaonyesha uzembe mkubwa unaohitaji kushughulikiwa,” alisema. Kuhusu kaunti za mpakani, Waziri huyo alitaka kufanyiwa mapitio kwa mfumo wa bajeti wa kaunti zinazopakana na

Uganda. “Uganda ni mshirika wetu mkubwa zaidi wa biashara, lakini Busia na kaunti nyingine za mpakani hazinufaiki vya kutosha kutokana na mapato yanayotokana na ushirikiano huo. Tunahitaji kutafuta njia za kuhakikisha kwamba wananchi wanaoishi mpakani pia wanaufaika na mapato hayo,” alisema. Mudavadi pia alizihimiza serikali za kaunti kuweka kumbumbu sahihi za usimamizi wa rasilimali, zikiwemo zinazohusu umiliki wa ardhi. “Hakikisha kuna uwazi kuhusu muda wa upangaji kati ya mwekezaji anayepanga kuanzisha kampuni na muda unaochukuliwa kupatiwa vibali vinavyohitajika. Tunajenge mazingira bora yanayovutia wawekezaji katika kaunti zetu badala ya kuwa na uhasama nao,” alisema. Seneta wa Kaunti ya Vihiga, Godfrey Osotsi, alisema kuchelewesha kwa mgao wa fedha kutoka serikali kuu kwenda serikali za kaunti kumesababisha kusuasua kwa maendeleo katika kaunti. “Tunataka serikali za kaunti zipokee fedha zao kila tarehe 15 ya kila mwezi. kuchelewesha utekelezaji wa miradi ya maendeleo katika kaunti zetu,” Osotsi alilalamika. Osotsi aliomba Hazina ya Kitaifa kuhakikisha fedha zinapelekwa kwa wakati. “Tunahitaji Hazina ya Taifa ihakikishe kwamba kama kutakuwa na ucheleweshaji, usizidi mwezi mmoja ili kaunti ziweze kupanga na kufadhili miradi yao ipasavyo. Kukopa ili kujiendesha kumesababisha kaunti kutumia fedha nyingi kulipa riba za mikopo,” alisema. Aliongeza kuwa madeni yanayosalia yamesababishwa na mipango mibaya ya kifedha, akitaka kuwe na nidhamu ya bajeti ili kuzuia tatizo hilo. “Ikiwa tutakuwa na nidhamu ya bajeti katika kaunti zetu, hatutakuwa na madeni yanayosalia siku zijazo. Tunahitaji kushughulikia suala la udhibiti wa bajeti katika kaunti. Pia tunaomba Ofisi ya Mdhibiti wa Bajeti kuhakikisha mifumo yao inachakata maombi kwa wakati ili kaunti ziweze kutumia fedha hizo,” alisema. Wakati huohuo, Osotsi aliwataka madiwani kuwa makini zaidi katika kusimamia malengo ya ukusanyaji wa mapato ya ndani. Seneta wa Nairobi, Edwin Sifuna, alizitaka serikali kuu kufuata ratiba za mgao wa fedha kama zinavyopitishwa na Seneti.

Akizungumza na wanahabari katika kiwanda cha Rivatex mjini Eldoret, Katibu wa Idara ya Viwanda, Dkt. Juma Mukhwana, alisema uamuzi huo ulifikiwa baada ya mchakato wa zabuni ya kimataifa uliofanywa kwa uwazi na ulioanza Februari mwaka huu. Dkt. Mukhwana alithibitisha kuwa Arise IIP iliibuka mshindi bora zaidi wa zabuni hiyo na itasimamia kiwanda hicho kwa niaba ya serikali, huku akiwahakikishia Wakenya kuwa kampuni hiyo ya nguo inabaki kuwa mali ya serikali. “Huu ni upangaji, si uuzaji. Rivatex inabaki kuwa mali ya serikali,” alisema, akiongeza,

“Kiwanda kitaendeshwa kwa ufanisi na mwekezaji binafsi atakayelipa kodi ya pango na kugawana faida na serikali. Madeni yote, ikiwemo mishahara na marupurupu yaliyokuwa yamesalia kwa wafanyakazi, yamelipwa, na wafanyakazi wote wamelipwa hadi mwezi Oktoba.” Katibu huyo alieleza kuwa Rivatex ilikuwa ikifanya kazi kwa chini ya asilimia 10 ya uwezo wake kabla ya kufungwa, hali iliyosababisha hasara kutokana na changamoto za ufanisi na upatikanaji wa malighafi. Alionyesha matumaini kuwa ushirikiano huo mpya utalifufua kiwanda hicho, kuunda ajira, na kuimarisha sekta ya nguo nchini. “Serikali imewekeza takriban shilingi bilioni saba katika kiwanda hiki. Kupitia ushirikiano huo mpya, tunatarajia Rivatex kufikia uwezo wake kamili na kusaidia maelfu ya Wakenya kupata riziki,” alisema. Kwa upande wake, Mwenyekiti wa Bodi ya Rivatex, Dkt. Cleophas Lagat, alisisitiza kuwa

Alibainisha kuwa biashara ya ndani ya COMESA ilipungua kwa asilimia 3.6 mwaka 2024, kutoka dola bilioni 14.2 hadi dola bilioni 13.7, kutokana na kupungua kwa mauzo ya bidhaa muhimu nje ya nchi.

## EPRA yazindua kanuni za kurahisisha sekta ya nishati

Sekta za nishati na mafuta Snnchini Kenya zinatarajiwa kupitia mageuzi makubwa kufuatia uzinduzi wa kanuni mpya na Mamlaka ya Udhhibiti wa Nishati na Mafuta (EPRA), zinazolenga kuboresha ufan- isi, uwazi na ukuaji endelevu. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa EPRA, Daniel Kiptoo, alisema kuwa mfumo huo mpya ni hatua muhimu katika kis- asaishaji wa usimamizi wa nishati nchini ili kukidhi mahitaji yanayoongezeka na kuvutia uwekezaji. “Kanuni hizi ni hatua za kimkakati zilizoundwa ku- dhibiti mahitaji yanayokua ya nishati nchini Kenya, kuonisha vipaumbele vya sekta na malengo ya kitaifa, na kuhakikisha kila Mkenya anapata nishati ya uhakika, nafuu na endelevu,” alieleza. Aidha, Kiptoo alielekeza kuwa mafanikio ya Kenya katika kupanua upatikanaji wa nishati na kubadili- sha vyanzo vyake yana- paswa sasa kuendana na mipango bora na matumizi yenye ufanisi wa nishati. Mkurugenzi huyo alikuwa akizungumza jijini Nairobi wakati wa kikao cha ma- jadiliano na wanahabari kilichoandaliwa na EPRA ku- jadili kanuni mpya za Nishati na Mafuta zilizochapishwa katika mwaka uliopita. Ali- sisitiza kuwa kutokana na ukuaji wa haraka wa uchumi, uongezekaji wa miji na vi- wanda, kuna haja ya kupanga vizuri na kukumbatia suluhu safi na zenye ufanisi zaidi am- bazo zitahakikisha mfumo wa nishati thabiti na jumuiishi. Miongoni mwa mambo mu- himu yaliyodhihirika katika hafla hiyo ni utambulisho wa Kanuni za Upimaji wa Nishati Mtandaoni za Mwaka 2024 (Energy Net Metering Regulations 2024), ambazo zinawaruhusu watumiaji wanaozalisha umeme wa nishati mbadala—wanaoju- likana kama prosumers—ku- ingiza umeme wa ziada katika gridi ya taifa na kupata fidia. Kiptoo alielezea mpango huo kama hatua ya ma- geuzi makubwa, akisema unafungua milango kwa wawekezaji wadogo kus- hiriki katika uzalishaji wa umeme huku ukiunga mkono mabadiliko ya Kenya kuele- kea uchumi wenye kiwango kidogo cha utoaji wa kaboni. Vilevile, aliongeza kuwa Kanuni za Nishati za Kupa- sha Maji kwa Nishati ya Jua za Mwaka 2025 (Energy Solar Water Heating Regulations 2025), ambazo ni marekebi- sho ya kanuni zilizotangulia, zinazolinga kuboresha usalama katika mifumo ya kupasha maji kwa nishati ya jua.

Mafunzo hayo, yaliyoendesha na Mediation Training Insti- tute of East Africa kwa ush- irikiano na Muslim Women Advancement of Rights and Protection (MWARP), yali- wapa wanachama wa Kamati ya Watumiaji wa Mahakama (CUC) na mashirika ya ki- jamii ya eneo hilo (CSOs) ujuzi wa kitaalamu wa upatanishi. Kulingana na wanachama wa Chama cha Watumiaji wa Ma- hakama cha Lamu, mpango huo ni jibu la moja kwa moja kwa

changamoto kubwa za kima- hakama ambazo wakazi wa Lamu wamekuwa wakikabili- iana nazo katika kupata huduma za mahakama rasmi — tatizo lililochangiwa zaidi na uku- bwa wa kijiografia wa kaunti hiyo na nafasi yake katika mpaka wa Kenya na Somalia. “Lamu ikiwa ni kaunti ya mipakani ambayo pia ime- tengwa, imekuwa ikikabiliwa na changamoto za upatikanaji wa mahakama ambazo ziko mbali na maeneo mengi, na gharama za kusafiri ni kubwa sana,” alisema Rahma Gulem Abbas, Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa MWARP, akiongeza kuwa ni vigumu na kunahitaji ju- hudi kubwa kupanga vikao vya mahakama za kuhamahama hasa katika Lamu Mashariki. Aidha, alieleza athari kubwa za pengo hili la haki, akisema kesi nyingi hasa katika Lamu Mashariki zimeendelea kutosu- luhishwa kwa muda mrefu.

DEPOSITOR PROTECTION TO FOSTER A STABLE BANKING SYSTEM

Kenya Deposit Insurance Corporation (KDIC) is a Resolution Authority established under the Kenya Deposit Insurance Act, Cap 487C, whose mandate as a risk minimizer is to provide a deposit insurance scheme for customers of member institutions, enhance risk management and promptly resolve any troubled bank.

The Corporation manages the Deposit Insurance Fund which is used to reimburse depositors and facilitate timely resolution of troubled banks, in line with its public objective of promoting confidence and contributing to a sound banking system. As a “risk minimiser”, the Corporation has developed a framework for risk assessment, early detection, and timely intervention of troubled banks. This is a proactive mandate to protect depositors from losses attributed to bank failure.

A. Deposit Insurance Scheme

“Deposit insurance” is a system established to protect depositors against the loss of their insured deposits in the event a bank failure. The scheme is established by the government to protect depositors against losing their deposits during a bank failure. The deposit insurance framework adopts a multi-layered approach to protect depositor, ensuring resilience in the financial system and promoting public confidence

1. Guaranteed Deposit Protection:

Under this layer of protection, depositors are guaranteed protection of their deposits up to a maximum of KES 500,000 which is reimbursed from the scheme fund immediately a bank fails and is place under liquidation. .

2. Early Detection and Timely Intervention:

Under this layer of protection, KDIC proactively monitors the performance of banks through an early warning system (EWS) for early detecting the risks and timely intervening through various interventions.

3. Prompt Resolution:

KDIC embraces alternative resolution tools to resolve troubled banks including the realization of assets on a timely basis. This layer of protection enables depositors to maximize recovery of their deposits from failed banks above the guaranteed deposits of KES 500,000. The amounts above the guaranteed are paid to depositors upon recovery of debts and realisation of assets of the failed bank.

To benefit from this KDIC protection, a bank must be a member of the Deposit Insurance Scheme. Currently, the scheme comprises 52 member institutions, including 37 commercial banks, 1 mortgage finance institution, and 14 microfinance banks. The categories of deposits covered under this scheme include:

- All Current Accounts
- All Savings Accounts
- All Fixed Deposit Accounts
- All Foreign Currency Deposits with a known account number fully supported with a signing mandate.
- All Trust Accounts (Declared and designated as a trust account with known beneficiaries).

B. Who bears the cost of this protection?

The cost of protection is borne by member banks in the form of annual premiums paid to the Scheme. Depositors do not bear any cost for this protection.

C. How does KDIC contribute to the country’s financial stability?

The principal public policy objective of Kenya Deposit Insurance Corporation is to protect depositors’ money at the bank thus contributing to financial stability. Kenya’s Vision 2030 agenda highlights the need to establish “a vibrant and globally competitive financial sector which will enhance job creation and promote a saving culture among Kenyans to finance the country’s overall investment needs.” As banks provide intermediation service to the public, KDIC ensures that the interest of depositors is protected to enable them to continue providing resources thereby minimising disruption to the country’s financial system. A comprehensive deposit insurance system reduces the incentive for depositors to withdraw their deposits or “run down a bank” when it shows the first sign of trouble or distress.

D. Public Awareness

To achieve its public policy objective of fostering public confidence and contribute to financial stability, KDIC has continued to partner with banks to sensitize depositors on the importance and benefits of the scheme. The Corporation issues the Deposit Protection Certificates and membership stickers to member banks as part of its wider campaign for member identification. It also engages banks and general public on the multiple media platforms including print, Television, radio and social media to update them on role deposit insurance and its benefits.

E. Your role in depositor protection

The information used in compensation and reimbursement of depositors is obtained from the bank, and where appropriate corroborated with third party information. The depositor is required to maintain an up-to date information such as contact details (registered phone, email address and postal address) and

next of KIN details where applicable. Further, as a depositor you should ensure that accounts opening documents are complete, comprehensive and accurate. Where you operate an account with a trust relationship, you should provide proper documents including the trust deed or agreement for the trust accounts.

As a depositor, you are encouraged to look out for the KDIC Certificate of Deposit Insurance and membership stickers displayed in the banking hall or designated business areas whenever you visit your bank.

Wang’ombe alilaani matumizi endelevu ya mahakama hizo katika baadhi ya maeneo kushughulikia kesi nyeti kama hizo, akisema kuwa utaratibu huo unawanyima manusura haki na kuwawezesha wahalifu kundeleda kutenda makosa hayo.

“Tunasema hakuna nafasi kwa mahakama za kienyeji pale ambapo kuna ukatili,

watoto wetu wamebakwa, au kuna kesi za ubakaji. Haya ni makosa ya jinai, na hakuna nafasi ya mazungumzo nje ya mahakama,” alisema. Katibu huyo alimpongeza mhimili wa Mahakama kwa hatua zilizopigwa katika kushughulikia kesi za SGBV, lakini akasisitiza haja ya kuharakisha usikilizaji wa zile ambazo bado hazijamalizika. “Tunaridhika na maendeleo yaliyopatikana hadi sasa; tunachoomba ni kwamba mfanye juhudi zaidi,” aliongeza. Bi. Wang’ombe alikuwa akizungumza katika Chuo cha Ufundu cha Kitaifa cha Nyeri siku ya Jumatatu wakati wa uzinduzi wa mpango wa uhamasishaji wa vion-

gozi wa mashinani chini ya mpango wa National Youth Opportunities Towards Advancement (NYOTA). Alieleza wasiwasi wake kuhusu ongezeko la visa vya ukatili wa kijinsia na kingono pamoja na kujua katika kaunti hiyo, akibainisha kuwa idadi imefikia kiwango cha juu zaidi katika historia. Kulingana na Katibu huyo, kaunti hiyo imerekodi visa 46 vya SGBV katika kipindi cha miezi mitatu iliyopita, kisa cha hivi karibuni kikiwa ni cha mwanaume, 76 anayedaiwa kumbaka mtoto wa miaka tisa mara kadhaa. Aidha, visa 106 vya kujua vimeripotiwa katika kipindi cha miezi 11 iliyopita.

### Kampuni ya Kenya Seed yaimarisha mapambano dhidi ya mbegu duni

Kampuni ya Kenya Seed imejitolea kuzalisha mbegu za kutosha zenye ubora wa juu na kuthibitishwa ili kuondoa matumizi ya mbegu duni na zisizothibitishwa miongoni mwa wakulima nchini kote. Akizungumza wakati wa Maonesho ya Agitech Grand Expo yaliyofanyika Mitithi, Mwea, Kaunti ya Kirinyaga, Mwenyekiti wa Kenya Seed Company, Bi. Wangui Ngirici, aliwahakikishia wakulima kwamba hatua zote muhimu zimechukuliwa ili kukidhi mahitaji ya mbegu nchini na kudhibiti usambazaji wa mbegu bandia. Bi. Ngirici alibainisha kuwa upungufu wa mbegu zilizothibitishwa sokoni umeleta mwanya unaotumiwa na wafanyabiashara wasio waaminifu kusambaza mbegu bandia kwa wakulima wasiokuwa na hatia, jambo ambalo limeathiri pakubwa uzalishaji na usalama wa chakula. “Ningependa kuwaambia Wakenya kwamba chanzo kikuu cha mbegu duni kuingia sokoni ni fursa inayotumiwa na

watu wasio waaminifu ambao, pale ambapo upatikanaji ni mdogo, wanatengeneza mbegu bandia na kuziua sokoni,” alisema Bi. Wangui. Aidha, aliwahimiza wakulima kukumbatia utofauti wa mazao, akiwashauri kwamba iwapo mbegu zilizothibitishwa za zao fulani hazipatikani, wanaweza kuchagua mazao mbadala yaliyopo sokoni. “Nawaomba wakulima wasikimbilie bidhaa za bei rahisi kwa sababu mara nyingi bei nafuu huishia kuwa ghali zaidi kwa kusebabisha mazao kidogo au kutopata mavuno kabisa,” alisema mwenyekiti huyo. Ili kuendelea kupambana na mbegu bandia, Bi. Ngirici alitangaza kwamba serikali, kupitia Mamlaka ya Ukaguzi wa Afya ya Mimea Kenya (KEPHIS), imeanzisha mfumo wa uthibitishaji ambapo kila pakiti ya mbegu iliyothibitishwa sasa ina nambari maalum ya kufutwa. Wakulima wanaweza kutuma nambari hiyo kwa ujumbe mfuji kupitia 1393 (bila malipo) ili kuthibitisha aina na jamii ya mbegu walizonunua.

### Mpango wa Kijani wa KPA wang’aa kongamano la kimataifa

Mamlaka ya Usimamizi wa Bandari ya Kenya “Urejeshaji wa Mikoko kwa Ulinzi wa Bahari na Mradi wa Kuongezeka kwa Misitu” imeshinda Tuzo ya Uendelevu ya Chama cha Kimataifa cha Bandari na Bandari (IAPH) 2025. Tangazo hilo lilitolewa wakati wa hafla ya utoaji tuzo katika Kongamano la Bandari Ulimwenguni la IAPH huko Kobe, Japani, kufuatia tathmini ya kina ya jopo huru la wataalam wa sekta ya IAPH na kampeni iliyoratibiwa vyema ya kura za umma na KPA ili kupata uungwaji mkono kwa mradi huo. Mpango wa KPA ulibuka kama mshindi katika kitengo cha Utunzaji wa Mazingira, na kuwapita wahitimu wengine wawili kutoka kwa kundi lililovunja rekodi la mawasilisho 500 ya kimataifa. Tuzo hiyo inatambua ushirikiano wa ubunifu wa KPA na jamii za pwani ili kureje-

sha mifumo ya ikolojia ya misitu iliyoharibika. Urejesho wa Mikoko kwa ajili ya Ulinzi wa Bahari iliivavutia majaji baada ya kuonyesha jinsi ushirikiano wa bandari na jumuiya za mitaa na mashirika mengine ya serikali unaweza kusaidia kuwezesha jamii na kusaidia uhifadhi wa mazingira na viumbe hai vya baharini kwa shughuli za bandari endelevu. Chini ya mpango huo, KPA imeshirikiana kwa karibu na jamii katika eneo la pwani kukarabati mikoko iliyoharibiwa. Mikoko ni miti na vichaka vinavyostahimili chumvi ambavyo hukua katika mae- neo ya katikati ya mawimbi kando ya ukanda wa pwani wa tropiki na tropiki. Ni muhimu kwa mifumo ikolojia ya pwani, zikifanya kazi kama kinga dhidi ya dhoruba na mmomonyoko wa ardhi, kusaidia bayoanuwai tajiri kama vitalu vya viumbe vya baharini, na kupambana na mabadiliko ya hali ya hewa kwa kuhifadhi kiasi kikubwa cha kaboni.
